From the desk of Fr. Hubert

He's On His Way: (Matthew 25:1-13)



Have you noticed that, theat as we get closer to the Christmas season, there are some people who are wearing very smug smiles on their faces? Those are the smiles of the people who had their Christmas lists written out by the 4th of July. They finished their shopping before the Labor Day cook-out. They'll have their presents wrapped by Thanksgiving. As the countdown to Christmas gets underway and Advent begins, these are the people who will be humming along to carols on the radio, making plans to go out to lunch with friends, and savoring the beauty of the Christmas holidays rather than being in a frenzy with their last-minute to-do lists.

The story Jesus tells of the ten virgins reminds us that then, as now, it's wise to be prepared. The ten virgins are awaiting the arrival of the bridegroom so that they can all go to the wedding banquet. Five of the women are wise, and bring extra oil for their lamps, in case they run out of oil while awaiting his arrival. The five other virgins are sure that they have plenty of oil, and the bridegroom will arrive on time, and there's nothing to worry about. But they wait for hours, and when word comes that the bridegroom is finally on his way, the foolish five realize that they've run out of oil. They hurry out to buy more, but while they're gone, the bridegroom arrives, and he and the wise five leave for the wedding banquet. When the five foolish virgins arrive at last after buying their oil, the doors to the feast are shut. It's too late. They can't take part in the feast.

Imagine running out of time before we can join Jesus in the feast. Imagine the doors to the kingdom of heaven shut against us because it's too late. We didn't prepare. We didn't do what we needed to do in order to arrive on time. Preparing for the arrival of the Lord is very different from getting our shopping done early or having everything we need for a wedding celebration. But as Jesus says, keep watch, because no one knows the day or the hour when Jesus will arrive. Every day of our life is a day of preparation, if we use it wisely.

In a nursery in Ontario, Canada, there is a sign in the tree section that reads: "The best time to plant a tree was 25 years ago. The second best time is today." Not all of us began preparing twenty-five years ago for the arrival of our Lord. But we can start today, and if we do, we'll be ready for Jesus when he comes. Even if you're one of those people who is going to be in the stores on Christmas Eve trying to finish your shopping, it's not too late to get ready. Your life is your to-do list. Are you ready?




Share-A Gift
