Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y paz a ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas.

El domingo pasado, finalizamos la temporada de festivales de verano en nuestra comunidad católica de Racine. Los festivales de Santa Lucía y San Patricio fueron un éxito. Este éxito se mide por la alegría y el gran compromiso de tantos voluntarios que hicieron posible los festivales. Estoy profundamente agradecido a quienes trabajaron arduamente para que los festivales se hicieran realidad. Apreciamos su arduo trabajo. Por favor, si ven a un voluntario hoy, denle las GRACIAS.

Las lecturas de este domingo nos llaman a una actitud de vigilancia y preparación, arraigada en una fe profunda. El Evangelio presenta una imagen impactante: el Señor vendrá como ladrón en la noche. A primera vista, esto podría parecer inquietante, pero en realidad es una metáfora profundamente hermosa. Habla del misterio y la ternura del acercamiento de Dios: silencioso, inesperado y profundamente personal. Dios siempre está listo para sorprendernos. La pregunta es: estamos preparados para dejar que Dios nos sorprenda? Jesús les dice a sus discípulos: «Cifñanse los lomos y enciendan sus lámparas», instándolos a ser como siervos que esperan el regreso de su señor. Esto no es un llamado al miedo, sino a una alegre anticipación. El Señor desea encontrarnos despiertos, no solo físicamente, sino espiritualmente alertas, con corazones abiertos y vidas alineadas con su voluntad. La fe, entonces, no es una creencia pasiva, sino una confianza activa, una disposición que moldea nuestra vida diaria. ¿Cómo trabajamos diariamente en nuestra alegre anticipación para encontrarnos con el Señor en cada momento de nuestras vidas?

La primera lectura del Libro de la Sabiduría recuerda la noche de Pascua, cuando la liberación de Dios llegó repentina y poderosamente. El pueblo de Israel estaba preparado, confiando en las promesas de Dios. Su preparación no se basaba en la certeza del tiempo, sino en la certeza de la fidelidad de Dios. La Carta a los Hebreos profundiza en este tema, ofreciendo a Abraham como modelo de fe. Partió «sin saber adónde iba», confiando en una promesa que aún no podía ver. Su vida fue una peregrinación, un camino de preparación, siempre en movimiento hacia el cumplimiento de la palabra de Dios. Abraham y el pueblo de Israel confiaron profundamente en las promesas que Dios les había hecho y caminaron con esperanza, sabiendo que el Señor estaba allí para cumplir lo que había prometido.

Estamos llamados a vivir como si el Señor pudiera venir en cualquier momento, no por ansiedad, sino por amor. La imagen del ladrón en la noche nos recuerda que la gracia de Dios a menudo irrumpe en nuestras vidas de maneras inesperadas. Él no viene a robar, sino a sorprendernos con su misericordia, a despertarnos a su presencia y a acercarnos a una comunión más profunda.

Seamos, pues, vigilantes, no distraídos por el ruido del mundo, sino atentos a la silenciosa voz del Espíritu. Que nuestras lámparas se enciendan con fe, nuestros corazones se abran a la esperanza y nuestras vidas estén listas para recibir al Señor, cuando y como él decida venir a nuestras vidas.

In the month of July, 309 people came to the **SVdP food pantry** door & we fed 964 people including 388 children. We were open for 15 days and distributed 551 prepared bags of non-perishable food items.

Adding frozen food, dairy products and other non-perishable items the total weight of items distributed this month was 18,867 pounds.

Items needed: regular size cans of canned Chili, canned meat, Mac n' Cheese, Pasta Sides, spaghetti, 28 ounce jars of peanut butter, Chef Boyardee (no canned spaghetti), and bagged noodles.

Thoughts from Father Juan . . .

Grace and Peace to you my brothers and sisters,

Last Sunday, we finished the summer season of festivals within our Catholic Community in Racine. Saint Lucy's and Saint Patrick's festivals were both successful. This success is measured in the joy and hard commitment of so many volunteers who made the festivals possible. I am deeply grateful to those who worked hard to make the festivals a reality. We appreciate your hard work. Please, if you see a volunteer today, say THANK YOU.

This Sunday's readings call us to a posture of watchful readiness, rooted in deep faith. The Gospel presents a striking image: the Lord will come like a thief in the night. At first glance, this might seem unsettling, but it is, in fact, a profoundly beautiful metaphor. It speaks to the mystery and tenderness of God's approach: quiet, unexpected, and deeply personal. God is always ready to surprise us. The question is, are we prepared to let God surprise us?

Jesus tells his disciples, "Gird your loins and light your lamps," urging them to be like servants awaiting their master's return. This is not a call to fear, but to joyful anticipation. The Lord desires to find us awake, not merely physically, but spiritually alert, hearts open, and lives aligned with his will. Faith, then, is not passive belief but active trust, a readiness that shapes how we live each day. How are we working daily on our joyful anticipation to meet the Lord at all moments of our lives?

The first reading from the Book of Wisdom recalls the night of the Passover, when God's deliverance came suddenly and powerfully. The people of Israel were prepared, trusting in the promises of God. Their readiness was not based on certainty of timing, but on certainty of God's faithfulness. The Letter to the Hebrews deepens this theme, offering Abraham as a model of faith. He set out "not knowing where he was going," trusting in a promise he could not yet see. His life was a pilgrimage, a journey of readiness, always moving toward the fulfillment of God's word. Abraham and the people of Israel trusted profoundly in the promises of God to them, and they walked in hope, knowing that the Lord was there to fulfill what he had promised.

We are called to live as if the Lord might come at any moment, not out of anxiety, but out of love. The image of the thief in the night reminds us that God's grace often breaks into our lives in ways we do not expect. He comes not to steal, but to surprise us with mercy, to awaken us to his presence, and to draw us deeper into communion.

Let us then be vigilant, not distracted by the world's noise, but attentive to the quiet stirrings of the Spirit. May our lamps be lit with faith, our hearts open with hope, and our lives ready to welcome the Lord, whenever and however he chooses to come to our lives.
