

From the desk of Fr. Hubert

Witness to the Light (John 1:6-8, 19-28)



John the Baptist and Jesus of Nazareth had no aspirations to be the richest men in Judea. The riches that they sought were for the Kingdom of God, not the kingdom of men. But nowhere do we have any indication that John ever sought to be more than he was, or that he aspired to one-up Jesus. John was a puzzle to the Pharisees and Levites, the ruling religious authorities in Jerusalem. They asked him if he was the Messiah. No. Was he Elijah? No. Was he the Prophet? No. Well after they'd run through their top rankings and he hadn't claimed any of the positions, they wanted to know who he was.

John described himself as the soundtrack for the one who was coming, one that they didn't know. He was the road crew, straightening the crooked road for the one who was destined to travel after him. The authorities were frustrated by the vagueness of his answers, but what they failed to realize was that John had no interest in impressing them. He knew who he was and he knew what he was destined to do. He was preparing the people for the coming of the Lord.

The gospel of John puts it much more eloquently when he describes John the Baptist this way: "There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light."

To be a witness to the light is a momentous role. We can all, like John the Baptist, be witnesses to the light of the Lord this Advent Season. Jeff Bezos may be on his way to becoming the world's first trillionaire. He may lead us to new far horizons with his space travel projects. He may alter the way we do our grocery shopping by his acquisition of Whole Foods. He may transform the world of journalism by his ownership of the *Washington Post*. He may dominate the list of the world's richest people, or he may fall to another position as someone else takes his place.

These lists change as money and power shift in the unpredictable world of business. The light of Jesus does not change, or shift, or alter, no matter what is going on in our everyday world. There is no listing of the lights that shine the brightest in God's kingdom, because the nature of holy illumination is not to seek rankings. There is room for all of us to shine in service to the Lord. We are witnesses to the light of the World. Shine brightly!
