Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y paz, mis hermanos y hermanas,

Al acercarnos al final del año litúrgico, las lecturas del Trigésimo Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario nos invitan a reflexionar sobre lo que verdaderamente perdura. Estas lecturas nos ayudan a meditar sobre el fin de los tiempos. ¿Qué perdurará realmente en la vida? En su carta a los Tesalonicenses, Pablo nos ofrece un tema poderoso: **la imitación**. Escribe no buscando honores ni prestigio, sino como modelo de fe vida con sencillez y perseverancia. Pablo recuerda a su comunidad que la vida cristiana no se trata de grandes ostentación, sino de encarnar el Evangelio en las acciones cotidianas. Sus palabras nos interpelan: **¿A quién imitamos?** Nuestra cultura a menudo exalta la riqueza, el estatus y el éxito externo, pero Pablo nos señala la humildad y el servicio a semejanza de Cristo.

En el sentido cristiano, la imitación no es simplemente copiar; es un proceso transformador. El mismo Pablo imita a Cristo y, al hacerlo, se convierte en un ejemplo vivo para los demás. Esta cadena de imitación, de Cristo a Pablo y de Pablo a la comunidad, revela que la fe es tanto relacional como encarnacional. Aprendemos a seguir a Cristo observando y caminando con aquellos que viven auténticamente en él. Pablo, en sus cartas, anima a las comunidades a imitarlo como él imita a Cristo. Quiere ser el modelo de discipulado para la comunidad.

El Evangelio complementa este mensaje al dirigir nuestra mirada de lo que asombra a los ojos a lo que fundamenta el alma. Jesús advierte contra el dejarse impresionar por edificios magníficos y esplendor externo. Estas cosas, dice, pasarán. El fundamento verdadero de nuestra fe no es la piedra ni la ornamentación, sino **Cristo mismo**, la piedra angular viva. Cuando edificamos nuestras vidas sobre él, construimos algo eterno, de una belleza incommensurable e incorruptible. La verdadera belleza de nuestra fe reside en que tenemos un Dios vivo en nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Eso es hermoso. Reflexionemos un momento sobre esta profunda realidad: Dios nos amó tanto que se hizo uno de nosotros. Eso es más hermoso que todas las catedrales y ornamentos del mundo.

Este es un oportuno recordatorio para nosotros hoy. Las iglesias y catedrales, aunque inspiradoras, no son la esencia del cristianismo. Nuestra fe no se basa en altares de mármol ni en vasos de oro, **sino en la persona de Jesucristo, crucificado y resucitado**. Él es la roca firme que nos sostiene en las pruebas, cuando el mundo tiembla y cuando todo lo demás se desvanece. Jesús, al contemplar el templo de Jerusalén, invita a sus discípulos a centrarse en el esplendor de su presencia entre ellos, en lugar de en edificios y vasos. Una preocupación excesiva por la belleza externa puede oscurecer la verdadera belleza que reside en nuestro Señor.

Como discípulos, estamos llamados a imitar a Cristo mediante actos concretos de amor, misericordia y justicia. No nos dejemos seducir por la pompa ni las apariencias, sino esforcémonos por convertirnos en templos vivientes donde mora Dios. Al hacerlo, nos hacemos eco de la invitación de Pablo: ser modelos de fe para los demás, arraigados en Cristo, la verdadera y eterna belleza de nuestras vidas.

Thoughts from Father Juan . . .

Grace and Peace, my brothers and sisters,

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, the readings for the Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time invite us to reflect on what truly endures. The readings help us to reflect on the end of times. What will really endure in life? In his letter to the Thessalonians, Paul offers a powerful theme: **imitation**. He writes not as one seeking honor or prestige, but as a model of faith lived in simplicity and perseverance. Paul reminds his community that Christian life is not about grand displays but about embodying the Gospel in daily actions. His words challenge us: **Who are we imitating?** Our culture often elevates wealth, status, and external success, yet Paul points us toward Christ-like humility and service.

In the Christian sense, imitation is not merely a matter of copying; it is a transformative process. Paul himself imitates Christ, and by doing so, becomes a living example for others. This chain of imitation, from Christ to Paul, and from Paul to the community, reveals that faith is both relational and incarnational. We learn to follow Christ by observing and walking with those who live authentically in him. Paul, in his letters, encourages the communities to imitate him as he imitates Christ. He wants to be the model of discipleship for the community.

The Gospel complements this message by shifting our gaze from what amazes the eye to what grounds the soul. Jesus warns against being impressed by magnificent buildings and external splendor. These things, he says, will pass away. The proper foundation of our faith is not stone or ornamentation but **Christ himself**, the living cornerstone. When we build our lives on him, we construct something eternal, beautiful beyond measure, and immune to decay. The true beauty of our faith is that we have a living God in our Lord Jesus Christ. That's beautiful. Take a moment to reflect on this profound reality: God loved us so much that he became one of us. That is more beautiful than all the cathedrals and ornaments of the world.

This is a timely reminder for us today. Churches and cathedrals, though inspiring, are not the essence of Christianity. Our faith does not rest on marble altars or golden vessels but **on the person of Jesus Christ, crucified and risen**. He is the solid rock that sustains us when trials come, when the world trembles, and when all else fades. Jesus, looking at the temple in Jerusalem, invites his disciples to focus on the splendor of his presence in their midst rather than on buildings and vessels. An excessive concern for external beauty can obscure the true beauty that resides within our Lord.

As disciples, we are called to imitate Christ through concrete acts of love, mercy, and justice. Let us not be seduced by pomp or appearances but strive to become living temples where God dwells. In doing so, we echo Paul's invitation: to be models of faith for others, rooted in Christ, the true and lasting beauty of our lives.


