

Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y Paz a ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas:

La segunda lectura de esta semana es parte de la Carta de San Pablo a los Corintios capítulo 9. En este capítulo, Pablo analiza detalladamente su autoridad como apóstol ya que, en Corinto, su autoridad como apóstol fue cuestionada. El pasaje que leemos este domingo tiene algunos de mis pasajes favoritos de Pablo. "Ay de mí si no predico el Evangelio". Pablo entiende el mandato del Señor como apóstol de predicar la Buena Nueva a todos. Siente que predicar el evangelio es un mandato del que no puede escapar ni posponer. Con Pablo, siempre hay un sentido de urgencia e inmediatez en todo lo que hace; supongo que por eso me gusta tanto San Pablo. Trabajó su apostolado como si no hubiera mañana. Cuando surgieron obstáculos en Corinto al cuestionar su apostolado. no dejó de predicar el evangelio de Cristo sino que aumentó su pasión. Los obstáculos para Pablo se convierten en combustible para su ministerio y pasión. Parece que a Pablo le gustaban los desafíos y destacó cuando surgieron.

La segunda parte de este pasaje del fin de semana también contiene otro hermoso versículo: "A todos me he hecho todo, para salvar al menos a algunos". Pablo entiende su ministerio como un servicio que reguiere empatía. Pablo es tan versátil que está dispuesto a empatizar con todos los que conoce para predicarles el evangelio. Paul encuentra maneras de llegar al corazón de todos los que encuentra en su camino. La mayor parte de su ministerio se desarrolló en su trabajo como fabricante de tiendas de campaña. Allí encuentra maneras de conocer gente y convertirla en seguidores de Cristo. Su pasión por el evangelio lo hace creativo al presentar el mensaje a quienes encuentra para hacerlos discípulos de Cristo. La urgencia de la predicación y su sentido de empatía por todos proporcionaron la combinación perfecta para presentar el Evangelio de Jesús a los gentiles. Creo que nosotros, como iglesia, necesitamos algo de la creatividad y la pasión de Pablo para evangeli-

Como discípulos de Cristo, debemos seguir el gran mandamiento: "Id y haced discípulos a todo el mundo". Es necesario que lo hagamos. Entonces, aguí es donde el ejemplo de Pablo entra en juego para que reflexionemos durante este fin de semana: ¿Cuán obligados nos sentimos a predicar a Cristo a otros? ¿Cuáles son las maneras en que podemos empatizar con los demás para poder compartir a Cristo con ellos? Para Pablo, su estrategia de evangelización siempre se adaptó a las personas a las que predicaba. Se adaptó a las necesidades de las personas a las que predicaba y encontró formas de involucrarlas. Como discípulos. debemos pensar en diferentes formas de involucrar a los demás. Existe un plan de evangelización para cada persona que conocemos para que conozca más del Señor y crezca en su peregrinar espiritual.

Thoughts from Father Juan . . .

Grace and Peace to you, my brothers and sisters:

This week's second reading is part of the Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians chapter 9. In this chapter, Paul discusses his authority as an apostle at length since, in Corinth, his authority as an apostle was guestioned. The passage we read this Sunday has some of my favorite passages from Paul:

"Woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel." Paul understands his mandate from the Lord as an apostle to preach the Good News to all. He feels that preaching the Gospel is a mandate he cannot escape or postpone. With Paul, there is always a sense of urgency and immediacy in all he does; I guess that's why I like Paul so much. He carried out his apostleship like there was no tomorrow. When obstacles arose in Corinth, with questions about his apostleship, he did not stop preaching the Gospel of Christ but instead increased his passion. Obstacles for Paul become fuel for his ministry and passion. It seems Paul liked challenges, and he excelled when challenges arose.

The second part of this weekend passage also contains another beautiful verse: "I have become all things to all, to save at least some." Paul understands his ministry as a service that requires empathy. Paul is so versatile that he is willing to empathize with everyone he meets to preach the Gospel to them. Paul finds ways to reach the hearts of all he finds in his way. The bulk of his ministry happened in his job as a tent maker. There, he found ways to meet people and convert them into followers of Christ. His passion for the Gospel made him creative in presenting the message to those he found, to make them disciples of Christ. The urgency of preaching and his sense of empathy for all provided the perfect combination to present the Gospel of Jesus to the Gentiles. I believe we, as church, need some of Paul's creativity and passion to evangelize.

We all look in the pews around us and see that one day in the past, they used to be full, but now they are not. As disciples of Christ, we are to follow the great command: "Go and make disciples of all the world." There is a need for us to do so. I want to share a statistic that may help us see the reality of our church in Racine. In Racine, there are 17000 Catholics, and 3980 participate in the weekend Masses held within the 12 parishes in the deanery. There are 32 weekend masses within those 12 parishes, making an average of 124 people per Mass. As you know, when we look around in some of our Masses, sometimes there are fewer people than that. This is our reality.

So, here is where Paul's example comes in for us to reflect during this weekend: How compelled to preach Christ to others do we feel? What are the ways that we can empathize with others so that we can share Christ with them? For Paul, his evangelization strategy was always tailored to the people he was preaching to. He adjusted to the needs of the people he was preaching to and found ways to engage them. We must, as disciples, think about different ways to engage others. There is an evangelization plan for each person we meet, so that they get to learn more about the Lord and grow in the spiritual journey.
