Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y paz a ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas.

«Vayan y hagan lo mismo». Esta es la invitación que el Señor nos hace este fin de semana. El Evangelio de este domingo presenta una de las parábolas más queridas y desafiantes de Jesús: la del Buen Samaritano. En respuesta a la pregunta de un abogado: “¿Quién es mi prójimo?”, Jesús cuenta una historia que transforma las expectativas y nos invita a repensar radicalmente el amor, la misericordia y el discipulado. El prójimo se convierte en la persona que actúa con bondad. Estamos llamados a ser prójimos de los demás. Este es un llamado a vivir nuestra fe en acción.

En el centro de la parábola está un hombre golpeado y medio muerto en el camino de Jerusalén a Jericó. Dos figuras religiosas, un sacerdote y un levita, pasan sin ayudarlo. Pero un samaritano, considerado un extraño e incluso un enemigo por el público judío de Jesús, se detiene, cura las heridas del hombre y se asegura de que lo cuide. Este hombre se convierte en el prójimo del hombre medio muerto. La compasión de su corazón lo impulsa a actuar. ¿Tenemos nosotros esa clase de compasión en nuestros corazones?

Esta historia no se trata solo de bondad; se trata de una compasión que rompe fronteras. El samaritano ve al hombre herido no como un extraño ni una carga, sino como un ser humano necesitado de ayuda. Sus acciones encarnan la esencia misma del Evangelio: la misericordia que trasciende las divisiones sociales, religiosas y étnicas. Esto se basa en uno de los temas de mi homilía de la semana pasada, en el que se nos llama y se nos desafía a ver a todos como imagen y semejanza de Dios. Si veo a mi prójimo así, por supuesto, haré lo que sea necesario para ayudarlo. Este sentimiento es el que encarna el samaritano al ayudar al hombre golpeado.

Jesús termina la parábola con un mandato: «**Ve y haz tú lo mismo**». Es un llamado no solo a admirar la bondad del samaritano, sino a imitarla. Se nos invita a preguntarnos: ¿Quiénes son los «heridos» en el camino de nuestra vida? ¿Qué prejuicios o miedos nos impiden ayudar? ¿Cómo podemos hacernos prójimos de quienes lo necesitan, incluso cuando resulta inconveniente o incómodo?

Esta semana, los invito a encontrar maneras de ser buenos samaritanos en nuestras familias, comunidades y en el mundo. Que no solo veamos el sufrimiento, sino que respondamos a él con valentía y amor. Y que nuestros corazones estén abiertos a la gracia que nos permite **«ir y hacer lo mismo.»**

Quiero añadir una nota de gratitud a quienes se ofrecieron como voluntarios y trabajaron arduamente para hacer realidad el festival de Santa Lucía. ¡Qué grupo de personas tan hermoso y comprometido! Gracias también a quienes vinieron y participaron en el festival. La comida, la música y la camaradería fueron simplemente perfectas.

Thoughts from Father Juan . . .

Grace and Peace to you, my brothers and sisters,

“Go and do likewise”. This is the invitation that the Lord makes to us this weekend. This Sunday’s Gospel presents one of the most beloved and challenging parables of Jesus: The Parable of the Good Samaritan. In response to a lawyer’s question, “Who is my neighbor?”, Jesus tells a story that flips expectations and invites us into a radical rethinking of love, mercy, and discipleship. The neighbor becomes the person who acts with kindness. We are called to become neighbors to others. This is a call to live our faith in action.

At the heart of the parable is a man left beaten and half-dead on the road from Jerusalem to Jericho. Two religious figures, a priest and a Levite, pass by without helping. But a Samaritan, someone considered an outsider and even an enemy by Jesus’ Jewish audience, stops, tends to the man’s wounds, and ensures his care. This man becomes the neighbor to the half-dead man. The compassion in his heart moves him to act. Do we have that sort of compassion in our hearts?

This story is not just about kindness; it’s about boundary-breaking compassion. The Samaritan sees the wounded man not as a stranger or a burden, but as a fellow human being in need of help. His actions embody the very heart of the Gospel: mercy that transcends social, religious, and ethnic divisions. This builds on one of the themes from my homily last week, in which we are called and challenged to see everyone as the image and likeness of God. If I see my fellow neighbor that way, of course, I will do whatever it takes to help them. This sentiment is what the Samaritan man embodies by assisting the beaten man.

Jesus ends the parable with a command: **“Go and do likewise.”** It’s a call not just to admire the Samaritan’s goodness, but to imitate it. We are invited to ask ourselves: Who are the “wounded” on the roads of our lives? What prejudices or fears keep us from stopping to help? How can we become neighbors to those in need, even when it’s inconvenient or uncomfortable?

This week, I invite you to find ways to be Good Samaritans in our families, communities, and world. May we not only see suffering but respond to it with courage and love. And may our hearts be open to the grace that enables us to **“go and do likewise.”**

I want to add a note of gratitude to those who volunteered and worked hard to make the Saint Lucy’s festival a reality. What a beautiful and committed group of people. Thank you also to those who came and participated in the festival. The food, the music, and the camaraderie were just perfect.
