## Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y paz a ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas, Las lecturas de este domingo, especialmente la proclamación del Evangelio de las Bienaventuranzas, presentan la enseñanza inaugural de Jesús sobre la naturaleza del Reino de Dios. Lejos de ser un ideal vago, las Bienaventuranzas revelan la visión concreta de Dios para el florecimiento humano, una visión que cumple las esperanzas más profundas de Israel y supera las expectativas mundanas de poder, éxito y felicidad.

En la Primera Lectura, el profeta Sofonías llama a Israel a buscar la humildad y la justicia, asegurando a los «humildes de la tierra» que serán protegidos en el día del Señor. Esto nos prepara para escuchar las palabras de Jesús en la montaña, donde bendice a quienes, como los pobres, confían en Dios en lugar de en sus propias fuerzas. Pablo, en la Segunda Lectura, se hace eco de esta misma lógica divina: Dios elige a los humildes y a los débiles para avergonzar a los fuertes. Revela a un Dios cuya sabiduría trastoca las categorías humanas.

En este contexto, las Bienaventuranzas se convierten en la carta magna del Reino. Jesús declara bienaventurados a aquellos a quienes el mundo suele despreciar: los pobres de espíritu, los mansos, los que lloran, los perseguidos. Estas bienaventuranzas no son consuelos sentimentales, sino descripciones de las personas a través de las cuales Dios establece su reino. Los «pobres de espíritu» no son simplemente aquellos que carecen de bienes materiales, sino aquellos que reconocen su dependencia radical de Dios. A ellos «les pertenece el Reino», no solo en el futuro, sino ahora.

Las Bienaventuranzas también delinean las disposiciones que dan forma a la vida en el Reino de Dios. Los misericordiosos encarnan el propio corazón de Dios; los limpios de corazón reflejan la integridad de Dios; los pacificadores llevan a cabo la misión reconciliadora de Dios. Cada bienaventuranza nombra una transformación que Dios realiza en su pueblo, que luego se convierte en signo de su presencia en el mundo. De esta manera, el Reino de Dios es a la vez un don divino y una vocación humana.

Finalmente, Jesús revela que la bendición no protege a sus discípulos del sufrimiento. En cambio, la persecución «por causa de la justicia» se convierte en la confirmación definitiva de que están alineados con el Reino de Dios y no con el del mundo. Su recompensa es grande, no solo en el cielo, sino en la profunda alegría de saber que están con Cristo.

Así, las Bienaventuranzas no son virtudes opcionales; delinean el marco mismo del Reino de Dios. Describen el tipo de corazón a través del cual Dios renueva el mundo y el tipo de comunidad a la que la Iglesia está llamada a ser. ¿Estamos viviendo este llamado en nuestras vidas? ¿Estamos contribuyendo a hacer realidad esta visión de Dios para el mundo? ¿Encarnamos el Reino de Dios como Iglesia?

# St. Edward, St. Patrick, and St. Richard Parishes

## Thoughts from Father Juan . . .

Grace and Peace to you my brothers and sisters,  
The readings for this Sunday, especially the Gospel proclamation of the Beatitudes, present Jesus' inaugural teaching on the nature of the Reign of God. Far from a vague ideal, the Beatitudes reveal God's concrete vision for human flourishing, a vision that both fulfills Israel's deepest hopes and surpasses worldly expectations of power, success, and happiness.

In the First Reading, the prophet Zephaniah calls Israel to seek humility and righteousness, assuring the "humble of the land" that they will be sheltered on the day of the Lord. This prepares us to hear Jesus' words on the mountain, where he blesses those who, like the poor, trust in God rather than in their own strength. Paul, in the Second Reading, echoes this same divine logic: God chooses the lowly and the weak to shame the strong. He reveals a God whose wisdom overturns human categories.

Against this backdrop, the Beatitudes become the charter of the Kingdom. Jesus declares blessed those whom the world typically dismisses: the poor in spirit, the meek, the mournful, the persecuted. These blessings are not sentimental consolations but descriptions of the people through whom God establishes his reign. The "poor in spirit" are not simply those lacking material goods but those who recognize their radical dependence on God. To them "belongs the Kingdom", not merely in the future but now.

The Beatitudes also outline the dispositions that shape life in God's Kingdom. The merciful embody God's own heart; the clean of heart reflect God's integrity; the peacemakers carry out God's reconciling mission. Each beatitude names a transformation that God accomplishes in his people, who then become signs of his presence in the world. In this way, the Reign of God is both a divine gift and a human vocation.

Finally, Jesus reveals that blessing does not shield his disciples from suffering. Instead, persecution "for the sake of righteousness" becomes the ultimate confirmation that they are aligned with God's Kingdom rather than the world's. Their reward is great, not merely in heaven, but in the deep joy of knowing they stand with Christ.

Thus, the Beatitudes are not optional virtues; they delineate the very framework of God's Reign. They describe the kind of heart through which God renews the world and the kind of community the Church is called to be. Are we living this call in our lives? Are we helping implement this vision of God for the world? Do we embody the Kingdom of God as the Church?
