

BY THE WAY . . .

- The Holy Season of Lent begins with **Ash Wednesday** this coming Wednesday, February 22. The schedule for Ash Wednesday services is as follows:

7:00 A.M.	Mass and Distribution of Ashes
9:00 A.M.	Mass and Distribution of Ashes (St. Anthony's School)
12:05 P.M.	Mass and Distribution of Ashes
3:30 P.M.	Prayer Service and Distribution of Ashes
7:30 P.M.	Mass and Distribution of Ashes

Some observations:

Ash Wednesday is celebrated by those who are serious about engaging in the Lenten Season of prayer, fasting, and alms giving.

Ash Wednesday is a Day of Fast and Abstinence (no meat and only one full meal).

Ash Wednesday is not a holyday of obligation.

Ashes are blessed and distributed after the homily at all Masses and Services. (Please do not call the rectory to ascertain exactly what time this is).

Ashes are not distributed after Mass.

- At Saint Anthony's we are able to offer a number of opportunities for our parishioners to embrace the **three Lenten practices** of Prayer, Fasting and Alms Giving during this holy season.

Prayer:

Holy Mass is offered each weekday morning, Monday through Saturday at 7:30 A.M.

The Rosary is prayed publicly after each weekday Mass.

The Stations of the Cross devotion are prayed each Friday night during Lent at 7:30 P.M.

The Novena to the Blessed Virgin Mary is prayed each Saturday morning after Mass.

Our Parish Lenten booklet, *Repent and Believe in the Gospel* contains a meditation written by one of our parishioners for each day of Lent. They provide a good "starter" for daily prayer and are available at the doors of the church this weekend.

Eucharistic Holy Hours will be celebrated on Monday, February 27 and Monday, March 20 at 7:30 P.M. in the church.

The church is open for prayer, meditation, and visits to the Blessed Sacrament each weekday from 6:00 A.M. to around 5:00 P.M. (later if there is some evening activity).

Fasting:

Ash Wednesday and every Friday of Lent are days of abstinence from eating meat.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also Days of Fasting when Catholics take only one full meal during the day.

After all Masses this weekend, "Rice Bowls" will be available at the doors of the church. We are encouraged to use them weekly and participate as a family in a "simple meal," and then place the money saved in the Rice Bowl as an alms for the hungry of the world. Rice Bowl be collected at the end of Lent. This is a good way to teach the practice of charity to our children.

The Parish Food Pantry has been a source of pride for our parish and sustenance for the hungry poor for many years. Donations may be dropped off in church after any weekend Mass.

Alms Giving:

During the Lenten Season there will be three “special collections” each of which give us the opportunity to assist with our charity:

Ash Wednesday - February 22 – the collection that day will be sent to Catholic Relief Services to aid the humanitarian efforts after the earthquake in Turkey and Syria. Many people in our area have families in these two areas, especially Aleppo in Syria, and we want to help them.

Holy Thursday – April 6 – this “collection for the poor” is the only one mentioned in the Roman Missal – and will be divided between local and national outreach.

Good Friday – April 7 – “Collection for the Holy Land” – this universal collection in every Catholic church in the world is used to support the shrines and charitable works in the Holy Land.

Other Opportunities:

The Sacrament of Penance will be available again this year each Monday night of Lent from 7:00 to 8:30 P.M. in every Catholic church of the Paterson Diocese.

Father Frank will offer a series on Pope Benedict XVI’s Encyclical, “God is Love,” on the Tuesday nights of Lent at 7:30 P.M. in the church.

Father Ray will offer a series on each of the Seven Sacraments, including their theology, history and present issues, on the Wednesday nights of Lent at 7:30 P.M. in the church.

Sister Betty Ann will offer a Bible Study Group on the Friday mornings of Lent in the Media Room of the school.

The Saint Joseph’s Mens’ Group meets for prayer and reflection on the first Saturday mornings of each month from 8:30 to 9:30 A.M., including March 4 and April 1.

- The collection taken up at all Masses and Services on Ash Wednesday will be sent to **Catholic Relief Services** for the relief of the suffering populations of Turkey and Syria as a result of the recent devastating earthquake there. For those who would like to donate directly to that cause, please go to the Paterson Diocesan Website www.patersondiocese.org and click on the tab marked “Donate Here.”
- The Paterson Diocese is sponsoring a **Men’s Lenten Evening of Prayer** on March 24 at 6:00 P.M. More information may be obtained from the website for Saint Paul’s Inside the Walls at www.insidethewalls.com.
- This afternoon Father Frank and I will host a small reception in the rectory for the members of the **Al LaBarre Memorial 500 Club**, to thank them and at the same time to give them some insight into the various projects, repairs, and upgrades taking place in the church and school. The members of the 500 Club each donate \$500 each year which is kept in a separate account and used for the maintenance of the buildings. Anyone wishing to become a member of the Club, please contact Cathy Clyne at the rectory.
- This coming Saturday, February 25 marks the **80th birthday** of Monsignor Martin McDonnell, our former pastor. His address is 9 Lakeland Dr., Hopatcong, NJ 07843.

- After the 12:00 Noon Mass this Sunday, anyone who would like to “adopt” one of the remaining poinsettias and take it home is welcome to do so.
- One of the “ever-ancient-ever-new” practices of Lent is **Prayer**. Priests, Deacons vowed religious and seminarians all commit themselves to the “Liturgy of the Hours,” the formal sanctifying of the day by pausing for stated prayers at morning, midday, evening and night. One of the wonders of the modern age is that the entire four-volume breviary is now available on an i-phone app called “Divine Office.” Depending on where I am, I often switch between my prayer book and my i-phone.

Two of my favorite “Liturgy of the Hours” moments over the years were once when my mother was undergoing open-heart surgery at Morristown Memorial Hospital. They were not clear about when they were taking my mother in for surgery, so I got there very early. My mother was still asleep, and hospitals are very quiet in the first hours of the day. So I quietly sat in her room and began Morning Prayer. I noticed that across the hall, a Sister of Christian Charity who was also awaiting surgery was praying Morning Prayer in her chair. We smiled at each other across the hall, knowing that we were joining people around the world in our joint prayer of praise.

The other time was on an airplane. I have a somewhat superstitious custom of taking out my breviary and praying whatever is the appropriate “prayer hour” as the plane takes off. I figure if the plane goes down, at least I will look good with my breviary in hand. On one flight to San Francisco, that most blessed of all occurrences, an empty seat, was next to me. As the pilot directed the crew to secure everything for takeoff, suddenly a stunning young flight attendant, plopped down in the seat next to me, whipped out her *Liturgy of the Hours*, and said, “Father, what hour are we praying?” And we began the psalms of Evening Prayer as the plane lifted off.

We do not all have to pray the “Liturgy of the Hours,” but Lent is a good time to get ourselves into a prayer rhythm of at least Morning Prayer and Night Prayer, is that is not already our practice. It makes a difference in our Christian lives to sanctify the day at its beginning, and give thanks for it at its end.

SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



First Reading: Sirach 15:15-20

This passage from Sirach gives strong, unequivocal emphasis to free will in every person. Before each of us is set, sin or virtue, life or death, and each of us are free to choose the one or the other.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

Paul explains to the Corinthians that there are two different kinds of wisdom — the wisdom of God and the wisdom of the world. The wisdom of God is mysterious, but this wisdom has been revealed "to those who love him" through the Spirit.

Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells the people he has come to fulfill the law. He speaks strongly against murder and anger, against adultery and lust, and against false oaths and lies.
