BY THE WAY...

- Today we celebrate the great **Feast of Pentecost**, the coming down of the Holy Spirit on the first disciples in Jerusalem, the birthday of the Church, and the end of the Easter liturgical season. This feast provides the meditation for the Third Glorious Mystery of the Rosary as depicted in the last window on the rectory side of our church.
- Tuesday, June 13, is the **Solemnity of Saint Anthony of Padua**, the patronal feast of our parish. Our parish was founded by Monsignor Anthony Stein (1868-1921) the pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes on River Street in Paterson. Presumably his devotion to his patron saint accounts for the origin of our parish name.

Tuesday night at 7:30 P.M. we will have the ninth and last Novena Service in our annual Novena of nine Tuesdays in honor of our patron. Come out and pray to Saint Anthony for good weather.

Because, the very next night, we begin the 41st Annual Saint Anthony's Feast, running this year from Wednesday to Saturday nights, with rides, food, games, food, fellowship, food, community, food and zeppole! Come out, meet your friends, have a little to eat, and help support your parish. Last year's Feast brought about \$130,000 into our parish budget. Let's see if we can do as well this year!

I know that everyone likes to wait until the last minute to turn in their **Volunteer Forms** for the Feast to see if they get a better offer. But, we are now at that last minute, so, please, turn in your form and volunteer to help your fellow parishioners make the Feast a success.

- This weekend we welcome to Saint Anthony's **Deacon Joseph DeMarzo**. A 29-year-old native of Chatham, Deacon DeMarzo was ordained to the transitional deaconate last Saturday morning at the Cathedral by Bishop Sweeney. We are happy to have him with us for his summer deacon internship over the next six weeks. I was standing next to him last Saturday morning at the moment when the new deacons are vested for the first time after the laying-on-of-hands by the Bishop. As Father Chris Han began to place the stole around his neck, Deacon Joe just uttered "Oh, wow!" Let us pray that he keeps that sense of wonderment throughout this final year of preparation for the priesthood next Spring.
- The Paterson Diocese is sponsoring a one-day **Quo Vadis Retreat** on Thursday, June 29, beginning at 9:00 A.M. at Camp Shiloh, 753 Burnt Meadow Road, Hewitt, N.J. "Quo Vadis," means "where are you going," and is a retreat for young men of high school age encouraging them to consider their vocation and path in life. The experience offered free by the Diocesan Vocation Office will include three meals, zip-lining, swimming, rock climbing, archery, games, sports and Holy Mass with Bishop Sweeney. For more information go to vocations@patersondiocese.org.
- Each year on the Feast of Corpus Christi, our Paterson Diocese sponsors a **Corpus Christi food collection** to help shore up the food banks throughout the three counties of our diocese. Summer is always the hardest time for these food banks because many urban schools have breakfast and hot lunch programs that cease with school vacations, thereby laying a bigger

burden on poor families. It is a time when many of the food banks find themselves with near empty shelves. If you are able to bring a donation of coffee or hot cereal, or any dry food items to church on the weekend on June 10-11, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, we will arrange for its distribution to Catholic Charities which will, in turn, distribute it to the needy food banks.

- After several years of cancellation due to the Covid Pandemic, our Paterson Diocese is planning a **Diocesan Pilgrimage** to the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington for this coming October 14. Our last diocesan pilgrimage was in 2017. The theme will focus on "Holiness found in Church," both in the beauty of the Shrine building, and also in the holiness of the people of God from our diocese gathered together there. The pilgrimage will be a one-day bus trip at a cost of \$65. For those who might be interested, there is also an overnight option, including a visit to the Franciscan Monastery Holy Land Shrine for \$280 (double occupancy). For more information, contact Father Michael Rodak 973-827-8030. The presence of so many people in one place in an act of worship to Almighty God and devotion to our Blessed Mother, is a source of blessings for the Church of Paterson. Make a true pilgrimage of faith to honor our Blessed Mother, as patroness of the Church in the United States. Be inspired in the largest Catholic church in the Americas.
- Saintly Ferry Recently the New York City Department of Transportation, which operates the Staten Island Ferry, dedicated a new ferry boat. It is the Department's custom to name the ferries after famous residents of Staten Island, so this new ferry was named for Dorothy Day (1897-1980) the Catholic peace activist and founder of *The Catholic Worker* whose cause for canonization has been introduced.
- Tomorrow, May 29, is **Memorial Day**, a time when our nation pauses to remember all those men and women over the course the last quarter-millennium who have sacrificed their lives for our freedom and liberty.

O God,

By whose mercy the faithful departed find rest, look kindly on your departed veterans who gave their lives in service of their country.

Grant that through the passion, death, and resurrection of your Son they may share in the joy of your heavenly kingdom and rejoice in you with your saints forever.

Passaic County Dept. of Senior Services provides one hot meal Monday through Friday at the Hawthorne Senior Center (Ambulance Corps Building), 970 Goffle Rd. There is a minimal fee, and it's a friendly environment conducive to socialization. The Center also conducts various activities such as parties, trips, lectures, etc. that meet the needs of participants. The Center is open from 8:30 A.M. to 1:30 P.M. For further information, call 973 423 1027 or the County Nutrition Office at 973 569 4060.

And if you need transportation: The Passaic County Paratransit Program maintains a fleet of vehicles, which provide transportation for the county's senior citizens and disabled residents in need of non-emergency rides to medical appointments, shopping centers, county-run nutrition and adult day care sites, and for the disabled residents to attend group work programs. Special lift vans are available to accommodate non-ambulatory individuals. There is no fee for this service, however a donation of \$2.00 per trip is suggested. 

Changes Discounted Ride Tickets for The Feast:

Pre-sale ride tickets are once again available at a cost of \$30 for 30 tickets (a 50% discount if purchased in advance). This price is the same as last year and is the same as our prior pre-covid Feast in 2019!!!!

Our carnival company has however changed the manner in which you can purchase these tickets. All purchases must be made on-line by scanning the QR code found on our Feast Flyer (in this bulletin) or by clicking the link below:

Just follow the prompts on the Magic Money checkout site to make your purchase. Once in the checkout you will have a choice to **email** a PDF electronic ticket to print or receive a **text** message with a QR code you can store on your mobile device. A \$2 service fee will be added for each \$30 purchase.

Please note: If you intend to make a large purchase for multiple children, it is best to separate each purchase so that you can receive different QR codes for each child's redemption at the rides.

Common Questions:

Can we use our left over paper tickets from last year? Yes, you can use them this year only.

How will you know the balance on your QR code if you use the electronic printed QR format? They can be checked at the kiosks.

Are the QR codes specific to St. Anthony's Feast only? No, the tickets are good at any of Blue Sky Amusement events.


PENTECOST SUNDAY

"When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house where they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim."

Before He ascended, Jesus instructed the apostles to wait for the Spirit to come. The Pentecost event is that moment. Perhaps the disciples waited and wondered about what He really meant. Now we know.

Three signs accompanied this moment – wind, fire, noise. More importantly, the effect His Spirit produced, as they were transformed. They began speaking and carrying out the mandate to go, preach, teach and baptize, yes, to evangelize.

In our parish community today, it is the same Spirit who unites us in prayer, teaches and transforms us, and in a few minutes will send us to do the same thing. Where would we be if that transformation had not taken place? Who do we know waiting to be brought back to the faith, to strengthen their relationship with Jesus Christ? How will they know about Pentecost today if we do not do our part?






Gospel Today | Pentecost Sunday | John 20:19-23


