THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE CATHOLIC CHURCH What Is Christian Unity?



Christian unity is a positive, practical and progressive approach based upon the teachings of Jesus and the power of prayer. It recognizes that the Trinity is the supreme example of unity. Psalm 133:1 says, "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity."

Nowhere in the Bible does God promise that the pursuit of unity wouldn't be difficult. Christian unity has been difficult to attain since the earliest days of the church, "I appeal to all of you, my friends, to agree in what you say, so that there will be no divisions among you. Be completely united, with only one thought and one purpose" (1 Corinthians 1:10). Today, the pursuit of unity remains a high and hard call.

So why is Christian unity so difficult to achieve? There are endless number of reasons. Misunderstandings, self-centeredness, fear of change, and resistance to new ideas are only a few of the reasons. Amid confrontations and differences, we have an opportunity to exhibit the love of God through humility, understanding, reconciliation and prayer. The pursuit of unity is hard because the love of God is costly. The love of the Father and the Son was most clearly displayed on the cross. Our love for one another is designed to publicly display God's love in the world. The reality is that we fail too frequently to abide in Jesus, strive for holiness, pray without ceasing, love our enemies, and bless those that persecute us.

Unity is a vehicle that can be used for both good and evil purposes. People working together for selfish or sinful purposes is grafted in Satan resulting in negative unity. On the other hand, Christian unity becomes good when together we are of one mind and one accord, rooted in love and humility, united as one in Christ.

We must stand for peace in the presence of conflict; for love in the presence of hatred; for forgiveness in the presence of injury and must always strive to cultivate unity in all aspects of our lives. "Do your best to preserve the unity which the Spirit gives by means of the peace that binds you together" (Ephesians 4:3).

When all is said and done, Christian unity will prevail, so long as we rely on the Word of God and the Holy Spirit.

The journey begins on **Friday, September 19**, as we reflect on being "Called in Love." Just as Mary called two young shepherds on a mountainside, she calls each of us to open our hearts and return to her Son. We gather for Mass at 12:10 p.m., celebrated by **Fr. Bernie Baris, M.S.**

On Saturday, September 20, we are reminded that we are "Gifted by Grace." Mary's tears are not of despair, but of mercy. Her presence brings healing and the promise that God's grace meets us even in our brokenness. At 4:30 p.m., the Most Rev. Bruce A. Lewandowski, C.Ss.R., Bishop of Providence, will lead us in the celebration of the Eucharist.

A Gift That Blesses Today and Tomorrow Transform Your IRA into a Legacy of Faith



In this edition of our bi-monthly bulletin, we invite you to consider another meaningful way to support the mission of the *National Shrine of Our Lady of La Salette* and its many ministries: through **your IRA**. If you are 70½ or older, there is a beautiful and financially wise way to make a lasting impact. It's called a *Qualified Charitable Distribution* (QCD), sometimes referred to as an **IRA charitable rollover**. This option allows you to donate directly from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to the Shrine.

Why Consider Giving from Your IRA?

- You can give up to \$108,000 per year, and pay no income tax on the transfer.
- If you are 73 or older, your gift can count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).
- Your gift may help lower your taxable income, which could reduce Medicare premiums and the taxable portion of your Social Security benefits.
- You do not need to itemize deductions to receive the benefit.
- Most importantly, you can witness your generosity in action now, supporting the mission of the *National Shrine* of Our Lady of La Salette during your lifetime.

Simple Steps to Make Your Gift

- You must be 70½ or older at the time of the gift.
- Contact your IRA plan administrator and request that your gift be sent directly to: *National Shrine of Our Lady of La Salette 947 Park Street*, *Attleboro*, *MA 02703*.
- Be sure that the funds are transferred directly from your IRA administrator to the Shrine. Personal withdrawals do not qualify as QCDs.
- Let us know if you would like your gift to support a specific ministry or project.
- Your gift must be received and cleared by December 31 to count for the current tax year.

My name is Rooha Shanty, and I was recently a part of the Salette Malayali Community's (SMC) Annual Car Wash. The car wash took place in the La Salette parking lot, where the SMC youth, with the help of our parents, participated in advertising,

washing cars, and selling homemade snacks and refreshments.

On your way to La Salette two Sundays ago, you would have seen many of the SMC youth either at the top of the La Salette hill or near the shrine with posters inviting you to the car wash. It wasn't just a car wash, though; we also had stands where there were homemade snacks such as banana bread, cookies, and pretzel sticks. It was a team effort, and everyone played a pivotal role in ensuring the success of the fundraiser. Whether it be a toddler helping scrub a car or an adult helping handle the snack stand, everyone played an important part. Through this car wash, we were able to raise more than \$1,600.
