Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y paz a ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas.

El 14 de septiembre, la Iglesia celebra la Fiesta de la Exaltación de la Santa Cruz, un día que nos invita a contemplar la Cruz no como símbolo de derrota, sino como el signo supremo del amor victorioso de Dios. Este año, el 14 de septiembre cae en domingo, por lo que celebramos la fiesta este fin de semana. Esta es la paradoja cristiana: el instrumento del sufrimiento, la cruz, se convierte en trono de gloria, y la muerte en puerta de entrada a la vida. Sabemos que, tras el sufrimiento del Viernes Santo, celebramos la Resurrección el Domingo de Pascua. El sufrimiento y la muerte no son el fin, sino la puerta de entrada a la plenitud de la vida.

En el corazón de esta fiesta se encuentra el misterio del amor divino, un amor tan profundo que abraza el sufrimiento por el ser amado. En Cristo crucificado, vemos la profundidad del amor de Dios por la humanidad, un amor que no rehúye el dolor, el rechazo ni el sacrificio. "Tanto amó Dios al mundo que dio a su Hijo único..." (Juan 3:16). La Cruz es la prueba visible de ese don.

Pero esta fiesta no se trata solo de lo que Cristo hizo; también es una llamada a imitar su amor. El amor, si es verdadero, siempre implica sacrificio. Amar como Cristo ama significa llevar nuestras propias cruces: las cargas diarias, las abnegaciones, el perdón que ofrecemos incluso cuando duele, la paciencia que mostramos cuando estamos cansados y la valentía de defender la verdad cuando es impopular.

La Cruz nos enseña que amar no siempre es fácil, pero siempre vale la pena. Es en la entrega de nosotros mismos, a veces en pequeñas cosas ocultas, a veces en grandes actos heroicos, que participamos en la obra redentora de Cristo. Este es el camino a la santidad. Abrazamos la Cruz no como un castigo, sino como un camino hacia una unión más profunda con Dios y un mayor amor al prójimo.

Así que hoy, al exaltar la Cruz, no solo la veneremos con nuestros labios, sino también abracémosla con nuestra vida. Pidamos la gracia de amar con sacrificio, dar con generosidad y confiar en que en cada cruz que llevamos, el amor de Dios obra, transformando el sufrimiento en salvación y la muerte en resurrección.

Cuando me convertí en su párroco, les compartí que tenemos varias prioridades. Una de ellas es el trabajo en los hogares de ancianos y centros de atención. Nuestro equipo de diáconos ha estado trabajando arduamente junto con el Padre Michael para establecer un ministerio que sirva a nuestros hermanos y hermanas. También contamos con un gran grupo de líderes laicos que sirven en esos centros. Cada mes, se celebran 23 servicios de comunión en 11 centros del área de Racine. Atendemos a 135 católicos que viven en esos centros. Esto significa que estos hermanos y hermanas pueden recibir el Cuerpo de Cristo en su situación actual. Me alegra saber que en el área de Racine, nuestros familiares católicos son atendidos y no olvidados. Mi sueño es que podamos seguir expandiendo ese ministerio y extender esa atención a quienes están confinados en sus hogares. Sé que muchos de ustedes tienen familiares y seres queridos que podrían beneficiarse del amor y el cuidado de su familia en Cristo, la Iglesia. Oremos por todos nosotros para que crezcamos en amor y cuidado mutuo.

Thoughts from Father Juan . . .

Grace and Peace to you, my brothers and sisters

On September 14th, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, a day that invites us to gaze upon the Cross not as a symbol of defeat, but as the ultimate sign of God's victorious love. This year, September 14th falls on a Sunday, and hence we celebrate the feast on this weekend. This is the Christian paradox: the instrument of suffering, the cross, becomes the throne of glory, and death becomes the gateway to life. We know that after the suffering of Good Friday, we celebrate the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. Suffering and death are not the end but the gateway to fullness of life.

At the heart of this feast is the mystery of divine love, a love so profound that it embraces suffering for the sake of the beloved. In Christ crucified, we see the depth of God's love for humanity, a love that does not shy away from pain, rejection, or sacrifice. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son..." (John 3:16). The Cross is the visible proof of that gift.

But this feast is not only about what Christ has done; it is also a call to imitate his love. Love, if it is true, always involves sacrifice. To love as Christ loves means to carry our own crosses: the daily burdens, the acts of self-denial, the forgiveness we offer even when it hurts, the patience we extend when we are tired, and the courage to stand for truth when it is unpopular.

The Cross teaches us that love is not always easy, but it is always worth it. It is in the giving of ourselves, sometimes in small hidden ways, sometimes in great heroic acts, that we participate in the redemptive work of Christ. This is the way to holiness. We embrace the Cross not as a punishment, but as a path to more profound union with God and greater love for others.

So today, as we exalt the Cross, let us not only venerate it with our lips but also embrace it with our lives. Let us ask for the grace to love sacrificially, to give generously, and to trust that in every cross we carry, God's love is at work, transforming suffering into salvation, and death into resurrection.

When I became your pastor, I shared that we have several priorities. One of them was the work in the Nursing Homes and Care Facilities. Our team of deacons has been working hard alongside Fr. Michael to establish a ministry that serves our brothers and sisters. We also have a great group of lay leaders who serve in those facilities. Each month, there are 23 communion services in 11 facilities in the Racine area. We care for 135 Catholics living in those facilities. This means these brothers and sisters get to receive the Body of Christ in their current situation. This brings me joy to know that in the Racine area, our Catholic family members are cared for and not forgotten. My dream is that we can continue to grow that ministry and expand that care to those who are homebound. I know many of you may have family members and loved ones who may benefit from the love and care of their family in Christ, the Church. Let us pray for all of us that we can grow in love and care for one another.


