<u>Catechists</u> – A Catechist is a person who has accepted the call of the local church to teach as Jesus did. Catechist means "one who echoes." Therefore, the Catechist's ministry is to echo and re-echo the story and vision of Jesus to the community. All Catechists, which includes all Teachers, Aides, Substitutes and Helpers, are volunteers and deserve and will get the utmost respect from all people involved. These people are also Safe Environment Compliant as per the requirements of the Diocese of Victoria. They give many hours preparing for their classes and attending training sessions. Catechists are encouraged to deepen their own level of understanding of their faith by attending Catechist training courses, by attending Catechetical conferences, or by completing Diocesan programs such as Echoes or Pastoral Institute classes. Each classroom has a minimum of two Catechists present for each session. Parents are needed and urged to volunteer in the program. Dedication to your faith and a love for children/youth are the key characteristics of those we seek to work in this ministry. Everything else we can teach you.

# **EXPECTATIONS OF CATECHISTS**

- Be a Christian role model, by providing a loving atmosphere within the learning environment so that every student can feel accepted and safe.
- Prepare and teach the curriculum.
- Communicate regularly with and involve parents in the faith development of their students.
- Attend teacher meetings, trainings and all required sessions in the Safe Environment program and to strictly follow the Code of Conduct as stated.
- Communicate with PCL about concerns or comments to insure a better program.
- Keep confidential all student information and concerns.

Catechists will keep information about your children confidential. Please let the Parish Catechetical Leader and Catechists know if you have a child that may need modified work or accommodations.

# Parents are still the primary teachers of the faith.

<u>Aide/Substitute</u> – The Aide/Substitute will present the lesson when a Catechist cannot attend class in order to maintain the minimum of two Safe Environment Compliant adults in the classroom. The Aide may assist the teacher in any way to prepare and present lessons and work together for the upkeep of the classroom.

<u>Hall Monitors</u> – Adults who volunteer their time and energy to help maintain a safe atmosphere outside of the classrooms. They will be available in case a child needs to be escorted to a necessary location due to illness and/or other incidents that may arise. They will assist Catechists in Fire Safety and Disaster Preparation. The requirement is for two Safe Environment Compliant Building Monitors at each session each week.

# **VOLUNTEER PARTICIPATION IS WELCOME!**

#### **HOW TO VOLUNTEER –**

- 1. Visit virtusonline.org to log into your account or register as a new volunteer. Follow online instructions for first time applicants. For existing volunteers please enter your user ID and password. If you do not remember your user ID, please contact the help desk in Virtus or Lana Brysch at 361-550-4554.
- 2. Contact the Parish Office at 361-564-2893 if you have any questions or need help to apply online.

#### **EXPECTATIONS FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS**

- Ensure that their student attends class <u>regularly and on time</u>. Let the PCL or Catechist know if your child will be absent.
- Communicate any special needs or circumstances to the Catechist or Religious Education Administration that may affect their child in the classroom.
- Notify the parish office of changes of address and/or phone numbers.
- Be an active part of student learning and be involved in the classroom by striving to:
  - 1. Attend Mass weekly.
  - 2. Make daily prayer a part of your home.
- Assist students with required prayers, test reviews and volunteer service hours.
- Attend any parent meeting that is required as part of a Sacrament and/or attend any required sessions in the Safe Environment program.
- Share your own faith with your child as often as possible.

#### **EXPECTATIONS FOR STUDENTS**

- Behave in a Christian manner at all times, showing respect and being cooperative with adults and other students.
- Dress appropriately for classes and all Church sponsored events. (School dress code applies).
- Actively participate in classroom activities and discussions.
- Attend class weekly, complete all homework assignments and attend all required sessions in the Safe Environment program.
- Always show respect for others and others' property.
- Do not use or possess vapes, tobacco or tobacco products.
- Do not use or possess alcohol or illegal drugs.
- Do not use or possess any weapons, knives or firearms. This includes attendance at class or retreats, on or off campus.

Failure to comply with these rules will result in expulsion from the program and persons who violate policies governed by law WILL BE reported to the authorities.

# DIOCESE OF VICTORIA CODE OF CONDUCT

A signed copy must be submitted by all personnel and volunteers.

Our children are the most important gifts God has entrusted to us. As someone working in the ministry of Religious Education for the parishes of Holy Cross and the missions of San Luis and St. Ann, I promise to strictly follow the rules and guidelines in the Code of Conduct as a condition of my providing services to the children and youth of our parish.

#### I WILL:

- Treat everyone with respect, loyalty, patience, integrity, courtesy, dignity and consideration.
- Avoid situations where I am alone with children/youth at church activities.
- Use positive reinforcement rather than criticism, competition, or comparison when working with children/youth.
- Refuse to accept expensive gifts from children/youth or their parents/guardians without written permission of the pastor.
- Refrain from giving expensive gifts to children/youth without prior written approval from the parents/guardians.
- Report suspected abuse to the pastor and the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services at 1-800-252-5400.

I understand that failure to report suspected abuse to civil authorities is, according to the law a misdemeanor. I understand I must cooperate fully in any investigation of abuse of children/youth.

# I WILL NOT:

- Use, possess or be under the influence of alcohol at any time while volunteering.
- Use, possess or be under the influence of illegal drugs at any time.
- Pose any health risk to the children/youth (i.e., fevers, contagious illness).
- Strike, spank, shake or slap any child/youth for any reason.
- Humiliate, ridicule, threaten or degrade any person, adult/child/youth.
- Touch a child/youth in a sexual or inappropriate manner.
- Use any discipline that frightens or humiliates children/youth.
- Use profanity in the presence of children/youth.

Each person working in the Holy Cross Faith Formation program will be subject to a background check including criminal history. Each person understands that any action inconsistent with the Code of Conduct or failure to act mandated by this Code of Conduct may result in his or her removal from this ministry.

If a problem arises with a catechist, please seek to solve it by meeting with them privately. If you still have a concern, please contact Father Roger Hawes at the parish office, and every attempt will be made to work with you for the good of the student.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS**

Cell phones and tablets may be brought on campus, but they must be silenced before class time and will be collected before class to minimize distractions. If any device sounds during class time, the device will be brought to the catechist and will be returned to the student after class. If a situation arises that your child needs to be contacted by phone, please call the Parish PCL, Lana Brysch (361) 550-4554.

Parents/Guardians will be kept informed of upcoming events during the year through newsletters, notes and the Remind app. Our Holy Cross website can always be accessed for information as well. The website is kept up to date. The web address is <a href="holycrossyorktown.net">holycrossyorktown.net</a>. Catechists occasionally send homework that needs to be returned for the next class, please check with your student(s) weekly.

# **DISCIPLINE AND PROBLEM SITUATIONS**

All students are expected to share in the faith learning experiences of the Holy Cross Faith Formation program. The behavior of students should reflect respect. Each student has a responsibility to his/her fellow students and the Catechists and staff to create and maintain a Christian atmosphere.

#### The principles are:

- Respect others, their thoughts and opinions as well as their belongings
- Respect all parish/school property
- Be prepared to learn by being prepared for class
- Share your faith
- Do your own work
- Show appropriate behavior in the classroom and hallway
- Be mindful that the Church is a sacred place, and it is to be treated as such

Parents/Guardians are the resource for help with a behavioral need. The Catechist and Pastor will seek the parents/guardian suggestions as to the cause of inappropriate behavior. This collaboration will result in positive approaches to working with and/or ending the behavior. If a student's behavior disrupts the learning process for himself/herself or for others, the steps listed will be followed to ensure that class participation may continue. Behavior appropriate for the Holy Cross Faith Formation classroom is equivalent to that extended in the school setting. Catechists will use positive discipline methods when needed to reinforce those expectations. The Holy Cross Faith Formation program discipline procedure is based on rules and consequences. There are few rules but they must be enforced clearly, concisely and consistently.

#### **CONSEQUENCES OF ACTIONS OF STUDENTS**

At the first incident the student will be reminded of expected behavior and the consequences of misbehavior. After the second incident, the student will be sent to the Pastor about appropriate behavior and possible solutions to the problem. A disciplinary letter, written by the student explaining his/her fault will be mailed to the parents on the next business day. After returning to class, if there are repeated problems, the students' parent/guardian will be called. Severe problems or ongoing problems may result in the dismissal from the program, or parent/guardian attendance may be required to continue in class. Any student caught with illegal substances (i.e., drugs or alcohol, etc.) will be turned over to legal authorities.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

All Faith Formation classes will be held in at the Holy Cross Activity Center. Class times are as follows:

Pre-K3 – 5th Grades Sunday 10:30 to 11:45 a.m.  $6^{th}$  –  $10^{th}$  Grades Wednesday 6 to 7:30 p.m.

Students are expected to attend all scheduled classes. Please contact your child's catechist when they will be absent. It is important that your student(s) attend classes regularly and consistently. Any missed classes will be a disadvantage to the student in their learning process. Attendance is recorded each time classes meet. All attendance records are kept in the students' permanent records on file in the parish office at the completion of each year. Attendance during sacramental preparation years are monitored to ensure the child is fully prepared for the upcoming sacrament.

If you know in advance that your student will be absent, please inform the students' catechist or the parish office the week prior to the absence. If your child will be missing some classes on a regular basis (i.e., shared custody) contact the parish office or your student's Catechist so your situation can be addressed.

#### **BAD WEATHER DAYS**

If classes need to be cancelled on Sundays, it will be announced at 9:30 services and catechists will be asked to call/text their parents and/or post on the Remind app as soon as possible. When it is necessary to cancel Wednesday classes, we will send out text messages and post on the Remind app at least an hour before class time. If weather comes up while students are in class, we will either shelter in place or try to evacuate students, whichever is safest. Parents will be notified of situations and instructions.

#### ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE OF STUDENTS

When dropping off your child, make sure to come in front of the building to drop off and make sure they go into the building. All students should be picked up promptly after classes to ensure their safety. Catechists will bring the children to the front porch or playground to wait for parents. Parents need to come to pick up their child. NO CHILD will be allowed to cross the parking lot without an adult. This is for their safety. Transportation to and from all classes and events/retreats sponsored by the Victoria Diocese and/or Holy Cross Church will be the responsibility of the parents/guardian.

#### SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

#### **BAPTISM**

If your child <u>HAS NOT</u> been baptized, please contact Father Roger to schedule your baptism class. This does not prevent your child from attending Religious Education. If your student has been baptized, but was not baptized at Holy Cross, San Luis or St. Ann, a certified copy of his/her Birth Certificate and a copy of the Baptismal Certificate must be submitted to the Parish Office prior to the student's reception of the Sacraments.

# FIRST RECONCILIATION AND FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

All baptized first and second graders, as well as any Elementary students still needing the Sacraments, will prepare for two Sacraments: First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. This is a two-year preparation course. These Sacraments will be celebrated during the second semester of classes. Parents/Guardians will be informed of special dates and events specific to these sacraments as the year progresses. If Baptism is required, please contact the office for assistance as all children must be baptized before First Reconciliation and Holy Communion. Check the church website, <a href="https://www.holycrossyorktown.net">www.holycrossyorktown.net</a>, often for date changes and for at-home resources.

# **CONFIRMATION**

Candidates will complete a 2-year formation program during which time he/she will be obligated to accumulate service projects and attend spiritual retreats. Parents/Guardians will attend an orientation meeting at the beginning of the school year to receive an overview of the 2-year program. In addition, supplementary communications and materials will be distributed as the need arises. If at any time, you have questions, concerns or feedback, and/or if you would like additional information or resources, please do not hesitate to contact Father Roger, Father Scott, Mike Yeretsky, Cindy DuBose or Lana Brysch.

# **STUDENT ILLNESS**

In case of student illness or similar emergency, the Catechist will notify the parent/guardian for immediate pickup of the student. For this reason, it is important that we have a working number where you can be reached when your child/youth is in class. When a parent/guardian cannot be contacted, the people listed as your 'emergency contacts' will be notified. Please let us know promptly if you have a change in telephone number or if your emergency contact has changed.

#### **HEALTH CONCERNS AND MEDICATION**

The policy of the Holy Cross Faith Formation program is for no Catechist or other personnel in the program to administer medication to a student. However, in cases of great need, medication will be distributed with the signed permission of the parent/guardian of the student. If your child/youth is on medication that makes him/her extremely sleepy or has other side effects, please let the Catechist or Aide know in advance. If the student is on medication for hyperactivity, please make sure that his/her medication is in effect during Faith Formation time. Health concerns should be brought to the attention of the Catechist and Director of Faith Formation during registration and updated as the need arises. As a matter of policy, please do not allow your child/youth to bring either prescription or non-prescription medication on campus. Please let us know if your student has an allergy to any food items. Both Catechist and Parish Office should know of any medical condition that might warrant a need for extra caution or supervision. All information will remain confidential.

# Grades Pre-K 3 - Kinder (Level 1 Atrium): Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The CGS program believes the 3-6 year old child is particularly capable of receiving and enjoying the most essential elements of our faith – the announcement of God's love especially experienced through Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who died and is risen. Materials on the life of Jesus Christ and His teachings help to make the mystery of God concrete for the child. The heart of the catechesis for children under six revolves around the Parable of the Good Shepherd. Jesus announces that He is the Good Shepherd who calls each one by name. The sheep listen to the voice of the Shepherd and follow Him.

# Grades 1 & 2/First Holy Communion (Level 2 Atrium): Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The CGS program is designed for children ages 6-9, typically 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>rd</sup> grades, and focuses on deepening their understanding of the Mass, the Bible, and prayer while exploring the themes of Baptism, the Eucharist, and the Church. Level 2 builds upon the foundation of Level 1 and provides a more in-depth exploration of the child's relationship with God, family, friends and the wider community. Students will be prepared for Reconciliation and Holy Communion. Guardians will be invited to attend some evening classes in the Spring with their children. This will be discussed at the August 24<sup>th</sup> Parent Meeting.

# 3<sup>rd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> Grades: Baltimore Catechism, Holy Bible, Jesus our Guide - Faith and Life Series

Our classes will be using the question and answer format of the *Baltimore Catechism* which combines solid Catholic doctrinal teaching with meaningful exposure to Scripture and practical application. The concise presentation of the truths of the faith is what our young people need to appreciate, practice, and defend Church teaching. It is an invaluable teaching tool to prepare children to receive the Sacraments and lead authentic Catholic lives. They will focus on the recitation and meaning of prayers that will guide them throughout their lives, as well as the Jesus our Guide texts and workbooks from the Ignatius Press Faith and Life Series.

# 6<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> Grades: Edge, formed.org

The Jr. High will incorporate the Edge curriculum from LifeTeen which is based on the pillars of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. It includes resources for catechetical lessons and current events issues. Parents are always welcome to attend classes with their children. There will be Social Edge Nights when we welcome parental involvement in hosting meals for our students. Please contact Lana Brysch at 361-550-4554 if you are willing to assist.

# 9<sup>th</sup> Grade (Confirmation I) & 10<sup>th</sup> Grade (Confirmation II): Life Teen – Purpose for Confirmation

The Purpose curriculum is comprised of 24 sessions with a heavy focus on evangelizing young people and accompanying them as they become disciples. The curriculum addresses three big questions, "Why believe in God?", "Why trust Jesus?" and "Why be a part of the Church?" and these questions are supplemented with the Foundations book series, which allow teens to dive more deeply into each. Social Nights will also be part of our program of study and we will request parental support in providing meals. Confirmation II will also include parental visits during each class. A sign-up sheet will be provided for volunteers.
