



Because of the Church's magisterium, Catholics have the assurance that their beliefs are divinely revealed truths, not human interpretations and opinions.

Other than questioning the apostles on what they and other people believed regarding his identity (cf. Mark 8:27–29), Jesus never conducted a vote or an opinion poll, or said to his followers, "This is what I personally think, but you decide for yourselves what to believe." Rather, he came to proclaim God's truth (John 18:37), and he entrusted this same teaching authority, or magisterium, to his Church (Luke 10:16). It is illogical to believe that Jesus, the eternal Word of God, would go to the trouble of becoming human, establishing the Church, and dying on the cross to save us from our sins, without providing a guarantee that the Church would continue to preserve and proclaim his teachings faithfully. Jesus followed his own advice by building his Church on the solid foundation of fidelity and truth (Matt. 7:24–25) and on the rock of Peter's faith (Matt. 16:18–19). Not only does this divinely given teaching authority assure the Church's pronouncements on faith and morals will be free of error, it also serves as a source and measure of unity.
