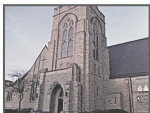

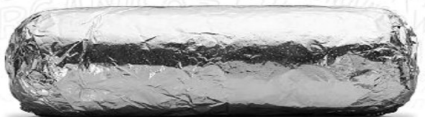

Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y Paz a todos ustedes mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo.

El domingo pasado celebramos la Epifanía del Señor y el lunes celebramos el Bautismo del Señor. El Bautismo del Señor marca el final de la temporada navideña. Ahora, volvemos al tiempo ordinario. Vamos a tener tiempo ordinario por muchas semanas. No quiere decir que no sea un tiempo litúrgico especial. Es un tiempo en el que reflexionamos sobre los momentos ordinarios del ministerio de Jesús; no en el contexto de los grandes momentos (nacimiento, pasión y ascenso). Sino que nos sumergiremos en sus enseñanzas y predicaciones en las colinas y valles de Galilea. La vida ministerial del Señor. Esos momentos ordinarios que a veces parecen no importar y sin embargo están llenos de la presencia de Dios. Esos momentos de Dios se convierten en un acontecimiento extraordinario en la vida del discípulo que abre el corazón a Cristo.

Este año litúrgico vamos a seguir el evangelio de Mateo. Navegaremos con el evangelio de Mateo y encontraremos cinco discursos principales que están en el corazón del evangelio. Si dejamos de un lado la Narrativa del nacimiento de Jesús en los primeros dos capítulos y la conclusión del Evangelio la Narrativa de la Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección de Jesús en los dos últimos capítulos. Entonces, nos fijaremos en el cuerpo del Evangelio de Mateo, que se estructura en torno a cinco largos sermones que Jesús da a sus discípulos o al público en general. Primer Discurso: "Sermón de la Montaña". Este es un sermón muy extenso que Jesús predica a las multitudes en el Monte. Concluye el sermón con las Bienaventuranzas; qué maravillosa manera de traer nuevos mandamientos a sus seguidores. Segundo Discurso: "Instrucciones Misioneras". Este es un conjunto de enseñanzas sobre el trabajo misionero de los discípulos. El pequeño grupo de discípulos aprende rápidamente a ser misioneros. Tercer Discurso: "Colección de Parábolas". Esta es la forma preferida de Jesús para instruir a las multitudes y a los discípulos. Mateo reúne todas las parábolas de Jesús en un largo discurso de parábolas. Aquí enseña de manera muy ordinaria la grandeza de su mensaje y el Reino de Dios. Cuarto Discurso: "Instrucciones Comunitarias". Esta es una de mis secciones favoritas en el evangelio de Mateo. Las enseñanzas sobre la vida comunitaria. La vida de la iglesia. Tenemos unas instrucciones muy maravillosas sobre la corrección fraterna, el perdón y el apoyo en familia. Quinto Discurso: "Sermón sobre la Escatología". Las enseñanzas del fin de los tiempos presentan el punto clave de estar preparados para enfrentar nuestro juicio final. También hay enseñanzas maravillosas que nos muestran que nuestra salvación proviene de nuestra capacidad de ver el rostro de Jesús en los demás. La gracia de Dios se nos da cuando podemos reconocer en los demás la presencia de Dios.

Al comenzar este tiempo ordinario, mantengámonos en sintonía con la presencia de Dios. Cada momento de nuestras vidas tiene el potencial de convertirse en un momento extraordinario en el que nuestras vidas cambian para mejor. Estemos al pendiente de estas maravillosas enseñanzas de Jesús.

Thoughts from Father Juan . . .

Grace and Peace to you all my brothers and sisters in Christ.

Last Sunday, we celebrated the Epiphany of the Lord, and on Monday we celebrated the Baptism of the Lord. The Baptism of the Lord marks the end of Christmas season. Now, we are back to Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time is here to stay with us for a while. It doesn't mean that it is not a special liturgical time. It is a time in which we reflect on the ordinary moments of Jesus' ministry, not in the context of the big moments (birth, passion and rising). We will dive into his teachings and preaching on the hills and valleys of Galilee—the ministerial life of the Lord, those ordinary moments that sometimes don't seem to matter and yet they are full of God's presence. Those God moments become an extraordinary event in the life of the disciple who opens the heart to Christ.

This liturgical year we are going to follow Matthew's Gospel. We will navigate Matthew and find five major discourses which are at the heart of the Gospel (apart from the Narrative of Jesus' birth in the first two chapters and the Narrative of Jesus' Passion, Death, and Resurrection in the two chapters at the conclusion of the Gospel).

If we look at the body of Matthew's Gospel, it is structured around five long sermons that Jesus gives to his disciples or to the broader public. First Discourse: "Sermon on the Mount". This is a very extensive sermon that Jesus preaches to the crowds on the Mount. He concludes the sermon with the Beatitudes, what a wonderful way of bringing new commandments to his followers. Second Discourse: "Missionary Instructions". This is a set of teachings about missionary work of the disciples. The small group of disciples quickly learn to be missionaries. They learn to reach out to others. Third Discourse: "Collection of Parables". This is the preferred way for Jesus to instruct the crowds and the disciples. Matthew put together all Jesus' parables in a long discourse of parables. Here he teaches in a very ordinary way the greatness of his message and the Kingdom of God. Fourth Discourse: "Community Instructions". This is one of my favorite sections in Matthew's Gospel: the teachings about community life, the life of the church. We have some very wonderful instructions about fraternal correction, forgiveness, and support as a family. Fifth Discourse: "Sermon on Eschatology". The end of times teachings brings about the key point of being prepared to meet our final judgement. There are also very wonderful teachings that show us that our salvation comes from our ability to see Jesus' face in others. God's grace is given to us when we can recognize in others God's presence.

As we begin this Ordinary Time, let us keep in tune with God's presence. Each moment of our lives has the potential to become an extraordinary moment in which our lives change for the best. Let us be on the lookout for these wonderful teachings of Jesus.
