#### FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MICHAEL 10 YEARS

It is very hard to believe that a little over 10 years ago, I prostrated on the floor of St. John's Cathedral in Paterson in humble allegiance to Jesus as one of His new priests.

I can recall like vesterday, the aura of excitement on May 26, 2007 as I joined three other men as we took the vows of obedience and celibacy. We came to our Bishop in a willing desire to serve Jesus, and His Church.

I remember my first Mass, that special day I celebrated the goodness God has to offer, and was able to bring the Holy Eucharist to His faithful.

The last 10 years, most of which I spent here at Our Lady Queen of Peace, have gone by at the speed of light. I have shared in people's joys of a birth, wedding, anniversary, Baptism, Confirmation, or Communion. I have had the honor to witness the goodness of so many people in their volunteerism at the plethora of events in the parish, the celebration and participation at different activities, and parties. They are all fond memories that will live with me.

I also have shared tears at the loss of someone through death, the hurt that people carry into the Reconciliation Room, and the sadness and confusion that surrounds illness.

During my ten years, I have had the pleasure to serve the parishes in many ways through teaching in our Religious Education, or Confirmation program, or in our Catholic Schools, serving as Chaplain at Sussex Community College, and our diocese on the Presbyteral Council, College of Consultors, and now as an Advocate in the Tribunal. I also have had the pleasure to serve as our Diocesan Pilgrimage Director the last four years, and the Coordinator of the March for Life in Washington for the diocese. I have enjoyed bringing the faith through education, catechetical programs, and preaching, where I try to connect God to His people. Some say, I've been too busy, and, yes, they are right to a certain extent, but it has been worth it. Yes, I am tired, but a good tired in His name, and for His Church. The tasks, people of God, and the opportunity to serve has given me sufficient energy.

On the wall in the sacristy of Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary, a sign reads: Say your Mass as your first Mass, last Mass, and only Mass. For me it's been something I have lived by during my tenure.

I simply say, thank you God, and May God Be Praised now and forever.

#### **Annual Corpus Christi Food Collection for the Poor**


