“El que quiera ser grande entre ustedes que sea su servidor, y el que quiera ser el primero, que sea el esclavo de todos”

El evangelio de hoy nos narra lo que sucedió enseguida de que Jesús, aproximándose con sus discípulos a Jerusalén, les anunciara por tercera vez su Pasión. Ahora bien, lo insólito está en observar que enseguida de este patético, pero también esperanzador anuncio - pues lo cierra el Señor asegurándoles que a los tres días resucitará - los hermanos Santiago y Juan, hijos de Zebedeo, los más cercanos a Jesús además de Pedro, parecen no darle importancia a lo anunciado y le piden -¡nada menos!- estar sentados “*uno a tu derecha y otro a tu izquierda, cuando estés en tu gloria*”. Poder y gloria. Posiciones y reconocimiento. ¡Cómo somos los seres humanos! Evadimos la idea misma del sufrimiento y pensamos más bien en los honores, en los puestos, en el poder. De allí la respuesta de Jesús: *el que quiera tener parte en la gloria, deberá pasar por la dura prueba del sufrimiento*.

Y les pregunta si están dispuestos. No habían siquiera comenzado a comprender el misterio de la cruz, pero ambos, Santiago y Juan, responden que sí están dispuestos. No sabían lo que decían, pero su respuesta fue “profética”, pues a medida que fueron comprendiendo el misterio del seguimiento a Cristo, supieron sufrir y morir por El. Pero primero tuvieron que renunciar a ser los primeros, para convertirse en servidores, como su Maestro.

En el seguimiento a Cristo no hay puestos, ni competencias, ni comparaciones, ni preeminencias, ni primacías, ni ambiciones, ni afán de honores, de glorias, de triunfos.

El que quiera ser grande, que se humille.

El que quiera elevarse, que se abaje.

El que quiera sobresalir, que desaparezca.

El que quiera destacarse, que se opaque.

El que quiera ser primero, que sirva.

Jesús nos da el ejemplo. El, siendo Dios, el Ser Supremo, ha venido “a servir y a dar su vida por la salvación de todos”.

Es lo que se re-actualiza en cada Eucaristía.
