From the desk of Fr. Ben \dots 06 March 2022



"Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and when they were over he was hungry."

Jesus is the Word Incarnate, God Who has come among us to dwell with us, like us in all things but sin. Temptation isn't the same as sin... temptation happens, but sin has to be chosen. Jesus faces temptation for us, with us, and on our behalf... and He overcomes temptation. When temptations wax hot and powerful, and we feel weak, we can and should call upon Him... "Lord, help me!"

Sometimes the most insidious and damaging temptations aren't to be ruled by the passions in the heat of the moment (dangerous enough), but those plausible lies that lead us away from hope and towards giving up. Oftentimes, they are lies about our identity and dignity! Lord, help us turn to you in every temptation!

It has been terrible to see the invasion of Ukraine on the news. As we have prayed for peace and for this crisis to be averted, we continue to pray for a peaceful and just resolution to this war. Pope Francis called for worldwide prayer on Ash Wednesday, a day of fasting and prayer for peace.

Lent has begun! Make a concrete plan as to how you and your family will embrace the THREE Lenten Disciplines the Church calls each of us to keep: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. Each of the three plays a key role in the work of healing and growth in our hearts! Be proactive and concrete. Choose practices that will be a penance to you... but not primarily a penance to those around you!

The Lenten Penance Services in our vicariate start this week in Lake Linden on Wednesday, please make sure to make a good confession during Lent! It's a powerful and beautiful path to encounter God's healing mercy!

Fr. Tom, Sr. Jacqueline, and I will be leading a group of students and our FOCUS Missionaries on our annual Spring Break Mission trip this week, so most of the liturgies will be suspended. There WILL be Stations of the Cross on Wednesday as St. Anne's. We'll be headed back to Fr. Carr's Place 2B (fathercarrs.org/), a homeless shelter and food bank in Oshkosh, WI. We were there in 2020 when it dawned on me that the COVID pandemic was going to seriously impact our daily lives! I'm glad that 2 years later we can go back to serve those in need. LENTEN DISCIPLINES

Ash Wednesday (March 2) and Good Friday (April 15) are days of fast AND abstinence.

Abstinence is also to be observed on all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is required of all the faithful in good health from the age of 18 to the beginning of their 60th year. Fasting is usually interpreted to mean one full meal and, if necessary, two other small meals. One should not eat between meals, but milk, fruit juices, and other liquids are permitted.

Abstinence binds everyone over the age of 14. Abstinence means no meat should be eaten during the entire day.

Anyone unable to observe the fast and abstinence obligations because of health or other serious reasons should substitute another penance.

These simple forms of self-denial help to remind us of the Lord's Passion and Death. We offer them to God for our own conversion to Christ, and the conversion of the whole world. They can also be an occasion to grow in self-discipline and solidarity with the poor.
