FROM THE PASTOR

Beloved,
“**I tell you, if these [disciples] were silent, the very stones would cry out.**” (Luke 19:40)

Sometimes we fail to see and acknowledge ‘goodness’ within our presence. We remain silent and/or even advocate for others to do the same. Today’s scripture texts, however, remind us that evil cannot silence **goodness**.

In the Gospel, Luke describes Jesus’ entry into Jerusalem as a triumphant procession with the “whole multitude of his disciples.” Luke wishes his listeners to understand that Jesus is completing His mission of “**goodness**” to the poor. Therefore, it is worth celebrating triumphantly. However, amidst the crowd are individuals who wish to silent the disciples about ‘who is Jesus.’ In response, Jesus reassures them that even the stones will testify to **Jesus’ goodness**.

Both the prophet Isaiah and Paul speak about **God’s goodness** and why evil persons wish to silence. Today’s first reading from the prophet Isaiah is the key that unlocks the door to who is Jesus. He is a humble and obedient servant, pure in heart; he comes from God for the purpose of giving life to the poor; God assists him to accomplish his mission. Consequently, God will not put him to shame by being silent.

In the case of Paul, he clearly states that Jesus is divine but empties himself of that privilege and took on the human condition of the poor and needy. Though he came face to face with evil, God was not silent. Instead, God acknowledges his **goodness** and exalts him as Lord.

As we enter Holy Week, we learn that Jesus’ suffering, death and resurrection is a sign that evil cannot silence **good**. As we recall the final chapters of Jesus’ life, let us identify the evil tendencies within us that wish to silence **goodness**. Most of all, let us open our hearts and mind to the Spirit and believe that ‘**Goodness**’ will ultimately triumphant.
