STEWARDSHIP MATTERS

"Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last" Matthew 20:16

You've probably heard the saying, 'it's not where you start, but where you finish.' This phrase deeply connects with the Gospel reading excerpt mentioned above.

It suggests that we have a duty to not only look after ourselves but also to care for others around us. We're encouraged to share our talents and resources freely, instead of keeping them solely for ourselves.

By expressing genuine gratitude and willingly giving to others, we can lead lives that are focused on God's teachings, rather than being self-absorbed. Moreover, this scripture urges us to adopt a humble attitude, fostering a sense of kindness and understanding, thereby reflecting God's immense love in how we interact with others.

DID YOU KNOW? WHY IT IS IMPORTANT NOT TO DISMISS A CHILD'S EVERYDAY EMOTIONS?

A key part of creating a safe environment is being a trusted adult to the children in your care. Children who have been abused are more likely to confide in a trusted adult whom they know will listen to and believe them. For this reason, it is important to affirm a child's everyday emotions, including anger or fear. Far too often, adults tell children "you're fine," or "get over it," in response to what a child perceives as a true emotional problem, but an adult may see as an inconvenience or insignificant event. Affirming a child's feelings while still helping them work through their issue productively will help create a bond of trust.

CATHOLIC VS. PROTESTANT BIBLES

Question:

Why are Catholic and Protestant Bibles different?

Answer:

Since the earliest days of the Church, Christians used a Greek translation of the Old Testament known as the Septuagint. This collection of the texts of the Hebrew Scriptures included 46 books.

At the time of the Protestant Reformation in the 1500s, the Protestant reformers began to create their own translations of the Bible (into local languages) and some began to question why the Jewish Scriptures would have included texts that were written in Greek, because, they assumed, the only valid Jewish Scriptures would have been written in Hebrew.

And so, they decided to remove seven books from the Old
Testament: Baruch, Sirach, 1 and 2
Maccabees, Tobit, Judith and
Wisdom (as well as portions of the Books of Daniel and Esther). This means that the Protestant
Old Testament only includes 39
books,while Catholic Bibles continue to include those original 46 books. Both Catholic and Protestant
Bibles include 27 books and letters in the New Testament.
