LITURGICAL CORNER Electing a Pope



For the first thousand years following the Apostolic Age (30–100 AD), secular authorities—usually monarchs or heads of state—were responsible for appointing and approving each pope. This system made the selection of popes a highly political process, often influenced by power struggles and alliances. Almost 40 individuals were appointed through such means. The Church later deemed these selections illegitimate and classified them as "antipopes," excluding them from the official list of popes recognized by the Vatican

In 1150, to reduce the growing influence of secular rulers and powerful Roman noble families on the papacy, the Church established the College of Cardinals. This body was given the authority to oversee the papal election process and protect its integrity. The first official papal conclave occurred in January 1276, following the procedures instituted by Pope Gregory X in 1274. Since then, the process for electing a new pope has remained largely unchanged. Today, the College of Cardinals plays a vital role in ensuring a smooth leadership transition during papal vacancies, advising the pope on important matters, and assisting in the governance and pastoral direction of the universal Church.

Interestingly, not every cardinal elected to the papacy has accepted the position. In 1271, Saint Philip Benizi refused so strongly that he fled and hid until another candidate was chosen. In the 16th century, Saint Charles Borromeo, one of the few canonized cardinals, also declined the honor. More recently, in the October 1978 conclave, Cardinal Giovanni Colombo, Archbishop of Milan, made it clear he would decline if elected. As a result, the conclave chose Cardinal Karol Wojtyla of Krakow, who became Pope John Paul II—the second pope to adopt a double papal name.

Popes aren't required to change their names, but most do to honor past leaders. Bishop Mercurius was the first to adopt a new name in 532; Pope Marcellus II was the last to keep his own.
