





I am happy to announce that the recipient this year from Saint Anthony's is **Michael Pasquale.** Mike helps the parish in a lot of behind-the-scenes ways as our

parish attorney. But, even more than that, Mike has served for a quarter-century as one of the mainstays in our Religious Education Program. Mike has taught a whole generation of Middle School young people in the ways of their faith, which is no mean accomplishment! In honoring Mike, I want to honor as well, all the catechists who serve in Faith Formation, and who began their new year last Sunday. The Faith Formation program is the oldest component of our parish, dating back to April 18, 1908, even before the parish itself was formed.
