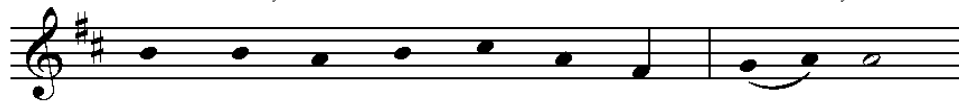

BY THE WAY . . .

- **Welcome Home to Healing:** The Sacrament of Penance is available every Monday evening from 7:00 to 8:30 P.M. in every church of the Paterson Diocese, including Saint Anthony's. In addition, Penance is also available every Saturday from 4:30 to 5:15 P.M. (except Holy Saturday).

- **Lent and the R.C.I.A.**

For the first several hundred years of the Church's existence, virtually all those coming into the Church were adults converting either from paganism or Judaism. It will not be until the 5th Century that the practice of Infant Baptism will become more common.

In the middle of the 3rd Century, during a nearly 50-year respite from persecution, the growth in the numbers of converts, as well as the relative freedom to organize its worship, resulted in the development of the Catechumenate, a formal two-year program of instruction and preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, First Eucharist) culminating in the actual celebration of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. (The great convert and Doctor of the Church, Saint Augustine described his own Baptism by Saint Ambrose at Milan on Holy Saturday in 386).

The last six weeks of that Catechumenate became a final intense period of preparation and prayer for the candidates. It is from that period that Lent originally developed as a way of sharing with and encouraging the catechumens as they approached the Easter Sacraments.

By the 6th Century as Infant Baptism became more the norm, the catechumenate as a practical group, became dormant, even though some of the rituals (such as the Blessing of Easter Water) remained in the Holy Saturday rites. Converts of sixty years ago will remember individual instruction by a priest, often in our country using a book entitled *Father Smith instructs Jackson*. The Holy Week reforms of 1951 reintroduced adult Baptism into the Holy Saturday rites. By the early 1970s the Catechumenate, often referred to as the RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults, became the norm for those entering the Catholic Church.

Today in most parishes of the United States, the Catechumenate is often referred to, somewhat incorrectly, as the RCIA Program, and routinely includes three different groups of people: unbaptized persons who are seeking to enter the Church (catechumens)

people baptized in other Christian faiths seeking Full Communion with the Catholic Church (candidates)

and people Baptized as Catholics who have never completed the Sacraments of Initiation (First Eucharist and/or Confirmation).

Sister Betty Ann Martinez, F.M.A. and her team have been very busy this year. This Holy Saturday at Saint Anthony's we will have thirteen people – two catechumens, two candidates, and nine Catholics – for the Easter Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. It will be beautiful.

How can you be part of this:

First, during the remaining days of Lent, pray for these men and women that God will open their hearts to the fullness of his life and love at Easter.

Second, come to the Easter Vigil yourself. Pray with them and cheer them on.

Third, If you or anyone you know falls into any of these categories come and speak to one of the priests, or Sister Betty Ann, and talk about how the RCIA program might benefit you. Now is the time to be thinking about next Easter!

- We continue our three different seasonal offerings for Lent.

On Tuesday evenings at 7:30 P.M. in the church, Father Ray will offer a series called **Herstory: Women in the Church** – a look at the History of the Church through twenty centuries from the female perspective.

On Thursday evenings at 7:30 P.M. in the Cafeteria, Father Frank will offer a series called **Feeding the Body and Soul**. This will look at the Scriptures for the Lenten Sundays paired with various foods which trace their origin to the Catholic tradition (i.e. pretzels, Coquille St.-Jacques, etc.). Samples will be served.

- On Friday mornings, Sister Betty Ann, F.M.A. will offer **Around the Lenten Circle** at 9:00 A.M. in the rectory. This Bible Study will explore and pray over the Scriptures for the Lenten Sundays.

ATTENTION SENIORS!

Passaic County Dept. of Senior Services provides one hot meal Monday through Friday at the Hawthorne Senior Center (Ambulance Corps Building), [970 Goffle Rd.](#) There is a minimal fee, and it's a friendly environment conducive to socialization. The Center also conducts various activities such as parties, trips, lectures, etc. that meet the needs of participants. The Center is open from 8:30 A.M. to 1:30 P.M. For further information, call 973 423 1027 or the County Nutrition Office at 973 569 4060. And if you need transportation: The Passaic County Paratransit Program maintains a fleet of vehicles, which provide transportation for the county's senior citizens age 60 and over and disabled residents in need of non-emergency rides to medical appointments, shopping centers, county run nutrition and adult day care sites, and for disabled residents to attend group work programs. Special lift vans are available to accommodate non-ambulatory individuals; service animals and portable oxygen will be accommodated. There is no fee for this service, however a donation of \$2.00 per trip is suggested. All donations are used to support Paratransit. To schedule a ride, please call (973) 305-5756 Monday through Friday, 8 A.M. to 4 P.M.

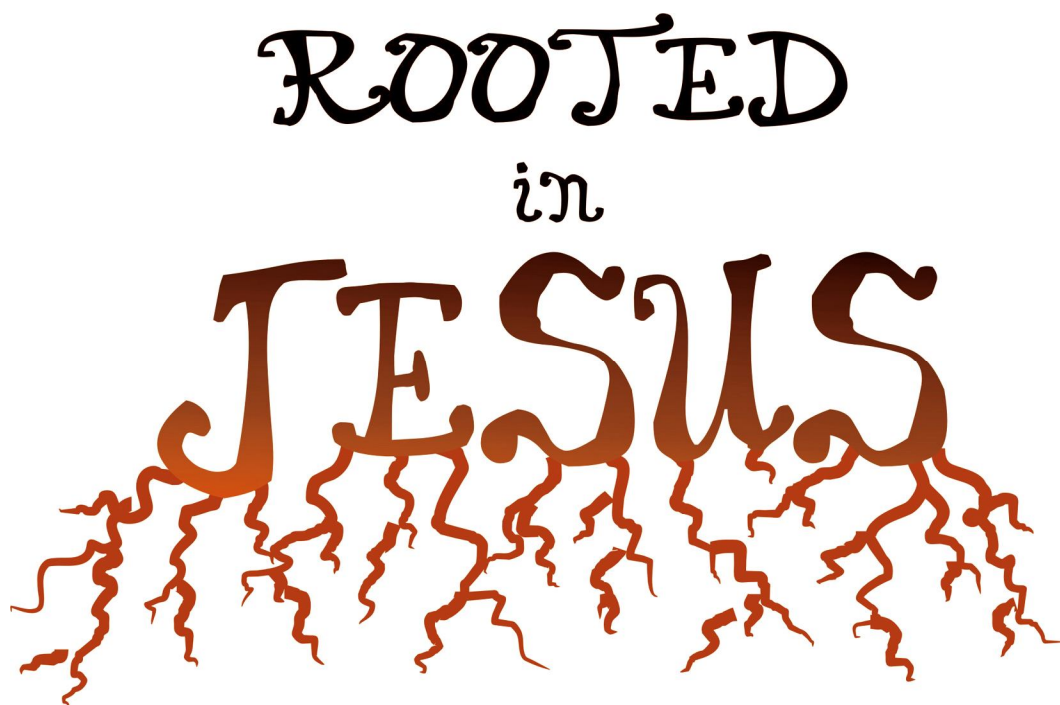
