THE CATHOLIC RITE OF ELECTION ~ Sharon Vesels - RCIA Coordinator

This year, we have 6 Candidates in our RCIA Program. Two of the Six were not baptized in the Christian faith so they are called Catechumens. On Sunday, February 19th, we joined several other parishes at Our Lady of the Assumption Catholic Church in Ventura to perform The Catholic Rite of Election with our two catechumens. We were joined by hundreds of Catholics and catechumens from 12 other parishes.

Here is a little more information about the Rite of Election

The Rite of Election is a significant moment in the Church's liturgical calendar. It is a rite that marks the beginning of the final stage of the journey for those seeking to join the Catholic Church through the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). This rite is also known as the Rite of Election of Catechumens and the Call to Continuing Conversion of Candidates. It usually takes place on the first Sunday of Lent and is celebrated in every diocese throughout the world.

The Rite of Election is an essential step in the journey of those who have decided to become Catholic. It is a public declaration of their intent to receive the sacraments of initiation, namely baptism, confirmation, and the Eucharist. It is also an opportunity for the Church to recognize and acknowledge the work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of the catechumens and candidates. The

rite is a solemn and joyous occasion that brings together the candidates, the catechumens, their sponsors, and the Church community. The Rite of Election takes place during a special Mass presided over by the bishop or his representative. In our case, the Episcopal Vicar Fr. Leon Hutton presided. The rite begins with the presentation of the candidates and catechumens, who come forward and declare their desire to become Catholic. The Vicar then addresses the assembly, reminding them of the responsibility of the Church to prepare the candidates and catechumens for the sacraments of initiation. He then declares that the candidates and catechumens are "elected" or chosen by God to receive the sacraments of initiation.

After the declaration of election, the catechumens sign the Book of the Elect, which contains their names and the date of the Rite of Election. This book is a record of their journey to becoming Catholic and will be kept as a permanent record in the diocesan archives. The catechumens' sponsors also sign the book, affirming their commitment to support and guide the catechumens on their journey.

The Rite of Election is an essential moment in the lives of those seeking to become Catholic. It marks the beginning of the final stage of their journey and is a public declaration of their intent to receive the sacraments of initiation. The rite is also an occasion for the Church to recognize and acknowledge the work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of the catechumens and candidates. The Rite of Election is a significant step in the life of the Catholic Church and a testimony to its openness to all who seek to join its ranks.

The Rite of Election closes the Period of the Catechumenate. This rite normally coincides with the first Sunday of Lent. After this Rite is completed, the catechumens are called "the elect" or "the illuminandi" ("those who will be enlightened"). They now begin a Period of Purification and Enlightenment — the final, intense preparation for the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation. On the next five Sundays of Lent, three scrutinies (rites for self-searching and repentance) and the presentations of the Creed and Lord's Prayer take place. This period concludes with the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil.
