Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y paz a ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas.

Espero que hayan tenido un excelente Cuatro de Julio. Espero que se hayan tomado un momento para reflexionar sobre el maravilloso don de la libertad, una libertad basada en el amor de Dios por todos nosotros. Las lecturas de este domingo ofrecen un poderoso mensaje de misión, paz y alegría, temas muy oportunos ahora que acabamos de celebrar el Día de la Independencia. En el Evangelio, Jesús envía a setenta y dos discípulos de dos en dos, instruyéndolos a llevar la paz a cada hogar que visiten y a proclamar que «el reino de Dios está cerca». Deben viajar ligeros de equipaje, confiando no en la seguridad material, sino en la hospitalidad de los demás y en el poder de Dios.

Esta misión no es solo para los primeros discípulos, es también para nosotros. Estamos llamados a ser portadores de paz en un mundo que a menudo se siente dividido y ansioso. Esto nos conmueve, ya que el mundo se encuentra en una situación muy precaria. La tensión política mundial es intensa. Ustedes y yo necesitamos ser personas de paz y esperanza. Este debería ser el centro de nuestras conversaciones diarias al hablar unos con otros, brindando paz y esperanza. Jesús nos recuerda que la verdadera alegría no proviene del éxito ni del reconocimiento, sino de saber que nuestros nombres están escritos en el cielo. Nuestra identidad como discípulos se basa en el amor de Dios, no en los logros mundanos. Lo que nos hace especiales es el amor de Dios, no nuestro éxito.

La primera lectura, de Isaías, ofrece una hermosa imagen de Jerusalén como una madre que cuida y consuela a sus hijos. Es un recordatorio de que el cuidado de Dios es tierno y abundante, y que estamos llamados a ser instrumentos de ese mismo consuelo y sanación en nuestras comunidades. Nosotros, la Iglesia, estamos llamados a nutrir al mundo con nuestro amoroso cuidado y compasión. Nosotros, la Iglesia, debemos brindar consuelo a quienes están desesperados y temerosos.

Al celebrar el 4 de julio el viernes pasado, damos gracias por las libertades que disfrutamos y recordamos los sacrificios hechos para asegurarlas. Pero también reflexionamos sobre lo que significa vivir como personas libres. La libertad cristiana no se trata de hacer lo que queramos, sino de ser libres para amar, servir y construir una sociedad más justa y compasiva.

En tiempos en que nuestra nación sigue luchando contra la división y la injusticia, el Evangelio de hoy nos reta a ser pacificadores, a viajar ligeros y a confiar en la providencia de Dios. Así como los discípulos regresaron gozosos, nosotros también podemos encontrar alegría al vivir nuestra fe con valentía y humildad. Los invito a elegir la alegría en sus vidas. Muchos momentos y situaciones pueden llevarnos a la desesperación, pero vivir una vida alegre es una decisión que todos tenemos el poder de tomar, porque nuestra alegría está arraigada en Cristo.

Que este domingo nos inspire a ser fieles testigos de la paz de Cristo, y que nuestra celebración del Día de la Independencia renueve nuestro compromiso con los valores de la justicia, la misericordia y la unidad.



Thoughts from Father Juan . . .

Grace and Peace to you, my brothers and sisters,

I hope you have had a great Fourth of July. I hope you have taken a moment to reflect on the wonderful gift of freedom—a freedom based on God's love for all of us. This Sunday's readings offer a powerful message of mission, peace, and joy—timely themes as we just celebrated Independence Day. In the Gospel, Jesus sends out seventy-two disciples in pairs, instructing them to bring peace to every home they enter and to proclaim that “the kingdom of God is at hand.” They are to travel lightly, relying not on material security but on the hospitality of others and the power of God.

This mission is not just for the early disciples—it is for us, too. We are called to be bearers of peace in a world that often feels divided and anxious. This resonates with us as the world is in a very precarious situation. Political tensions worldwide are high. You and I need to be people of peace and hope. This should be the core of our daily conversations when we talk to each other, bringing peace and hope. Jesus reminds us that true joy does not come from success or recognition, but from knowing that our names are written in heaven. Our identity as disciples is rooted in God's love, not in worldly achievements. What makes us special is the love of God, not our success.

The first reading, from Isaiah, offers a beautiful image of Jerusalem as a nurturing mother, comforting her children. It's a reminder that God's care is tender and abundant, and that we are called to be instruments of that same comfort and healing in our communities. We, the Church, are called to nurture the world with our loving care and compassion. We, the Church, must bring comfort to those who are in despair and fear.

As we celebrated the Fourth of July this past Friday, we give thanks for the freedoms we enjoy and remember the sacrifices made to secure them. But we also reflect on what it means to live as free people. Christian freedom is not about doing whatever we please—it is about being free to love, to serve, and to build a more just and compassionate society.

In a time when our nation continues to wrestle with division and injustice, today's Gospel challenges us to go out as peacemakers, to travel light, and to trust in God's providence. Just as the disciples returned rejoicing, we too can find joy in living out our faith with courage and humility. I invite you to choose joy in your lives. Many moments and situations may lead us to despair, but living a joyful life is a decision we all have the power to make, because our joy is rooted in Christ.

May this Sunday inspire us to be faithful witnesses of Christ's peace, and may our celebration of Independence Day renew our commitment to the values of justice, mercy, and unity.
