### From the Faith Formation Coordinator

Good day parishioners,

Every Tuesday I receive an email from Chris Sefanik from "Real Life Catholic"; it's his "Two-Minute Tuesday" post. This past Tuesday I received this email and thought that it was important to show you what he wrote because we all have moments of despair or despondency.

Dear Friend in Christ,

There's a story of a priest who was going through a long season of despair and desolation. After years of serving in his vocation, his once fiery passion and enthusiasm for things that mattered most had grown cold. In fact, he had come to nearly resent it. He felt lost and disillusioned, uninspired to invest another day in what felt only like monotony.

On one cold winter morning, he decided to go for a walk. He lived near a military base and as he continued to walk, lost in frustrated prayer and his own thoughts, the older priest lost track of where he was going and inadvertently wandered onto an undisclosed area of the military base. It was then that it happened.

"Hey! Who are you? And what are you doing here?"

Arrested in spirit and awakened from his despondency, the priest was jolted by the bark of a United States Marine Corps Military Policeman. "What?" stammered the now surprised priest. "I said, who are you and what are you doing here?!" the MP retorted sharply. And as if in a moment of crystal clarity, in a calm voice the priest asked, "How much do they pay you, sir?" "What does that have to do with you?" the MP asked. "Because I will pay you the equal sum if you will just ask me those same two questions every morning. Who are you? And what are you doing here?"

This story captures the universal human experience of us all. We all get down, we all lose our way, we all forget who we are, we all experience seasons of desolation and despair. To regain our focus and vision for God's call on our lives, we need the daily reminder of who we really are (God's beloved sons and daughters) and why we're here (to share in his own blessed life).

Wherever this finds you this evening, I pray that you will re-discover your first love who calls you by name. That you would see yourself through God's eyes and realize (in head and heart) that you are worth the death of the only Son of God. I know it's a lot to take in and hard to believe, but with God's grace, we can receive his love and step into the future he is calling us to walk in...

# Why Register at St. Mary's?

First, because we need each other on this journey of life and faith!

Every Catholic should be registered in a parish. Beside the active support and involvement that the registration enables, parish registration is also a mandatory condition for many sacraments including Baptism and Matrimony and being a sponsor or godparent. It is therefore important to register at St. Mary's as soon as you start worshipping with us regularly.

- You may receive verification letters to sponsor individuals for sacraments, receive sacraments yourself or your child (i.e. marriage, baptism).
- You will receive end of the year tax contribution statements.
- You will be personally invited to gatherings to meet the staff and other parishioners.
- The parish will know the demographics and respond to needs. Further, the Archdiocese will know that our parish has a healthy base of registered, supportive parishioners.


