

Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y Paz a ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas:

Comenzamos nuestro peregrinar del Tiempo Ordinario con el Evangelio de Marcos. Este es el evangelio que leeremos durante este año litúrgico. Jesús comenzó su ministerio con urgencia: "El tiempo se ha cumplido. El reinado de Dios está cerca. Arrepiéntanse y crean en el evangelio". No hay mensaje más explícito que este.

Analicemos el mensaje contenido en esta declaración. Se ha cumplido el tiempo, esta sensación de que ya no hay espera. Lo que se suponía que iba a suceder, debe suceder ahora. No hay espera. Todo está listo y preparado para el reinado de Dios. Juan el Bautista preparó el camino. Juan destacó a Jesús entre la multitud. Dios Padre afirmó su presencia en el Bautismo, por lo que la nueva era ha comenzado. La declaración respira urgencia.

El Reino de Dios está cerca. Usé reinar porque transmite más el significado de la palabra griega que se usa allí. Jesús predica la venida dinámica del Reino de Dios, no como una estructura monolítica sino como una fuerza dinámica que anima a todos aquellos que quieren ser parte de ella. El Reino de Dios está sucediendo; cualquiera puede unirse a este movimiento. Jesús lidera el movimiento con su vida y ejemplo, presentando los valores de este reinado dinámico que ha entrado en la realidad humana.

Pero esta realidad acogedora, activa y para todos exige arrepentimiento. Requiere que uno dé un giro aparente en su vida para encarnar plenamente el reino de Dios. Esto requiere un compromiso renovado con la fe. No se puede continuar con el mismo estilo de vida. Debe cambiar. La belleza del reino de Dios requiere embellecer el corazón y la vida. El evangelio es una buena noticia. Entonces, Jesús invita al pueblo a creer en esta buena noticia: el tiempo se ha cumplido, el reino de Dios ha entrado en nuestras vidas y se nos ofrece una vida nueva en Dios si decidimos seguirlo.

Por supuesto, este mensaje crecerá más adelante a medida que veamos a Jesús viviendo este reino de Dios en sus acciones y palabras. Jesús, entonces, llama a sus apóstoles. El llamado nos recuerda que el reino de Dios es un evento comunitario y muchos pueden participar en él y compartirlo con el mundo. Estos discípulos luego se convierten en heraldos de la Buena Nueva para los demás. Jesús los enviará a predicar su mensaje transformador y urgente delante de él.

Al embarcarnos en este tiempo ordinario, revisemos nuestras tendencias dilatorias que se interponen en el camino de vivir, recibir y creer en las buenas nuevas con un sentido de urgencia. En el Señor no hay procrastinación. Él quiere que nos arrepintamos y creamos. Nos llama a seguirlo, dejando todo atrás y acercándonos a él.



Thoughts from Father Juan

Grace and Peace to you, my brothers and sisters:

We begin our Ordinary Time journey with the Gospel of Mark. This is the Gospel we will be reading during this liturgical year. Jesus began his ministry with urgency: "This is the time of fulfillment. The reign of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel". There is no more explicit message than this one.

Let us parse the message contained in this statement. The time is ful-filled; this is the sense that there is no more waiting. What was supposed to happen must happen now. There is no waiting. Everything is ready and set for God's reign. John the Baptist prepared the way. John singled Jesus out in the crowd. God, the Father, affirmed his presence in the Baptism, so the new age has begun. The statement breathes urgency.

The Reign of God is at hand. I used "reign" because that better conveys the meaning of the Greek word used there. Jesus preaches the dynamic coming of the Kingdom of God, not as a monolithic structure but as a dynamic force that encourages all those who want to be part of it. The Reign of God is happening; anyone can join this movement. Jesus leads the movement with his life and example, presenting the values of this dynamic reign that has entered human reality.

But this reality that is welcoming, active, and for all *requires repentance*. It requires one to make an apparent turn in their lives to embody God's reign fully. This requires a renewed commitment to faith. One cannot continue the same lifestyle. It must change. The beauty of God's reign requires beautifying one's heart and life. "Gospel" means "good news". So, Jesus invites the people *to believe in this good news*: the time is fulfilled, God's reign has entered our lives, and we are offered a new life in God--if we decide to follow.

Of course, this message will grow later, as we see Jesus living out this reign of God in his actions and words. Jesus, then, calls his apostles. The calling reminds us that God's reign is a community event, and many can partake in it, sharing it with the world. These disciples then become the heralds of the good news to others. Jesus will send them to preach his transformative and urgent message ahead of him.

As we embark on this ordinary time, let us review our procrastinating tendencies that get in the way of living, receiving, and believing in the good news with a sense of urgency. In the Lord, there is no procrastinating. He wants us to repent and believe. He calls us to follow, leaving everything behind and walking closer to him.
