When we experience fear or anxiety in our lives we tend to underestimate God's power and what He can do for us. We trust a great deal in ourselves and ignore God's presence. Often we feel the situation in which we find ourselves in is too big for God. We must remember that God created the storms and everything else in nature. No matter how doubtful we may feel he is still in complete control over everything. Understanding God means that he can calm the storms in our lives if we will only have a little faith. 
