Janus-Like Attitude for the New Year

January is derived from the name of a Roman god, *Janus*. According to ancient mythology, Janus guarded gates and represented transitions, dualities and the midpoints between the old and the new, beginning/end, concrete/abstract, life/death etc. In art and sculptor, Janus was depicted as having two faces. Legend had it that one of the faces looked to the past while the other looked to the future. I think you already know where I am going with this.

At the end and beginning of every year, we have an opportunity to act like Janus – to look back so as to look forward. We celebrate our blessings, resolve to learn from our misfortunes and mistakes and then look forward in hope. So, what are the blessings of 2021? Well, if “All things work together for good to them that love God...” (Romans 8:28), then everything, every situation – good or bad – is a clear blessing or a blessing in disguise.

And so, despite the challenges of COVID, we accomplished a lot at our parish. We safely and successfully celebrated major sacraments including the first Holy Communion for our kids and families, the Confirmation for our teenagers, and the RCIA for brothers and sisters seeking full communion with the Church. We had a safe celebration of the Sacred Heart feast and the parish picnic, which helped strengthen our bond as a parish community. We celebrated the lives of many parishioners, ‘marked with the sign of faith’, who transitioned to the next life.

With over 60% of parishioners back, we are *en route* to full capacity if the trend continues. Working together, we completed many projects, increased our offertory giving, and continue the payment of our *Called to Renew* Campaign pledges. At a personal level, it was such a blessing to experience both God’s saving power and the human goodness. I can say unequivocally that, overall, 2021 was a good year!

But it will be dishonest to pretend that it was not a difficult and challenging year. In fact, it was clearly the most difficult and turbulent year of my entire life. From a devastating tragedy that caused so much fear and confusion to the ups and downs caused by the COVID chaos to losing a few of my highly valued staff, the heartache of replacing and rebuilding to ensure a smooth running of the parish. Sometimes, our crosses can be painfully heavy! But regardless of the situation, God always gives us the grace, strength, and the human helpers to help us get up, pick up our crosses and keep moving forward in faith. 2021 taught me many invaluable lessons. Thus, as we begin 2022, I resolve to dedicate my life to God like never before, to pick up my cross daily and keep moving forward in faith with Jesus.

“Actitud de Jano para el nuevo año

Enero deriva del nombre de un dios romano, Jano. Según la mitología antigua, Jano custodiaba las puertas y representaba las transiciones, las dualidades y los puntos intermedios entre lo viejo y lo nuevo, principio/final, concreto/abstracto, vida/muerte, etc. En el arte y la escultura, Jano era representado con dos caras. Según la leyenda, una de las caras miraba al pasado y la otra al futuro. Creo que ya sabes a dónde quiero llegar con esto.

Al final y al principio de cada año, tenemos la oportunidad de actuar como Jano: mirar hacia atrás para mirar hacia adelante. Celebramos nuestras bendiciones, resolvemos aprender de nuestras desgracias y errores y luego miramos hacia adelante con esperanza. Entonces, ¿cuáles son las bendiciones del 2021? Pues bien, si “todas las cosas cooperan para bien de los que aman a Dios...” (Romanos 8:28), entonces todo, toda situación -buena o mala- es una clara bendición o una bendición disfrazada.

Y así, a pesar de los desafíos del COVID, logramos mucho en nuestra parroquia. Celebramos con seguridad y éxito los principales sacramentos, incluyendo la primera comunión de nuestros niños y familias, la confirmación de nuestros adolescentes, y el OICA para los hermanos y hermanas que buscan la plena comunión con la Iglesia. Tuvimos una celebración segura de la fiesta del Sagrado Corazón y el picnic parroquial, que ayudó a fortalecer nuestro vínculo como comunidad parroquial. Celebramos las vidas de muchos feligreses, “marcados con el signo de la fe”, que pasaron a la otra vida.

Con más del 60% de los feligreses de vuelta, estamos en camino a la capacidad completa si la tendencia continúa. Trabajando juntos, completamos muchos proyectos, aumentamos nuestras ofrendas y continuamos el pago de nuestras promesas de la Campaña Llamada a la Renovación. A nivel personal, fue una gran bendición experimentar tanto el poder salvador de Dios como la bondad humana. Puedo decir inequívocamente que, en general, 2021 fue un buen año.

Pero sería deshonesto pretender que no fue un año difícil y desafiante. De hecho, fue claramente el año más difícil y turbulento de toda mi vida. Desde una tragedia devastadora que causó mucho miedo y confusión hasta los altibajos causados por el caos del COVID, pasando por la pérdida de algunos miembros de mi valioso personal, la angustia de sustituir y reconstruir para garantizar un buen funcionamiento de la parroquia. A veces, nuestras cruces pueden ser dolorosamente pesadas. Pero independientemente de la situación, Dios siempre nos da la gracia, la fuerza y los ayudantes humanos para ayudarnos a levantarnos, recoger nuestras cruces y seguir avanzando en la fe. El año 2021 me enseñó muchas lecciones invaluable. Por eso, al comenzar el año 2022, me propongo dedicar mi vida a Dios como nunca antes, tomar mi cruz de cada día y seguir avanzando en la fe con Jesús.

REGALOS

Los regalos están por todas partes en esta época del año. Regalos de Navidad. Regalos de anfitriona. Regalos ocultos. Regalos de tamaño incorrecto. Regalos inesperados. Regalos no deseados. Regalos no correspondidos. Y en las lecturas de hoy oímos hablar de aún más regalos: oro, incienso y mirra. Pero sabemos intuitivamente (o, esperamos, eventualmente) que los regalos son símbolos de algo mucho más profundo y menos tangible. El regalo del Hijo de Dios está, por supuesto, en el centro de nuestras festividades navideñas. No estamos -y nunca- solos, porque "Dios está con nosotros". (De ahí el nombre de Emmanuel.) Pero espera, ¡eso no es todo! La liturgia nos recuerda una y otra vez que se trata de un "intercambio sagrado". Así como Cristo vino a compartir nuestra humanidad, nosotros venimos a compartir su divinidad. El significado pleno de ese misterio es un regalo que aún no hemos desenvuelto del todo.

¿QUÉ CLASE DE DIOS ES ESTE?

La Navidad es una temporada de abundancia. Galletas navideñas y villancicos. Fiestas y regalos. Pesebres y muérdago. Lo mismo ocurre en nuestra iglesia. En un período de nueve días celebramos la Navidad, la Sagrada Familia, María Madre de Dios, y hoy la Solemnidad de la Epifanía. Un verdadero cúmulo de riquezas litúrgicas. (Y aún no hemos terminado!) Sin embargo, para mucha gente, la Navidad ya ha terminado. Los árboles están en la acera o vuelven al desván. Los regalos se guardan o se devuelven. Nos preparamos para volver a la escuela o al trabajo. Pero, como cristianos, apenas nos hemos sumergido en el profundo misterio de un Dios que camina entre nosotros. ¿Qué clase de Dios es este cuyo reino no está limitado por nuestras fronteras, miedos, expectativas o imaginaciones? El salmo de hoy nos recuerda: "Señor, todas las naciones de la tierra te adorarán". La diversidad y la inclusión no son nuevas en la agenda de Dios.

LAS TRADICIONES DESCUBREN EL SIGNIFICADO

Dos rituales tradicionales, uno litúrgico y otro doméstico, ayudan a subrayar el significado de la Epifanía. La Proclamación de la fecha de la Pascua es una opción para incluir en la Misa de hoy. Este texto que anuncia formalmente las fechas de las próximas fiestas mayores nos recuerda que la Navidad se honra mejor en el contexto de toda la historia de la salvación que culmina en la Pascua. O como reflexiona el escritor Nathan Mitchell, la madera del pesebre se convierte en la madera de la cruz.

La segunda tradición relacionada con la Epifanía es la bendición de la puerta de la casa con tiza o gis. Incluye una oración de protección para todos los que entran en ella. Una de las explicaciones de esta tradición la relaciona con la Pascua en el libro del Éxodo: marcar los postes de la puerta con la sangre del cordero mantenía a salvo a los israelitas. Esta tradición también ofrece una conexión entre la Navidad y la Pascua.

Mientras continuamos extrayendo la riqueza de esta temporada, tarareemos junto con los ángeles: *Gloria in excelsis Deo!*

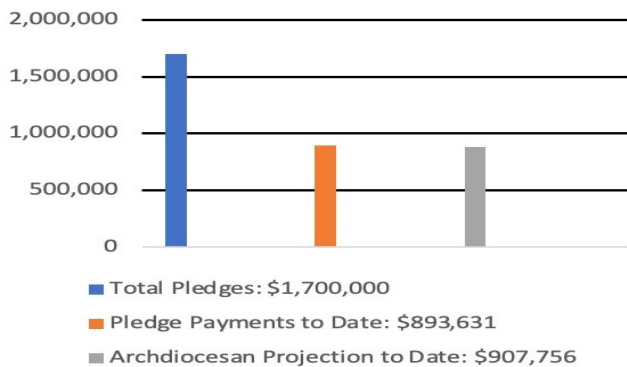

GIFTS

Gifts are everywhere at this time of year. Christmas gifts. Hostess gifts. Hidden gifts. Wrong-size gifts. Unexpected gifts. Unwanted gifts. Unreciprocated gifts. And in today's readings we hear about even more gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. But we know intuitively (or, one hopes, eventually!) that gifts are symbols of something much deeper and less tangible. The gift of God's Son is, of course, at the heart of our Christmas festivities. We are not—and never—alone, because "God is with us." (Thus the name Emmanuel.) But wait, that's not all! The liturgy reminds us over and over that this is a "holy exchange." As Christ came to share in our humanity, we come to share in his divinity. The full significance of that mystery is a gift we have yet to unwrap completely.

WHAT KIND OF GOD IS THIS?

Christmas is a season of abundance. Christmas cookies and carols. Parties and presents. Mangers and mistletoe. The same is true in our church. Within a period of nine days we celebrate Christmas, the Holy Family, Mary Mother of God, and today the Solemnity of the Epiphany. Truly an embarrassment of liturgical riches. (And we are not finished yet!)

However, for many people, Christmas is already over. Trees litter the curbside or make their way back to the attic. Presents are put away or returned. We prepare to go back to school or work. But as Christians we have barely dipped our toes into the profound mystery of a God who walks among us. What kind of a God is this whose kingdom is not limited by our borders, fears, expectations, or imaginations? Today's psalm reminds us, "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you." Diversity and inclusion are not new to God's agenda.

TRADITIONS UNCOVER MEANING

Two traditional rituals, one liturgical and one domestic, help underline the meaning of the Epiphany. The Proclamation of the Date of Easter is an option for inclusion at Mass today. This text which formally announces the dates of the upcoming major feast days reminds us that Christmas is best honored in the context of the whole story of salvation that culminates in Easter. Or as writer Nathan Mitchell reflects, the wood of the crib becomes the wood of the cross.

The second tradition connected to Epiphany is the blessing of the door of one's home with chalk. It includes a prayer for protection for all who enter therein. One explanation of this tradition ties it to the Passover in the Book of Exodus: the marking of the doorposts with the blood of the lamb kept the Israelites safe. This tradition too offers a connection between Christmas and Easter.

As we continue to mine the richness of this season we hum along with the angels, *Gloria in excelsis Deo!*

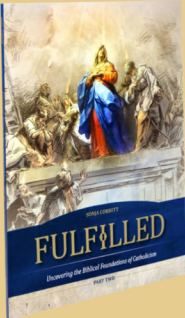

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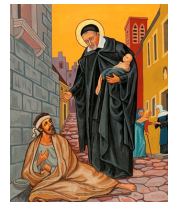
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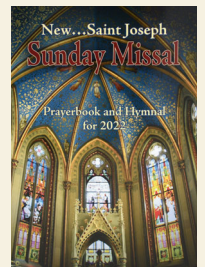
