more information.

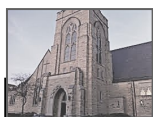
Visiting Eucharistic Ministers

For all those who take communion to someone outside of church, we are
adopting a new policy April 12th. Wearing a certified "CCER/Family of
Eight" pouch entitles you to receive the
Eucharist in your pyx in the communion line during Mass. If you are not
wearing it, you may be asked to wait and get communion for your pyx
from the deacon or priest after Mass. These cloth pouches with embroi-
dered crosses indicate that you have
completed the training for Visiting Eucharistic Ministers (VEM). If you
have not been trained, please contact any deacon for a short training
after Mass.

Food Donation Baskets

Thanks to all who have contributed to the KC Food for
Families and SVDP Holiday Food Basket Drives (October-
March). This past year, we've given out 135 Thanksgiving,
Christmas and Easter Food Baskets as well as provided over
30 boxes of food and personal care items to the SVDP Pantry
and Meal Program. You've donated almost \$7000 in the
process. Well done, St. Ed's! The Drives are a joint effort of
the St. Vincent de Paul Society here at St. Ed's and your
Knights of Columbus Roundtable. The Food Baskets are a
program that's been going on at St. Ed's for decades (at least
since the 1980s). The Food for Families program is part of
the Knights' Faith in Action Initiative to support local pantries
in need, especially in the period after Christmas and after
Easter when supplies are low. In this economy, the need is
growing on a monthly basis. We continue to collect moneta-
ry, food and personal care item donations regularly to bring
to the SVDP Pantry and the weekly Meal Program at North
Point Church. Between the Meal Program and Pantry in
January alone we helped over 1200 people, including
almost 500 children!

Pensamientos del Padre Juan . . .

Gracia y paz para ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas.

Hoy, la Iglesia se encuentra a las puertas de la Semana Santa, reuniendo dos momentos muy diferentes en una sola liturgia. Con las palmas en alto, nos regocijamos mientras Jesús entra en Jerusalén al grito de: «¡Hosanna al Hijo de David!». Ese momento triunfal se transforma rápidamente en silencio y, luego, en rechazo, al escuchar la Pasión del Señor según San Mateo. Esta sagrada tensión forma parte también de nuestras vidas, pues experimentamos momentos de alegría y triunfo, pero también afrontamos tiempos difíciles y el dolor de nuestras propias cruces.

El Domingo de Ramos nos invita a adentrarnos en la profundidad emocional de la última semana de la vida terrenal de Jesús. Fue una semana marcada por el amor entregado libremente, la incompreensión, la traición, la soledad, el sufrimiento y una confianza inquebrantable en el Padre. Jesús sabía lo que le aguardaba y, aun así, eligió entrar en Jerusalén. No se apartó de la cruz; caminó hacia ella, plenamente presente, plenamente obediente, plenamente amoroso. La determinación de Jesús de cumplir su misión como Hijo de Dios constituye un poderoso llamado para que cada uno de nosotros responda a sus propias vocaciones personales, manteniéndose plenamente presente y obediente al plan de Dios.

La Semana Santa no debe vivirse con prisas ni tratarse como un simple ruido de fondo en nuestras rutinas diarias. Es un tiempo sagrado. Cada día nos revela un momento de profunda trascendencia: la intimidad de la amistad y el servicio el Jueves Santo; la angustia del abandono el Viernes Santo; el silencio del sepulcro el Sábado Santo y, finalmente, la victoria de la vida sobre la muerte el Domingo de Pascua. El misterio de nuestra salvación se resume en esos momentos sagrados. Asegúrense de recorrer esta semana meditando en cada uno de esos momentos.

Esta semana, la Iglesia nos invita a bajar el ritmo, a actuar con intencionalidad y plena conciencia, y a permitir que estos días moldeen nuestros corazones. ¿Dónde me veo reflejado en el relato de la Pasión? ¿Soy rápido para alabar, pero lento para mantenerme fiel? ¿Velo junto a Cristo o me quedo dormido cuando el discipulado se torna difícil?

Al adentrarnos en la Semana Santa, no somos llamados simplemente a recordar lo que Jesús hizo hace mucho tiempo, sino a caminar con Él aquí y ahora; a acompañarlo con oración, reverencia y atención. Dedicuen tiempo a las celebraciones litúrgicas. Creen un espacio de silencio. Permitan que las palabras, los gestos y los silencios les hablen al corazón. Que esta semana nos adentre más profundamente en el misterio del amor de Dios, ablande nuestros corazones y nos prepare para regocijarnos verdaderamente cuando amanezca la Pascua. Esta semana, fijemos nuestra mirada en Jesús mientras exploramos sus últimos días a través de las liturgias semanales. Espero verlos el lunes 30 de marzo, a las 6:00 p. m., en Saint Edward, para nuestro evento «Alimento para el camino», en el que meditaremos sobre el camino hacia la Cruz.

Thoughts from Father Juan . . .

Grace and Peace to you, my brothers and sisters,

Today, the Church stands at the doorstep of Holy Week, holding two very different moments together in a single liturgy. With palms raised high, we rejoice as Jesus enters Jerusalem to shouts of “**Hosanna to the Son of David!**” The triumphant moment quickly turns into silence, and then into rejection, as we listen to the Passion of the Lord according to Matthew. This sacred tension is also part of our lives, as we experience moments of joy and triumph, but also face hard times and the pain of our own crosses.

Palm Sunday invites us into the emotional depth of the final week of Jesus’ earthly life. It was a week marked by freely given love, misunderstanding, betrayal, loneliness, suffering, and unwavering trust in the Father. Jesus knew what awaited him, and still he chose to enter Jerusalem. He did not turn away from the cross. He walked toward it, fully present, fully obedient, fully loving. Jesus’s resolve to fulfill his mission as the Son of God is a powerful call for each of us to answer our own personal calls to be fully present and obedient to God’s plan.

Holy Week is not meant to be hurried or treated as background noise to our daily routines. It is sacred time. Each day reveals a profound moment: the intimacy of friendship and service on Holy Thursday, the anguish of abandonment on Good Friday, the silence of the tomb on Holy Saturday, and, ultimately, the victory of life over death on Easter Sunday. The mystery of our salvation is summed up in those sacred moments. Make sure to navigate this week and meditate on each of these moments.

The Church invites us this week to slow down, to be intentional and mindful, and to allow these days to shape our hearts. Where do I see myself in the Passion narrative? Am I quick to praise but slow to remain faithful? Do I keep watch with Christ, or do I fall asleep when discipleship becomes difficult?

As we enter Holy Week, we are called not simply to remember what Jesus did long ago, but to walk with him now, to accompany him with prayer, reverence, and attention. Make time for the liturgies. Create a quiet space. Let the words, gestures, and silences speak.

May this week draw us deeper into the mystery of God’s love, soften our hearts, and prepare us to truly rejoice when Easter dawns. This week let us fix our eyes on Jesus as we explore his final days in the week’s liturgies. I hope to see you on Monday, March 30, at 6 PM at Saint Edward for our Food for the Journey event as we meditate on the Journey to the Cross.
