## FROM FR. MARCIN...

My dear parishioners,

Today we commemorate the 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time as we gather to celebrate the Lord's Day.

I think it is only when we are in the next life that children will learn how much their parents prayed and sacrificed for them. One mother who prayed a great deal for one of her children is St. Monica, the mother of St. Augustine. One example of the influence Augustine has on the Church is that in the Catechism of the Catholic Church there are more quotations from Augustine than from any other writer. And all of this due to the persistent prayer of his mother St. Monica. In the second reading (Rom 11:29-32) Paul writes about changing from disobedience to obedience and we can certainly see this in the life of St. Augustine.

The Canaanite woman in our Gospel today reminded me of St. Monica. The woman was refused three times by Jesus before he granted her request. The first time Jesus didn't answer her. The second refusal was when Jesus refused his disciples' request on her behalf. The third refusal was when Jesus said the children's food shouldn't be thrown to the dogs. By that Jesus meant it was not correct to give her, who was not a Jew, what was meant for the Jews. "Dogs" was a frequent description of Gentiles (non-Jews) at the time of Jesus. Finally, the fourth time, her plea was answered. Jesus said, "Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted." And from that moment her daughter was well again. Like Monica who had received many refusals during almost twenty years of praying for Augustine's conversion, the Canaanite woman persisted in prayer before God. And her persistent prayer was answered.

As we endure trials let us have faith like the Canaanite woman and St. Monica. Let us not lose hope or give up but let us persist in prayer so that we too may hear the same words of Jesus, "Great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish."

Each year the Diocese of Paterson welcomes a number of men and women missionaries who come to speak about the Gospel seeds which their communities are planting throughout the world. Next Sunday a priest from Diocese of Kitui in Kenya, will be speaking to us at all masses for the Mission Cooperative Appeal.

Please remember Father will be seeking our support. Our second collection next Sunday will be taken for Mission Cooperative Appeal.

I am so grateful to you for the offerings which are given to the Lord each week at Holy Mass. Your regular and generous offerings pay our bills and continue the services which our parish provides. Christ's Church needs your support so that the Kingdom of God may flourish and not be overtaken by the forces of evil. YOU make this a reality!

## BIBLE REFLECTION 20<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

*"Have pity on me, Lord, Son of David!"*

-The Gospel challenges us to look upon one another as God does, not as foreigners but as brothers and sisters. In a world of division Christians are called upon to be agents of welcome. When the followers of Jesus welcome and include all peoples into the community of the Church then the words of today's Responsorial Psalm ring true: O GOD, LET ALL THE NATIONS PRAISE YOU!

-The woman has exceeded the test of faith: "Woman, you have great faith"; in fact, to the humble insistence of her faith corresponds a gesture of salvation.

-This episode addresses an invitation to every reader of the Gospel to have that interior attitude of "openness" toward everyone, believers or not, that is to say, availability and acceptance without distinction toward all men.

### QUEENSHIP OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY



August 22 is the Feast of The Immaculate Heart of Mary, Traditional Calendar and the Queenship of Mary

On the 11th of October 1954, Pope Pius XII established the Feast of the Queenship of Mary to be celebrated throughout the world, and commanded that on that day each year, the world should renew its consecration to her.

The purpose of the Feast is that all may recognize more clearly and venerate more devoutly the merciful and motherly sovereignty of her who bore God in her womb. On the day of her Assumption, Mary our Mother was solemnly crowned by Christ and received by the whole court of Heaven as Queen.

What Christ has done in Heaven and the Church has done on our behalf we should now do individually, that is, we should recognize Mary's Queenship, enthrone her in our homes, consecrate ourselves to her and, by this means, establish in our lives the reign of Mary Immaculate Queen of the Universe.

## RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS (RCIA)...

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults better known as the RCIA Program is the process for those who want to become Catholic.

*This process is for:*

- Adults who have never been baptized.
- Adults baptized in a non-Catholic church and now have a desire to become a Catholic.
- Adults who were baptized Catholic but who have not received the Sacraments of First Eucharist or Confirmation.
- Or Catholics who want to know more about a specific topic discussed in an RCIA program.

The Our Lady of the Mountain/Saint Mark's RCIA program will start Wednesday evening September 20, 2017 from 7 to 9 PM and is conducted in the Basement Classroom of the OLM Parish Center.

Participants who complete the program will come into full communion with the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil celebrated Holy Saturday March 31, 2018.

RCIA candidates will have a sponsor who will support them through this journey. Sponsors are welcomed and encouraged to attend all classes.

This program is a commitment on the part of the candidate but our RCIA Instructors (TEAM) are here to assist you at any time.
