Gracia y Paz a ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Esta semana les escribo desde Houston, Texas. Vine aquí para participar en la Conferencia Nacional del Ministerio Hispano. La Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de Estados Unidos aprobó un Plan de Ministerio Hispano de 10 años para la Iglesia Católica de Estados Unidos. Nuestro objetivo durante estos cuatro días llenos de reuniones es discutir el plan y encontrar formas de aplicarlo en nuestras diócesis. Un dato que nos dicen muchas encuestas es que el crecimiento de la Iglesia católica en Estados Unidos está liderado por los católicos hispanos. En nuestra propia realidad de Racine, de las 11 parroquias de la ciudad, San Patriciio, que alberga a la Comunidad Católica Hispana, es la parroquia que cada año celebra más bautismos, comuniones, confirmaciones y bodas. Esta es una realidad que los obispos de los Estados Unidos quieren reconocer y trabajar por una iglesia de inclusión e integración de aquellos de diversos orígenes culturales.

También me entristece ver lo que está sucediendo en Tierra Santa. Este no es un conflicto que esté en el otro lado del mundo. Algunos peregrinos de nuestra propia archidiócesis se encontraban en Tierra Santa cuando comenzó el conflicto. Sus vidas estaban en riesgo y gracias a Dios se encuentran bien y, en su camino, en casa. Un nutrido grupo de católicos de la ciudad de Racine planeaba visitar Tierra Santa y su viaje fue cancelado. Este conflicto a miles de kilómetros de distancia afecta a muchas personas cercanas a nosotros. Me gustaría invitar a todos ustedes, miembros de la Comunidad Católica en Central Racine, a: Una Hora Santa: La Familia de Cuatro enciende una vela por la Paz. La Hora Santa será este lunes 16 de octubre a las 6PM en Sacred Heart. Vengan y oremos por la paz en Tierra Santa, en el mundo y nuestra comunidad.

Este fin de semana leemos la parábola del banquete de bodas. Otra parábola más dirigida a los sumos sacerdotes y a los ancianos del pueblo sobre el Reino de Dios. Esta parábola aborda la identidad misma del pueblo de Dios y su comportamiento como hijos de Dios. Me gustaría presentarles tres afirmaciones para la reflexión:

1-Los esperados se ausentan y lo inesperados se presentan. Aquellos que se esperaba que participaran en la fiesta encontraron maneras de rechazar la invitación porque no tenían claras sus prioridades. Su arrogancia y egocentrismo los llevó a rechazar la posibilidad de participar en el banquete. En cambio, aquellos que no eran esperados, los marginados y los necesitados aprovecharon la oportunidad de ser parte del banquete. Su sencillez de vida les dio claridad para decidir qué era realmente importante para ellos.

2-No se puede dar por asumida la participación en el banquete. El invitado sin la prenda pensó que con solo estar allí era suficiente. No se preparó para el banquete. Ni siquiera respondió a la pregunta del Rey. Hay trabajo por hacer y poner de nuestra parte para participar en el banquete del Señor. Hay muchas veces en nuestras vidas que damos por sentado a los demás, el amor de Dios, las amistades, la familia, la fe y lo mínimo que pasa... Necesitamos que nos recuerden que cada mañana debemos trabajar para reconocer esas gracias y trabajar para preservarlas. Si no lo hacemos, corremos el riesgo, como el invitado sin vestidura, de quedar fuera y ser expulsados del banquete.



Thoughts from Father Juan . .

Grace and Peace to you my brothers and sisters in Christ:

This week I am writing to you from Houston, Texas. I came here to participate in the National Conference of Hispanic Ministry. The U.S. Conference of Catholic of Bishops approved a 10-year Hispanic Ministry Plan for the U.S. Catholic Church. Our goal during these four days full of meetings is to discuss the plan and find ways to apply it back home in our dioceses. A fact that many polls tell us is that the growth of the Catholic Church in the U.S. is led by Hispanic Catholics. In our own reality in Racine, out of the 11 parishes in the city, Saint Patrick's, which holds the Hispanic Catholic Community, is the parish that celebrates more baptisms, communions, confirmations and weddings every year. This is a reality that the Bishops of the U.S. want to recognize and work for: a church of inclusion and integration of those of diverse cultural background.

I am also saddened to see what is happening in the Holy Land. This is not a conflict that is on the other side of the world. Some pilgrims from our own archdiocese were in the Holy Land when the conflict started. Their lives were at risk, but thank God they are ok and on their way home. A large number of Catholics from the City of Racine were planning to visit the Holy Land, and their trip was cancelled. This conflict thousands of miles away affected many people close to us. I would like to invite all of you members of the Catholic Community in Central Racine to a Holy Hour: The Family of Four light a candle for Peace. The Holy Hour will be this Monday October 16, at 6PM at Sacred Heart. Come and pray for peace in the Holy Land, the world, and our community.

This weekend we read the parable of the wedding feast--yet another parable addressed to the chief priests and elders of the people regarding the Kingdom of God. This parable tackles the very identity of the people of God and their behavior as God's children. I would like to present you three statements for reflection:

1-The expected are absent and the unexpected are present. Those who were expected to participate in the feast found ways to decline the invitation because they did not have their priorities clear. Their arrogance and self-centeredness led them to decline the possibility to participate in the banquet. Instead, those who were not expected, the marginalized and the needy, jumped at the opportunity to be part of the banquet. Their simplicity of life gave them clarity to decide what was important for them.

2-Attendance at the banquet cannot be taken for granted. The guest without the garment thought that just being there was enough. He did not prepare himself for the banquet. He did not even respond to the King's question. There is work that needs to be done on our part to participate in the banquet of the Lord. There are many times in our own lives that we take for granted others, God's love, friendships, family, faith and the list goes on... We need to be reminded that every morning we must work on recognizing those graces and work on preserving them. If we do not do that, we run the risk, like the guest without the garment, of being left out and expelled from the banquet.

3-The proclamation of the Kingdom is a challenge to respond to God's invitation to participate in his life. Participation in God's Kingdom of love is not a convenient action. It is not always the most convenient thing to do, but sometimes requires deviating from our own desires. Those who were first invited to the banquet did not want to inconvenience themselves by changing their plans. They continued their own plans and ignored the invitation to participate in the joy of the banquet.
