

Los franciscanos y su personal de Tierra Santa mantienen los santos lugares y santuarios, permitiendo a quienes viven y visitan Tierra Santa profundizar su fe y su conexión espiritual y cultural con la historia de la salvación.

Actividades sociales y caritativas

Para ayudar a los cristianos a permanecer en Tierra Santa, incluyendo a los pobres y a las parejas jóvenes, la Custodia construye miles de unidades residenciales. Además, construye centros de atención para personas mayores. Se brinda asistencia médica a los necesitados.

Actividades educativas y científicas

Los franciscanos gestionan y apoyan escuelas abiertas a todos, independientemente de su religión o nacionalidad. Ofrecen becas a jóvenes para que respondan a la llamada a convertirse en sacerdotes y hermanos franciscanos. Asimismo, los arqueólogos franciscanos realizan investigaciones continuas en los Santos Lugares.

Actividades Pastorales

Los franciscanos brindan atención pastoral en 29 parroquias de Tierra Santa, ofreciendo culto, formación cristiana y programas esenciales para jóvenes y familias, especialmente en regiones afectadas por la guerra.

• Programas Litúrgicos, Ecuménicos y de Comunicación

El Centro Cristiano de Medios narra la historia de Tierra Santa a través de material multimedia distribuido por todo el mundo en más de siete idiomas. Los frailes organizan celebraciones litúrgicas para cristianos locales y peregrinos, y comparten con otras comunidades cristianas de Tierra Santa una cooperación ecuménica continua.

On **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** all who have celebrated their 14th birthday and older are to abstain from meat on those days. In addition, all those who are healthy between the ages of 18 & 59 are to limit themselves to one main meal and no more than two other partial meals, which together do not equal the one main meal on those same days. The disciple of fasting and abstinence should always be approached in a spirit of prayer and with the goal of making a sacrifice in order to draw closer to the Lord.
