


2025 La Salette International Dinner Saturday, September 20, 2025 - 6:00 p.m.

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE CATHOLIC CHURCH Wait— There's More Than One Catholic Church?



If you thought there was only one Catholic Church, then you're wrong. Technically, there are 24 Catholic Churches, all with different rites and coming from distinct cultural backgrounds. The Catholic Church is comprised of six different liturgical rites (Latin, Alexandrian, Antiochene, Armenian, Chaldean, Byzantine) and within those rites are 24 particular Churches. Of the twenty-four churches, the Byzantine Rite comprises fourteen. These 24 Churches are all in communion with each other and are all within the Catholic Church, and all recognize the authority of the pope. We are Catholics of the Roman Rite within the Latin Catholic Church, which is the largest of the 24 Churches and the only Western Church.

The other 23 Churches are all referred to as Eastern Churches and have their own traditions and forms of liturgy. These Churches retain the same basic theology and liturgical structure as we have in the West. All 23 Catholic Churches submit to the doctrines and dogmas defined by the Catholic Church and cannot be rejected by either the Eastern or Western Churches.

History shows that in 1054, the Church was splintered between the Eastern Catholic Churches and the Orthodox Churches. This East-West Schism evolved from centuries of growing differences in theology, culture, and politics. Over time, a few of the Orthodox Churches came back into communion with the Catholic Church. The Eastern Orthodox Churches, for which they are 15, are members of the World Council of Churches, which include Protestant and Anglican Churches. The Russian Orthodox Church is the largest of all Eastern Orthodox Churches.

The Eastern Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches share a similar heritage and liturgical traditions. However, the Eastern Orthodox Church does not recognize the Pope's universal authority thereby making them largely self-governing. They also place great importance on Holy Traditions, which includes Scripture, liturgical practices and the teachings of the Church Fathers.
