HOW WE TRY TO MANIPULATE THINGS...

Sunday March 12th 2 a.m. --- We turn our clocks ahead. Was it really the farmers who wanted to do this as we often hear? Or was it to give more light to school children on their way to school? Was it just a government idea to save money? I am sure you have heard a lot of reasons over the years, some true and some just one of those "legends" that seem to always float around.

We try to control the Sun but in reality the Sun is the Sun and never changes we just make believe that it does to affect us in our little world.

How about the Oroville Dam in Oroville, California? People wanted to control the flow of water and a few weeks ago put themselves in danger because of the weakening of the earthen dam and they had to let the water rush out of spillways. Water likes to go where water likes to go.
