BY THE WAY...

- I am writing this on Monday, even before **The Feast** begins, but I still want to take the opportunity to thank all those who have volunteered in any one of a thousand ways. It is that volunteerism that lies at the heart of The Feast and makes it a worthwhile venture year after year.
- Many parishes in northern New Jersey have "events" over the summer months. They are variously described as festivals, carnivals, fairs, picnics, etc. But only Saint Anthony's uses the term **Feast** for our event. Why is that? There are three basic reasons why ours is a Feast.

First, when Father Joe Ciampaglio and the Feast originators first conceived the concept in the early 1980s, the town fathers at the time were not so enthusiastic about a big event over several days right in the middle of town. They did not know what problems it would bring but it sounded like there would surely be some. So, the planners billed the event as a "feast" hoping that the religiosity inferred would mollify the town officials somewhat.

Second, in line with the above, The Feast is always held in the week in which the Feast day of Saint Anthony of Padua (June 13) occurs, and his statue always figures prominently on the feast grounds, thereby becoming a celebration in honor of our patron saint.

Third, The Feast really has a purely religious component because it brings together so many different people with so many different gifts and talents all using them in concert for a specific goal, and as such, they perfectly mirror the Holy People of God, and the Eternal Banquet of Heaven.

And that is why it is a Feast!

• The Greatest Generation and the Marrying Priest

Recently I was looking up a record in our Marriage Register for the 1940s, and I noticed that the entire page of the register was all in the same handwriting. And therein lies a tale.

In June, 1941 Father Ladislaus J. (Wally) Flek was assigned as parochial vicar to Saint Anthony's Parish in Hawthorne. Like so many that would come after him in Hawthorne, the Passaic native was newly-ordained and Saint Anthony's was his first assignment as a priest. Saint Anthony's pastor, Father William E. Thompson was sixty-three when Father Flek arrived, and was beginning to feel the effects of Parkinson's Disease, which would eventually take his life a decade later. As a result, Father Flek took on an ever-growing share of the parish work and responsibility. Nowhere was this more evident, than in the Sacrament of Marriage.

Father Flek's thirteen years as parochial vicar at Saint Anthony's are still a record. And they coincided with the end of World War II and the subsequent "baby boom era." As the war wound down tens of thousands of G.I.s and sailors began to return home. Many of them had been drafted as teenagers, and coming back from war, they were still very young, filled with experience, and ready to get on with their interrupted lives. This included getting married. Once Father Flek arrived at Saint Anthony's, Father Thompson never officiated at a wedding again! With very few exceptions Wally Flek did all of them! His flowing script fills page after page in the Saint Anthony's Marriage Register. In his thirteen years at Saint Anthony's he officiated at 414 weddings. The biggest year of his wedding run was 1947 when he officiated at 53 weddings in one year. His record was the weekend of September 6-7 that year when he celebrated six weddings over two days – three on Saturday and three more on Sunday..


With Father Thompson's death in September 1951, Father Flek was administrator of the parish until Monsignor Joseph O'Sullivan arrived. In June 1954, it was Father Flek's turn to become a pastor of the small rural parish of Saint Simon the Apostle in Green Pond. It must have been a shock after the hectic activity of Hawthorne. After seven years in Green Pond, he moved on to Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Boonton where he served eight years, and then to his home parish of Saint Joseph, Passaic where he was pastor for 22 years until his retirement in 1991. He died at the age of 92 on May 10, 2008 at the Little Sisters of the Poor Home in Totowa.

Even in his 90s, Monsignor Flek was still active, helping the chaplain at the Little Sisters of the Poor. It was the kind of activity he first learned and embraced during those hectic post-war years in Hawthorne.

A Big shout out to everyone who Helped Make Our St. Anthony Feast A Success!!

A SUMMARY OF THE CHURCH RENOVATIONS

During the Summer of 2019 a complete survey was done by a professional architect on an aerial boom. The following photos depict the conditions of the church that would need to be addressed.







Deteriorating stonework



Broken & missing roof tiles

Due to Covid in 2020, the project was put on a temporary hold, but by late 2020 bids were accepted, and a contractor was hired, Arthur Vincent Company, a company that specializes in church restorations. In the Spring/Summer of 2021 we scaffolded the building and removed various areas of tile roofing to assess underlying damage. We started with the most critical areas of the project, namely the East and West Transepts and the Northwest Tower. Supply chain issues slowed the project, and to further complicate it, structural issues needed to be addressed on the east, west and south gables. A structural engineer was hired to design a steel support system to stabilize each gable, see photos below.

In 2022-2023 we did the following:

Re-pointed cracked mortar joints on the entire walls of the east and west transepts and northwest tower.



Repaired exterior window frame rot and any broken protective covers on all upper window locations accessible by the scaffolding, including the Rose windows on the east & west transepts, all lower sacristy & nave windows, and all sanctuary windows.





Repaired deteriorated stonework, capped east, west, and south gables with lead coated copper, capped northwest tower with lead coated copper.





Replaced small shrine roofs east and west sanctuary.

Installed ice and water shield, followed by new wood to replace usable existing tiles and new tiles.





We will soon be focusing our attention on the entry of our church, where we will clean the stonework and address various problematic areas that caused the staining.

Next week we will summarize the work done on the HVAC and boiler systems of our buildings.




ELEVENTH SUNDAY INORDINARY TIME




