Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y Paz, mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Las lecturas de este fin de semana reflejan el inmenso amor de Dios para con su pueblo. Isaías invita al pueblo de Israel a volver a Dios, que es misericordioso y generoso en el perdón. Alienta al pueblo de Israel, que ha perdido el rumbo, a encontrar el camino de regreso al Señor, que es todo amor. Un mensaje clave de Isaías es que los caminos del Señor son más altos que nuestros caminos y sus pensamientos más altos que nuestros pensamientos. Esto se refleja también en la parábola del Evangelio. Los jornaleros fueron contratados para trabajar para el dueño de la viña, que en este caso es Dios, y cuando llega el momento del pago todos reciben el mismo pago. Unos cuantos estaban enojados con el dueño porque trabajaron más y pensaban que merecían más. Para Dios, que es justo y sus pensamientos son más elevados que los nuestros, todos merecemos por igual su generosidad. Todos trabajamos por la misma recompensa: la vida eterna en la presencia de Dios.

Me gustaría que consideráramos los siguientes tres pensamientos de las lecturas de este fin de semana. El primero es: el escándalo del amor de Dios. Su amor es tan inmenso que somos incapaces de comprenderlo. Como nos recuerda Isaías y, vemos en el Evangelio cuando el dueño de la viña paga por igual a todos los trabajadores. Para Dios todos estamos trabajando por la misma recompensa sin importar cuándo empecemos a trabajar en ella. Nuestra recompensa es la vida eterna en la presencia de Dios. Él está listo para compartir su presencia y amor con todos nosotros, sin excepciones. Este amor abundante es un escándalo para nosotros. Es tan escandaloso el amor de Dios que su propio Hijo murió en la cruz por nosotros. Dios pasó por todo eso sólo por su amor hacia nosotros.

La segunda es: Dios responde a nuestras necesidades no a nuestros méritos. Los trabajadores acordaron recibir un denario, que era el salario diario. Era lo que una persona necesitaba para mantener alimentada a su familia durante el día. Todos los trabajadores recibirán lo que necesitaban para mantener a sus familias. El escándalo del amor de Dios para los que llegaron antes a trabajar es que los que llegaron últimos recibieron lo mismo. Los trabajadores que llegaron temprano pensaron que recibirían más por trabajar más, pero todos reciben la misma recompensa. Reciben lo que se les prometió. Dios siempre está dispuesto a atender nuestras necesidades basándose en su amor por nosotros y no en nuestros propios méritos. Comprender esto requiere un arduo trabajo espiritual. Nuestra lógica humana siempre se basa en los méritos. Elogiamos a quienes lo hacen bien y a veces nos olvidamos de elogiar a quienes necesitan elogios en ese momento. Amamos a quienes merecen nuestro amor. El último trabajador que vino a trabajar recibe mucha generosidad. Recibió lo que necesitaba para llevar comida a la mesa de su familia. Imagínese que después de todo el día esperando y deseando, finalmente tiene la oportunidad de tener lo que necesitaba. ¡Qué momento tan alegre!

Finalmente, deja que Dios sea Dios. En la vida muchas veces queremos mantener a Dios en nuestros propios términos. Isaías nos recuerda que los caminos de Dios son más altos que los nuestros, y los pensamientos de Dios son más altos que nuestros pensamientos. El dueño del viñedo tiene valores más nobles que los trabajadores. Quiere pagar justamente a todos por lo que necesitan. No ve méritos, pero por sugenerosidad da a todos por igual. Esto es difícil de entender para todos nosotros porque muchas veces queremos que Dios actúe de acuerdo



Thoughts from Father Juan . .

Grace and Peace, my brothers and sisters in Christ,

This weekend's readings reflect the immense love of God for his people. Isaiah invites the people to turn back to God, who is merciful and generous in forgiving. He encourages the people of Israel, who have lost their way, to find a path back to the Lord, who is all love. A key message from Isaiah is that the ways of the Lord are higher than our ways and his thoughts higher than our thoughts. This is reflected in the parable of the Gospel too. The laborers were contracted to work for the owner of the vineyard, who is God in this case, and when pay time comes all receive the same payment. There were a few who were angry with the owner because they worked longer and thought they deserved more. For God, who is just, and whose thoughts are higher than ours, we all deserve equally from his generosity. We are all working for the same reward: eternal life in the presence of God.

I would like us to consider the following three thoughts from the readings for this weekend. The first one is: **the scandal of God's love**. His love is so immense that we are unable to comprehend it, as Isaiah reminds us and as we see in the Gospel, when the owner of the vineyard pays all the laborers equally. To God, we are all working for the same reward no matter when we start working on it. Our reward is eternal life in the presence of God. He is ready to share his presence and love with all of us without exception. This abundant love is a scandal for us. God's love is so scandalous that his own Son died on a cross for us. God went through all that just for his love toward us.

The second one is: God responds to our needs, not to our merits. The laborers agreed to receive a denarius, which was the daily wage. It was what a person needed to keep his family fed for the day. So, the workers all would receive what they needed to keep their families safe and fed. The scandal of God's love for those who came to work earlier is that the ones who came last received the same. The workers who came early thought they would receive more for working more, but all received the same reward. They received what was promised to them. God is always ready to tend to our needs, based on his love for us and not own our merits. Understanding this requires hard spiritual work. Our human logic is always based on merits. We give prizes on people's merits. We praise those who do well and sometimes forget to praise those who need praise at that moment. We love those who deserve our love. The last laborer who came to work received great love from the landowner. He received what he needed to bring food to the table for his family. Imagine after the whole day waiting and wanting, he finally gets the opportunity to have what he needs. What a joyful moment.

Finally, let God be God. In life many times we want to keep God on our own terms. Isaiah reminds us that God's ways are higher than our ways, and God's thoughts higher than our thoughts. The owner of the vineyard has higher values than the workers. He wants to pay justly to all for what they need. He does not see merit, but out of his grace gives to all equally. This is hard for all of us to understand because many times we want God to act according to our own set of values. We want God to act according to our own merits. When we box God in our own ideas of God, we fail to see God's immense love and compassion for us all.
