Today in our celebration of the Lord's Day we come to the Third Sunday of Advent. The joy and happiness in the Lord that we celebrate today is symbolized by lighting a rose candle on the Advent wreath today instead of a purple one and also symbolized by wearing rose vestments today instead of purple ones.

Our readings today remind us that we, as Christians, are in a time of expectation, a time of awaiting. We are not waiting to get over or beyond something – to be done with it. Rather, we are reminded of the great coming of the Lord at Christmas when Isaiah tell us, "Here is your God he comes with vindication; with divine recompense he comes to save you."

In our Gospel, Matthew goes further and challenges us to reflect on what are we really expecting at Christmas. The words he has Jesus saying to the disciples of John, should be ones we are pondering. "Then why did you go out? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written: Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you." Who is the Jesus you are expecting and how are you ready to follow the way he is preparing for you? How is the path you are walking with Jesus impacting you and how you relate to others in real concrete ways that they can recognize?

Today it offers us encouragement by naming the Third Sunday of Advent "Gaudete Sunday," that is, in English, "Rejoice Sunday." This comes from today's Entrance Antiphon from Philippians 4:4, "Rejoice in the Lord always." James in his Letter today also seeks to encourage us who are weary while in expectation, when he tells us, "Be patient, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord," and "Make your hearts firm, because the coming of the Lord is at hand."

As the Church is encouraging us with this Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday, we are called to show to others the impact of our experience with the Lord. The ways that our lives reflect the Gospel message speaks volumes to the world about the ways the Lord is here now in our lives. Even on a deeper level we can demonstrate who we are waiting for during Advent by the actions we do in Jesus' name, most particularly in the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. In the most personal way, we can be contagious in our rejoicing this day in our Advent expectation, by encouraging each other with our joy, because "God loves a cheerful giver." Most of all, work on finding encouragement through cheerful people. Let their cheerfulness be contagious to you. In doing so, be contagious by helping God to love that cheerful giver who gives to you.


Topic: A time for seeking Communion with God

WHAT WILL BRING YOU JOY AND HAPPINESS? There are various types of joy and happiness; some are superficial and come and go but there is also deeper and lasting joy and happiness that abides and remains. Advent reminds us that the joyful answer to our problems lies in God. True joy and happiness is to be found only in God. What a difference there is between "Happy Holidays" and "Merry Christmas." Anyone, even a pagan, can celebrate Happy Holidays, but how beautiful it is to have Christ at the center of a Merry Christmas. Christ is the one and only gift at the center of a Merry Christmas who is lacking from Happy Holidays. If we are not finding our joy and happiness in God we are under an illusion and sooner or later God will give us the painful grace of allowing that illusion to give way to reality. God is the answer. **Only in God can we find true joy and happiness.**



Why should I go to confession this Advent? The answer is easy; **“You will know the truth and the truth will set you free”**

As we examine our consciences this Advent and see our shortcomings, we are privileged to receive the mercy of God in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. During this season of Advent, let us ask ourselves is there anything keeping us and God apart? Is any sin of any kind in our lives keeping us separated from God? We may say we have no sins and when we go to Confession, we have to make up sins to tell the priest. Are we really that holy? There were only two people on this earth who had no sin, Jesus, and his mother Mary. If we say we have no sin, are we expected to think that we are Jesus or Mary?



We are living now in this time of mercy when we have an opportunity to repent. Let us receive as much grace as we can from God during this time of Advent. The Lord has no limits to what he wants to give us.

FROM FR. MICHAL

Glory to God #2

We call it the hymn of the angels because of the first sentence taken from the Gospel according to St. Luke (2:14): "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will." The biblical text states: "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." This good will is not the good will of people but of God, who found pleasure in us, and in his goodness decided to save people. The coming of Jesus Christ is proof of this divine love, and it points to God, who "so loved the world that he gave his only Son."



The praise of God follows these first words: "We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks, for your glory is great." We do not find the most appropriate word to praise God - so great is His greatness, His majesty. We utter so many words to express what is inexpressible, what the human tongue cannot say.

Then we move on to the glorification of Christ. "Lord, Only Begotten Son, Jesus Christ, Lord God, Lamb of God." The title "Jesus Christ" expresses the truth about the glorious, glorified Christ, who passed through passion and death, and who enjoys glory at the right hand of the Father. We call Jesus Christ the Lamb. We turn to Him with a pleading litany: "You who take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you who take away the sins of the world, accept our supplications; who sits at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us."

BALTIMORE CATECHISM

Q. 856. Who has the power to grant Indulgences?

A. The Pope alone has the power to grant Indulgences for the whole Church; but the bishops have power to grant partial Indulgences in their own diocese. Cardinals and some others, by the special permission of the Pope, have the right to grant certain Indulgences.

Q. 857. Where shall we find the Indulgences granted by the Church?

A. We shall find the Indulgences granted by the Church in the declarations of the Pope and of the Sacred Congregation of Cardinals. These declarations are usually

put into prayer books and books of devotion or instruction.

Q. 858. What must we do to gain an Indulgence?

A. To gain an Indulgence we must be in the state of grace and perform the works enjoined.


