LITURGICAL CORNER

What's for Lunch?



An oath of secrecy is taken by cardinals, kitchen staff, healthcare workers, and so on during a papal conclave. The intent is to maintain absolute secrecy. Breach of this oath can result in automatic excommunication. However, the extent to which secrecy has always been upheld is a subject of debate and historical discussion.

Food is a key part of the conclave's secrecy measures. In 1274 Pope Gregory X established some of the earliest rules for papal conclaves, including the practice of carefully controlling and inspecting food during the conclaves and the rationing of a cardinals' food. After three days without a consensus, the cardinals received only one daily meal and after eight days, only bread and water.

In 1348 Pope Clement VI relaxed these rules and permitted the cardinals to receive three course meals consisting of soup, a main dish of fish, meat or eggs, and dessert which could include cheese or fruit.

In 1550, Pope Julius III, banned foods such as whole chicken, ravioli and closed pies. Beverages were served in clear glasses, not in opaque vessels, due to concerns that messages could be concealed within. It was also believed that cardinals could sneak a vote update to the outside world by concealing it in a dirty napkin.

Although the rules for food during a conclave have relaxed over the past 500 years, certain foods such as ravioli (Mama Mia) during the 2013 conclave were prohibited because of the same security concerns as those of the past.

Cardinals eat their meals at Saint Martha's House, approximately 1.4 miles from the Sistine Chapel. It also serves as their living quarters.

Today, the conclave menu is based on a simple meal plan. The meals fully respect the individual needs and medical conditions such as diabetes. The main meal, served at lunchtime, includes minimally processed foods: pasta or rice, white meat, baked fish, seasoned vegetables, salad, and fresh fruit. Water and wine are served, while spirits and overly fatty foods are off the menu.


