From the desk of Fr. Ben...

12 March 2017



I took this picture of the **Church** of the Transfiguration on the top of Mount Tabor in Galilee in 2007 when I was there on pilgrimage as a seminarian. It was definitely one of my favorite places in the Holy Land, with a breathtaking view out over the Jezreel valley.

Peter, James, and John, beholding the Lord's glory, and overawed by His conversing with Elijah and Moses, were filled with fear. Think of that: beauty and glory so over-

whelming you're afraid! And all they had was a glimpse, no full or lasting vision, such as we're called to in eternity!

One way of thinking about Lent is to recognize that our Lenten disciplines are meant to prepare us and dispose us to encounter the Lord's glory! Counter-intuitively, maybe this is a great way to think about fasting!

Fasting is fundamentally the giving up of some GOOD thing. You don't fast from sin... we're ALWAYS supposed to resist sin. We fast from meat... something the tradition sees as a good thing. We fast from other rich foods, traditionally in many countries from all meat and dairy for the whole Lenten season. We fast to strengthen our wills so that we can choose the good and reject the evil.

Fasting also opens up space for desire. It's not meant to destroy desire, but to train it, so it doesn't overwhelm us. Or, alternately, it's meant to deepen desire by giving us a chance to awaken to the mystery that all the desires of our heart, if we go deep enough, are rooted in our desire for God. A famous quote from the Scottish Catholic author Bruce Marshall says, "...the young man who rings the bell at the brothel is unconsciously looking for God."

An American Catholic version of fasting is the old "giving up one thing during Lent." It's simple, it's concrete... and it can be a terrible diminishment of what Lent is really about. It's what I grew up with, and I still commit myself to giving up certain things during Lent... we are indeed all called to fast. However, fasting is about opening to God, not just about displaying willpower, or dieting!

How can we go deeper in fasting? A few ideas:

- 1) Do I keep the basic universal fast of the Church, Friday penance? Every Friday of the year we are bound by Church law to perform penance. During Lent we must abstain from meat, during the rest of the year (in the U.S.) we have the privilege of choosing what form our penance will take.
- 2) Do I fast for one hour before receiving Communion?
- 3) Have I chosen to fast in a way that will remind me daily that it's Lent?
- 4) Have I chosen to fast in a way that inconveniences me more than others?
- Do I make a spiritual offering of my fasting, opening my heart up to a deeper awareness of my desire for

That's a very inadequate exposition of fasting... but hopefully it provides a few thought-provoking points!

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
