Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y Paz a ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Saludos de Otoño a todos ustedes. Para ninguno de ustedes es un secreto que mi santo favorito es San Pablo Apóstol. Me encanta su constancia, su pasión, su compromiso y su capacidad para reconocer su propia debilidad. Este fin de semana leemos la carta de San Pablo a los Filipenses, el pasaje que creo que es el más hermoso de todos sus escritos. Un pasaje que uso a menudo en mi oración diaria para ayudarme a mantenerme firme. Cuando siento que me estoy desviando de guiado por mi propio orgullo o egoísmo, acudo a este texto y oro con él. Trabajo por ser del mismo sentir de Cristo que siendo hijo de Dios se humilló hasta morir en una cruz. Ruego al Espíritu Santo que me dé sabiduría para tener una integridad espiritual que coincida con la de Cristo: actuar según mis palabras.

La comunidad de Filipos es el grupo de personas más querido por Pablo. Son cariñosos y afectuosos con él. Pablo estableció una gran relación con ellos. Tanto es así, que la única iglesia de la que aceptaría apoyo monetario es la iglesia de Filipos. Y se asegura de hacérselo saber a las otras comunidades. Esto muestra cuánto los amaba Pablo y ellos lo aman. Sabía que no usarían su generosidad en su contra. Sabía que su amor era genuino y no estaba interesado en ningún beneficio especial del apóstol.

En el Capítulo 2, 1-11, encontramos algunas perlas escondidas para la Espiritualidad Cristiana. Pablo recibe noticias de que hay un conflicto dentro de la comunidad. Había cierta división y algunos miembros de la iglesia cayeron en el egoísmo y la vanagloria. La carta es un llamado a la unidad. Quiere que tengan la misma opinión que Cristo. Hacer todo por amor, compasión, misericordia y humildad. No hagáis nada por egoísmo o vanagloria, les dice. También se asegura de que su recomendación se base en Jesús, el Señor mismo. Inserta en su carta un pasaje que es conocido como el himno kenótico sobre Cristo. Cristo, que es el hijo de Dios, no se enorgulleció de eso, sino que se humilló hasta morir en una cruz. Se despojó de su orgullo como hijo de Dios y murió en la cruz para redimir a la humanidad. Qué manera tan maravillosa de invitar a la comunidad de Filipos a la unidad, la obediencia y la humildad. Este himno es un gran ejemplo de la humildad que todos los cristianos debemos seguir. Este himno expresa claramente el significado de la fe y la espiritualidad cristianas. Creo que ese es nuestro caminar espiritual. Como cristianos el tiempo que vivimos en esta tierra debemos emplearlo tratando de vaciarnos de todos los deseos humanos que nos alejan de la voluntad y el reino de Dios. Les invito a utilizar este himno como recurso para su vida de oración.

Creo que este pasaje nos ayudará a mantener una integridad espiritual ante Dios. Es decir, actuar según lo que profesamos como fieles. Esta integridad espiritual requiere purificarnos de falsas pretensiones, del falso sentido de compromiso. La integridad espiritual de Cristo que se muestra en el pasaje es que sus palabras coinciden con sus acciones en la vida. ¿Podemos decir eso sobre nosotros mismos? ¿Somos capaces de actuar con la misma mente de Cristo con compasión, amor y misericordia?

Thoughts from Father Juan . .

Grace and Peace to you my brothers and sisters in Christ:

Fall Greetings to all of you.

It is no secret to any of you that my favorite saint is Saint Paul the Apostle. I love his steadfastness, his passion, his commitment, and his ability to recognize his own weakness. This weekend we read from the letter of Saint Paul to the Philippians, what I think is the most beautiful passage of all his writings, a passage that I often use in my daily prayer to help me keep grounded. When I feel I am drifting away in my own pride or selfishness I come to this text, and I pray with it. I work on being of the same mind as Christ, who, being the son of God, humbled himself to die on a cross. I pray to the Holy Spirit for the wisdom to have a spiritual integrity that matches that of Christ—acting on my words.

The Philippian community was one of Paul's beloved groups of people. They were loving and caring with him. He established a great relationship with them--so much so, that the only church that he would accept monetary support from was the Philippian church. And he made sure to let the other communities know that. This shows how much Paul loved them and they loved him. He knew that they would not use their generosity against him. He knew that their love was genuine and not interested in any special benefits from the apostle.

In Chapter 2, 1-11, we find a few hidden pearls for Christian Spirituality. He has received news that there is some conflict within the community. There is some division, and some members of the church have fallen into selfishness and vainglory. The letter is a call to unity. He wants them to be of the same mind as Christ, doing everything out of love, compassion, mercy, and humility. Do nothing out of selfishness or vainglory--this is the recommendation he gives them. He also makes sure that his recommendation is grounded in Jesus, the Lord himself. He inserts in his letter a passage that came to be known as the kenotic hymn about Christ. Christ, who is the son of God, did not take pride in that, but rather humbled himself to die on a cross. Since he emptied himself of his pride, he was able to die on a cross and redeem humanity. What a wonderful way to invite the community in Philippi to unity, obedience, and humility. This hymn is a great example of the humility that all of us Christians must follow. This hymn clearly expresses the meaning of Christian faith and spirituality. I think that's our spiritual journey. As Christians we must spend the time we live on this earth trying to empty ourselves of all the human desires that lead us away from God's will and kingdom. I invite you to use this hymn as a resource for your prayer life.

I believe this passage will help us keep a spiritual integrity before God, which is, to act on what we profess as faithful. This spiritual integrity requires us to purify ourselves of false pretenses, a false sense of commitment. The spiritual integrity of Christ shown in the passage is that his words match his actions in life. Can we say the same about us? Are we able to act in the same mind of Christ with compassion, love, and mercy?
