

Welcome Fr. Alfredo Benjamin, MS!

Fr. Alfredo Benjamin, MS, was born on February 9, 1972, in Cubal, Benguela, Angola. He is the eldest of eight children and began his faith journey in his hometown, where he was baptized and confirmed. In 1992, he entered the seminary and made his first vows as a Missionary of Our Lady of La Salette on September 24, 1998. He was ordained a priest on August 1, 2004, and has since served in Huambo, Angola, and later in Namibia. He also taught philosophy at Catholic and Protestant institutions, engaging both the pastoral and intellectual aspects of his mission. Fr. Alfredo is now assigned to serve at the National Shrine of Our Lady of La Salette in Attleboro, Massachusetts, with a special focus on Portuguese-speaking pilgrims. He looks forward to working with the community, learning about the new culture, and walking with all of us as missionary-disciples of Jesus the Christ.

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE CATHOLIC CHURCH Freedom of Religion



The U.S. Constitution's First Amendment protects our religious freedom, allowing us to practice any faith without government interference, or none at all. This freedom also extends itself to religious organizations, allowing them to express their beliefs through worship, practice, teaching, and observance. The government is equally forbidden by this amendment from forming a state religion. But the government needs to make sure religious customs do not violate other people's rights.

Religious freedom is granted, but not without limits. Certain religious practices might be restricted if they clash with laws about public safety, health, or anti-discrimination, for example.

Regrettably, international law doesn't always safeguard religious freedom. Many countries worldwide face significant religious freedom challenges and persecution. Burma, China, Iran, Russia, Nigeria, and North Korea were among the 12 countries the U.S. State Department cited last year for serious religious freedom violations. Today, Christians are unfortunately the most persecuted religious group. Around 365 million Christians live with high persecution and discrimination, including violence, imprisonment, and displacement. The causes of religious freedom being trampled on is complex. Certain religious ideologies may promote intolerance toward other faiths or beliefs. An additional compelling factor is the perception of a religion as a political or security threat. Of course, social biases and discriminatory attitudes are additional factors to consider. Globally, religious persecution does not just affect one group; Muslims, Jews, Hindus, and many more suffer.

Many consider prayer a key element in halting religious persecution. While powerful, prayer is not a replacement for action when facing persecution. Promoting education and interfaith dialogue, supporting victims of persecution, and strengthening legal protection and enforcement are all ways to bring about tolerance and inclusivity and an end to religious persecution.
