#### BY THE WAY ...

• In a classic scene in the 1965 movie, *The Agony and the Ecstasy*, Pope Julius II (Rex Harrison) storms into the Sistine Chapel, completely covered in **scaffolding**, and screams up at Michelangelo (Charlton Heston) painting away at the top of the scaffolding, "When will you make an end of this?" Michelangelo's reply was simple: "When I am finished!"

I felt I was in a replay of that scene this week at a local barber shop when one of the customers asked me, "Monsignor, the scaffolding – is it ever coming down?" I was tempted to tell him to watch the movie.

The true answer is "not yet." The scaffolding has been up to cover a number of major projects that we have been addressing, including installation of new air conditioning, pointing of the stonework, capping the masonry, shoring up the gables, repairing the window frames, and repairing (and in some places replacing) the roof. The original plan was to do these projects piecemeal over the next decade, but bequests from several generous parishioners prompted us to do them all at once now and get them over with.

At this point most of the projects are completed, but the roof repair is still in progress. When you drive by the church it may often appear that no one is up on the scaffolding and nothing is being done. In order to actually see the progress (and the men on the scaffolding) you have to drive around the back of the rectory where the action is taking place. And much of the repair is not visible from the street, so bring your drone with you.

When you sit in our church, you see the two beautiful shrines to the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph on either side of the main sanctuary. Both of these shrines produce an "apsidal bulge" in the building which is not visible from the street and which has been a source of weather-related damage. These bulges are similar to the more visible one produced by the shrine to Saint Anthony on the rectory side of the church. Last week I watched the workers bring up onto the sacristy roof sheets of copper which are being installed to give a new roof to these two apsidal bulges, much like the copper roofing we installed a few years ago on the outside of the bulge by Saint Anthony's Shrine. Again, you can only see this work if you have an aerial view of the building, or if you climb on the roof. But, take heart; progress is being made!

- Saint Paul's Outreach is a Catholic evangelization outreach which puts teams of committed young Catholics on college campuses to help students better connect to their faith during their college years. Recently SPO has opened a new branch at Washington State University, a 31,000 student public university in Pullman, Washington. One of our parishioners, Brian Reilly, a recent graduate of Seton Hall University, has volunteered and been trained to be a part of the SPO team at Washington State for the next two years. As a parish we are quite proud of Brian's willingness to give this kind of witness. Next week Brian will speak briefly at all the Masses and offer us an opportunity to help sponsor his work.
- Speaking of parish witness, did you ever wonder where the money donated in the **Poor Box** goes? Most of it goes to one of the "unsung heroes" of the parish, the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. The Society allows the parish to make charitable donations to various individuals and causes which find themselves in need. Among other things they help shore up the Parish Food Pantry when it falls low in supplies.

Recently one of the Salesian Sisters at our school, Sister Marisol Guzman, F.M.A. has been transferred by the community from Hawthorne to Monterrey, Mexico, a city perhaps 100 miles south of the Mexico-United States border, where the sisters have an outreach among those seeking to immigrate to the United States, assisting them with documentation issues, and helping them to survive the process. Through the goodness of our Saint Vincent de Paul Society I was able to give Sister Marisol \$500 to take with her to Mexico and use wherever she saw the greatest need.

- Next weekend we are happy to welcome to Saint Anthony's **Father Cesar Jaramillo** who will be helping out with two Masses on Sunday. Ordained in 2017, Father Cesar has recently completed a stint as Parochial Vicar at the Cathedral of Saint John the Baptist in Paterson and will be leaving at the end of the Summer for Rome where he will complete studies for the doctorate in Canon Law at the Gregorian University.
- Today (July 16) happens to be one of the most popular Marian feasts in the Church year, **Our Lady of Mount Carmel.** Carmel (garden of God) is a mountain in the northwest part of the Holy Land near the city of Haifa. It is mentioned many times in the Old Testament, particularly as the site of the activity of the Prophet Elijah. Since earliest Christian times hermits have gravitated to this spot in imitation of Elijah and the early prophets. Gradually they coalesced into the beginnings of the modern Carmelite Order. The popularity of the Brown Scapular, promoted by the Carmelites, has also contributed to the popularity of this feast. Since the feast falls in July, it has been an opportunity for processions, fireworks, and festivals among the seventeen parishes and many societies dedicated to Mary under this title in the Garden State. In our diocese alone we have four parishes (Boonton, Cedar Knolls, Passaic and Swartswood) dedicated under this title, as well as two cloistered convents of Carmelite nuns in Chester and Morristown.

May the venerable intercession of the glorious Virgin Mary Come to our aid, we pray, O Lord, So that, fortified by her protection, We may reach the mountain which is Christ. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### FOOD PANTRY NEEDS

"Summertime, and the 'livin is easy." That's what the song lyrics say. But for those struggling to put food on their table, the reality is otherwise, especially with children being unable to have the benefit of school lunches during the summer. Grocery prices continue to accelerate, and people continue to pay top dollar to feed their families. We're again asking for your help in keeping our pantry stocked. We can use white rice (small boxes/packages), pancake mix & lite syrup, canned tuna in water, canned chicken, canned stew, small canned hams (available at Walgreens), baked beans/pork and beans, pasta & pasta sauce, mayonnaise, Chef Boyardee products, Hamburger Helper, Suddenly Salad, peanut butter & jelly, low-sodium soups, chicken broth, coffee (including decaf), canned fruit in 100% fruit juice, canned olives, applesauce, instant mashed potatoes & low-sodium gravy packets, Parmalat or similar shelf stable milk, fruit juice, cookies & crackers, granola bars, Jell -O & pudding mixes, cake, cookies & brownie mixes and icing, laundry detergent, toilet tissue, facial tissue, paper towels, and paper plates. Donations may be left in the baskets on the right in the front (main) vestibule.

ShopRite gift cards are also welcome, and if you'd like to write a check, please make it payable to St. Anthony's, with "food pantry" on the memo line. Checks in a sealed envelope marked "Social Services" can be put in the collection basket or mailed to or dropped off at the rectory. While we're grateful for all food donations, we can't distribute expired items, so please make sure to check the expiration dates on all items you're considering donating. ## BACK TO ....SCHOOL "OPERATION BACKPACK"
