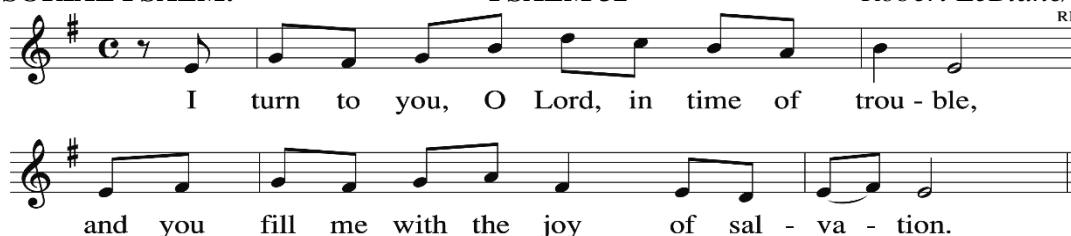

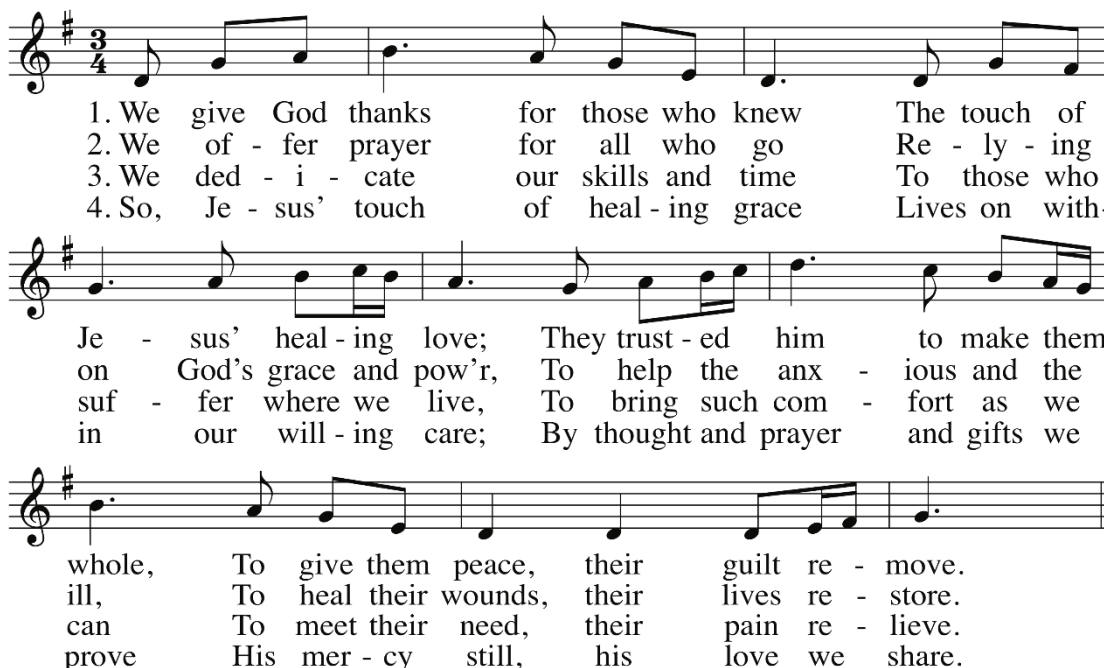

BY THE WAY . . .

- The Holy Season of Lent begins with **Ash Wednesday** this coming Wednesday, February 14. The schedule for Ash Wednesday services is as follows:

7:00 A.M.	Mass and Distribution of Ashes
9:00 A.M.	Mass and Distribution of Ashes (St. Anthony's School)
12:05 P.M.	Mass and Distribution of Ashes
3:30 P.M.	Prayer Service and Distribution of Ashes
7:30 P.M.	Mass and Distribution of Ashes

Some observations:

Ash Wednesday is celebrated by those who are serious about engaging in the Lenten Season of prayer, fasting, and alms giving.

Ash Wednesday is a Day of Fast and Abstinence (no meat and only one full meal).

Ash Wednesday is not a holyday of obligation.

Ashes are blessed and distributed after the homily at all Masses and Services. (Please do not call the rectory to ascertain exactly what time this is).

Ashes are not distributed after Mass.

- At Saint Anthony's we are able to offer a number of opportunities for our parishioners to embrace the **three Lenten practices** of Prayer, Fasting and Alms Giving during this holy season.

Prayer:

Holy Mass is offered each weekday morning, Monday through Saturday at 7:30 A.M.

The Rosary is prayed publicly after each weekday Mass.

The Stations of the Cross devotion are prayed each Friday night during Lent at 7:30 P.M.

The Novena to the Blessed Virgin Mary is prayed each Saturday morning after Mass.

Our Parish Lenten booklet, ***Repent and Believe in the Gospel*** contains a meditation written by one of our parishioners for each day of Lent. They provide a good "starter" for daily prayer and are available at the doors of the church this weekend.

Eucharistic Holy Hours will be celebrated on Friday March 1 at 7:30 P.M., and on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 7 at 3:00 P.M. in the church.

The church is open for prayer, meditation, and visits to the Blessed Sacrament each weekday from 6:00 A.M. to around 5:00 P.M. (later if there is some evening activity).

Fasting:

Ash Wednesday and every Friday of Lent are days of abstinence from eating meat.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also Days of Fasting when Catholics take only one full meal during the day.

After all Masses this weekend, **"Rice Bowls"** will be available at the doors of the church. We are encouraged to use them weekly and participate as a family in a "simple meal," and then place the money saved in the Rice Bowl as an alms for the hungry of the world. Rice Bowls will

be collected at the end of Lent. This is a good way to teach the practice of charity to our children.

The Parish Food Pantry has been a source of pride for our parish and sustenance for the hungry poor for many years. Donations may be dropped off in church after any weekend Mass.

Alms Giving:

During the Lenten Season there will be three “special collections” each of which give us the opportunity to assist with our charity:

Ash Wednesday - February 14 – the collection that day will be sent to Catholic Relief Services to aid the humanitarian efforts around the world.

Holy Thursday – March 28 – this “**collection for the poor**” is the only one mentioned in the Roman Missal – and will be divided between local and national outreach.

Good Friday – March 29 – “**Collection for the Holy Land**” – this universal collection in every Catholic church in the world is used to support the shrines and charitable works in the Holy Land.

Other Opportunities:

The Sacrament of Penance will be available again this year each Monday night of Lent from 7:00 to 8:30 P.M. in every Catholic church of the Paterson Diocese.

On Tuesday evenings at 7:30 P.M. in the church, Father Ray will offer a series called **Herstory: Women in the Church** – a look at the History of the Church through twenty centuries from the female perspective.

On Thursday evenings at 7:30 P.M. in the Cafeteria, Father Frank will offer a series called **Feeding the Body and Soul**. This will look at the Scriptures for the Lenten Sundays paired with various foods which trace their origin to the Catholic tradition (i.e. pretzels, Coquille St.-Jacques, etc.). Samples will be served.

On Friday mornings, Sister Betty Ann, F.M.A. will offer **Around the Lenten Circle** at 9:00 A.M. in the Rectory meeting room. This Bible Study will explore and pray over the Scriptures for the Lenten Sundays.

The Saint Joseph’s Mens’ Group meets for prayer and reflection on the first Saturday mornings of each month from 8:30 to 9:30 A.M, including March 2.

- This morning after the 12:00 Noon Mass, anyone who would like to take home any of the **poinsettias** that have graced our church for the past seven weeks is welcome to do so.

- I want to express to Anita Brudzynski and the whole Brudzynski Family the prayers and sympathies of myself and Father Frank and our whole parish community on the death of **Deacon Richard Brudzynski**. Deacon Dick died on February 3 at the age of 92. Ordained a permanent deacon by Bishop Frank Rodimer in 1986, Deacon Dick served for nearly thirty years in the diaconal ministry in our parish, retiring in 2015. During those years Deacon Dick was active in many areas of parish life, including the Liturgy Committee, pre-Baptismal Catechesis, Pre-Cana, and as “the voice” of Saint Anthony’s Feast. Perhaps his most enduring legacy in our parish is the 342 infants whom he baptized over those years. May he rest in peace.

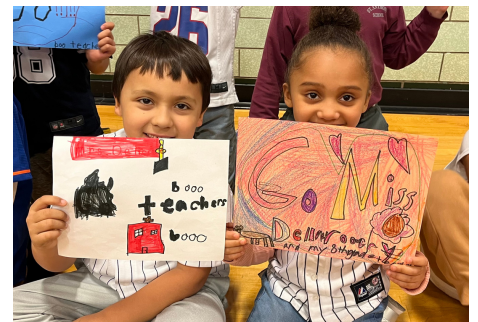
KEEP THE POWER ON THIS WINTER

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said: ‘If you wish, you can make me clean.’ Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him, ‘I do will it. Be made clean.’ The leprosy left him immediately and he was made clean.”

The meeting of the sick man with Jesus reveals several interesting things, both persons violated the law, lepers had to keep safe distances. He drew near to Jesus. Jesus reached out and touched him. The request for healing was met with pity and compassion, as He said, ‘I do will it.’

Recently there has been a rise in the cases of leprosy, but we can use it as a symbol for all diseases, evil and sin. We turn too and ask what the will of Jesus for us is, and we know it is to heal, support and sanctify us. May we have the courage to approach Jesus as did the beggar honestly asking for healing and forgiveness.

2 tablespoons sugar	2 tablespoons vegetable oil
1/2 teaspoon salt
