RISE, AND DO NOT BE AFRAID

Today's gospel is one of great mystery: the transfiguration. Moses and Elijah appear next

to Jesus, who was completely transfigured, radiating pure light. Imagine yourself there.... The sight must have been out of this world! In the face of all this glory, Peter's first reaction is to set up three dwellings, offering them worldly comfort. How often is God right in front of us, showing us divinity and a plan for our life, and we focus on logistics and worldly preoccupations? As a matter of face, today during Mass, we will witness one of the greatest miracles of all times: bread and wine becoming Jesus' body and blood. The Eucharist is the sacrament where we get a glimpse of God's glory and power. For a moment, heaven and earth meet. As we witness this miracle today, where will our heart and mind be? Will we be checking the time or reveling in God's glory? Will we be thinking about the things we need to do this week or listening to God speak to our hearts?

Jesus' words to the disciples are a wakeup call: "Rise, and do not be afraid." They prompt us to refocus on what's important: not worldly considerations but an attentive ear and an open heart to his ever-living word, calling us to be examples of heaven here on earth.


