Pensamientos del Padre Juan. . .

Gracia y paz a ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo, Feliz Día de Acción de Gracias a todos ustedes. Espero que lo hayan pasado muy bien con sus seres queridos. Recé a Dios en Acción de Gracias por todos ustedes. La misa que celebré el jueves fue en agradecimiento a Dios por todos ustedes y en acción de gracias por todos sus dones y talentos que traen a nuestra comunidad católica en esta maravillosa ciudad.

Este fin de semana celebramos la Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo Rey del Universo. Para nosotros, ciudadanos del siglo XXI y personas que vivimos en una República donde todos ejercemos el derecho de elegir a nuestros representantes y gobernantes, resulta difícil entender la analogía sociopolítica que se hace en la Solemnidad de hoy: Cristo Rey. No tenemos rey y por tanto esto está bastante alejado de nuestro contexto social. Ahora bien, debemos entender el contexto del origen de esta Solemnidad. Ocurre durante un período en el que muchos de los estados cristianos eran gobernados por reyes. Esta Solemnidad es un recordatorio para nosotros de que hay un solo Señor y Gobernante y ese es Nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Esta Solemnidad propone a Cristo como autoridad suprema sobre todas las cosas: espirituales y materiales. Una autoridad que está por encima de toda política. Esta es la Persona que seguimos, los políticos y gobernantes de nuestras naciones los elegimos, pero no los seguimos. Nuestra lealtad es a Cristo nuestro Señor. Esta comprensión tiene sus implicaciones en el orden y la justicia de nuestra sociedad.

Jesús es Rey. Entonces, me gustaría que exploremos lo que Jesús entiende por Reino. Las parábolas de Jesús retratan un Reino que es poderoso y puede crecer con la gracia de Dios. También retrata el Reino como una entidad acogedora capaz de acoger a todo tipo de criaturas. Jesús también presenta el Reino como algo de gran valor que cuando se encuentra se debe vender todo para adquirir el tesoro invaluable. Requiere un compromiso total de nuestra parte. También lo presenta como una búsqueda constante de la perfección en la presencia de Dios. Pero quizás la imagen más festiva del Reino de Jesús sea la del gran banquete al que todos estamos invitados. A este banquete estamos todos invitados, pero debemos venir preparados para entrar. En el evangelio de hoy vemos la elección que sucede al final de los tiempos para participar del Reino Eterno. En el evangelio vemos el juicio final en el que Cristo el Señor se sienta en su trono para separar a los que han vivido según el Reino de Dios aquí en la tierra de los que han conducido vidas que no son del Reino. Por lo tanto, el juicio es sobre la forma en que vivimos los valores del Reino, que es atender a los más necesitados.

La solemnidad de Cristo Rey es una invitación a no considerar a ninguna otra persona sino a Jesucristo como Señor de todo lo creado. Entonces, seguir una vida que es del Reino, que es poderosa en Gracia, acogedora, requiere compromiso total y celebra la vida en todos los niveles. Mientras celebramos la solemnidad de este fin de semana, recordemos renovar nuestra lealtad a nuestro Señor Jesucristo para trabajar por el descubrimiento del Reino de Dios en nuestras vidas, familias y comunidad.

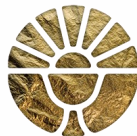

Thoughts from Father Juan....

Grace and Peace to you my brothers and sisters in Christ,

Happy Thanksgiving to all of you. I hope you have had a great time with your loved ones. I prayed to God on Thanksgiving for all of you. The Mass I celebrated on Thursday was in gratitude to God for all of you and in thanksgiving for all your gifts and talents that you bring to our Catholic community in this wonderful city.

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King of the Universe. For us citizens of the 21st century and people who live in a republic where we all exercise the right to choose our representatives and rulers, it is difficult to understand the sociopolitical analogy that is made in today's Solemnity: Christ the King. We do not have a king and therefore this is quite far removed from our social context. Now, we must understand the context of the origin of this Solemnity. It occurred during a period where many of the Christian states were ruled by kings. This Solemnity is a reminder for us that there is only one Lord and Ruler and that's Our Lord Jesus Christ. This Solemnity proposes Christ as the ultimate authority over all things: spiritual and material, an authority that is above all politics. This is the Person we follow; we elect the politicians and rulers of our nations, but do not follow them. Our allegiance is to our Lord Jesus Christ. This understanding has its implication in the order and justice of our society.

Jesus is King. So, I would like us to explore what Jesus understands by "Kingdom". Jesus' parables portray a Kingdom that is powerful and can grow with God's grace. He also portrays the Kingdom as a welcoming entity able to host all kinds of creatures. Jesus also presents the Kingdom as something of such great value that, when it is found, everything must be sold to acquire the priceless treasure. It requires full commitment on our part. He also presents it as a constant search for perfection in God's presence. But maybe the most festive image of Jesus' Kingdom is that of a great banquet to which we are all invited. This banquet we are all invited to, but we must come prepared to enter. In today's Gospel, we see the selection that happens at the end of times for participating in the Eternal Kingdom. In the Gospel we see the final judgement in which Christ the Lord sits on his throne to separate those who have lived according to God's Reign here on earth from those who have conducted lives that are not of the Kingdom. Hence, the judgement is on the way we live the Kingdom values, which is to tend for those in greater need.

The Solemnity of Christ the King is an invitation to regard no other person but Jesus Christ as Lord over all that has been created and then, to follow a life that is of the Kingdom, which is powerful in Grace, welcoming, requires total commitment, and celebrates life at all levels. As we celebrate this weekend's Solemnity, let us remember to renew our allegiance to our Lord Jesus Christ, to work for the uncovering of God's Kingdom amid our lives, families, and community.

SENTIMENTS FOR SEMINARIANS
