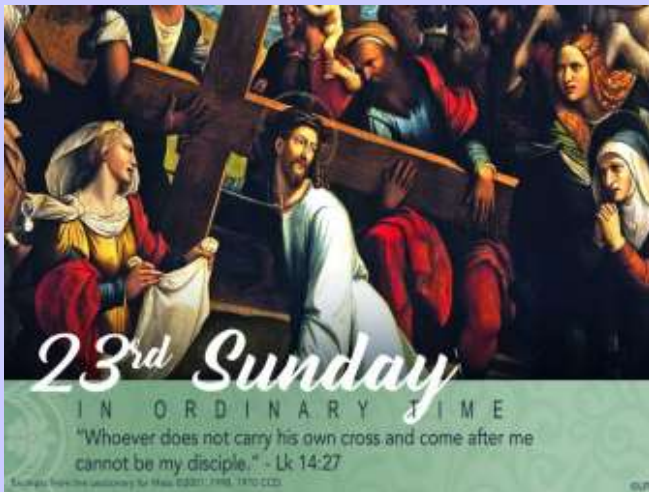



BY THE WAY . . .

- On Sunday, September 24 we will welcome **Bishop Kevin J. Sweeney** on his first “official visit” to Saint Anthony’s. Although Bishop Sweeney has actually been here multiple times for Confirmation and for Religious Professions ceremonies for the Salesian Sisters, this marks the first time the Bishop has presided over Sunday Mass here at Saint Anthony’s. At the conclusion of the Mass, the Bishop will proceed to the Jubilee Garden and bless the renovations there and the **new statue of Saint Anthony of Padua**.

I invite as many of our parishioners as possible to join with the Bishop for the 10:00 A.M. Mass and the brief blessing afterwards. I especially invite all those whose family members are memorialized in the pavers that constitute the Jubilee Garden.

- As we begin a new school year, many aspects of our life here at Saint Anthony’s are in need of additional volunteers. In addition to new **catechists and helpers** on the Religious Education Program, we are also in need of new **lectors, Communion ministers, altar servers, and choir members**. Please look at next week’s bulletin for information on future training for these ministries. For potential catechists, please contact Sister Betty Ann, F.M.A. For potential choir members, please contact our Music Director, Michael Riedel.
- Welcome back! As I am writing this article, the students, teachers, staff and parents of **Saint Anthony’s School** are returning to class for the 112th year of Saint Anthony’s School. Saint Anthony’s is the oldest Catholic school in Passaic County. During this coming year we will commemorate the centennial of the “old” part of the school complex, which was the “new” school of 1923. (The original school was in the basement of the old church.) We wish them many blessings as they come back to class and all the other exciting opportunities the school offers. Please check out the flyer for the school’s next Open House in this bulletin.
- On Saturday, October 14, the Paterson Diocese will sponsor a **one-day pilgrimage** to the National Shrine. This pilgrimage will give the opportunity for us to gather in prayer, and in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, gathered around Bishop Sweeney in the Great Upper Church of the Basilica, the largest Catholic church in the nation. The Sacrament of Penance as well as the Rosary will be available that day. And, of course, on that day we can all wave at Saint Anthony as he looks down on us.
Those interested in an overnight option should contact Father Michael Rodak at 973-827-8030. Those interested in the one-day pilgrimage should sign up at the rectory.
- Last week Saint Anthony’s played host to the funeral of the late **Mayor Lawrence “Pat” Kramer of Paterson** who died at the age of 90. Although there are fourteen Catholic churches in the City of Paterson, Mayor Kramer specifically asked to have his funeral at Saint Anthony’s because he was the first baby baptized in the new church on March 19, 1933. Apparently, his father had been involved in the construction of our church, and as the end of the building process, as well as his birth, were approaching Father William Thompson, the pastor of Saint Anthony’s offered his parents the privilege of being the first baptism in the new church. The detail is commemorated in a small window immediately on entering the sacristy. The window is

the gift of the mayor's parents and bears the date, "March 19, 1933." According to his son, the late mayor desired to be buried from the church "where it all began."

- Next Sunday will be **Catechetical Sunday** when we ask God's blessing on our religious education programs.

SOCIAL SERVICES



Those in need of food continue to come to our parish pantry for assistance, and our Ministry is doing its best to meet ever increasing demand. We again appeal to you for your help. Your support is critical to the work of our Ministry and is greatly appreciated. We can use pancake mix & lite syrup, canned tuna in water, canned chicken, canned stew, small canned hams (available at Walgreens), baked beans/pork and beans, pasta & pasta sauce, mayonnaise, Chef Boyardee products (both canned items and microwaveable cups), Hamburger Helper, Suddenly Salad, peanut butter & jelly, low-sodium soups, chicken and beef broth, coffee (including decaf), canned fruit in 100% fruit juice, canned olives, applesauce, instant mashed potatoes & low-sodium gravy packets, Parmalat or similar shelf stable milk, hot chocolate mixes, fruit juice, cookies & crackers, granola bars, Jell-O & pudding mixes, cake, cookie & brownie mixes and icing, laundry and dish detergent, toilet tissue, facial tissue, paper towels, paper plates, and personal hygiene items (toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant, body wash and shampoo for men & women, etc.). Donations may be left in the baskets on the right in the front (main) vestibule.

ShopRite gift cards are also welcome, and if you'd like to write a check, please make it payable to St. Anthony's, with "food pantry" on the memo line. Checks in a sealed envelope marked "Social Services" can be put in the collection basket or mailed to or dropped off at the rectory. While we're grateful for all food donations, we can't distribute expired items, so please make sure to check the expiration dates on all items you're considering donating. Again, we thank you for your thoughtfulness and generosity. Our Ministry couldn't do all that it does without your continued support.
