FROM THE DESK OF FATHER BOSE

RENEWED LIFE IN THE RISEN LORD: Today's readings invite us to embrace the redemptive act of God and to live a life rooted in hope and renewal. Having been given new life in Christ, let us seek the things of God, nurturing our hearts with his love and truth. Let us not be entangled with the fleeting matters of this world but be transformed by the power of the resurrection. As we celebrate Easter, may our hearts be renewed, our faith strengthened, and our lives reflect the radiant joy of the risen Lord. **Pray and Practice:** *Resurrected Lord, enliven our faith to believe in you and strengthen our will so that we may live our lives anew in you.* **God bless Fr. EASTER SUNDAY – THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD: JOHN 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

LITURGICAL NORMS IN EASTER SEASON

The 50 days of the Easter Season are accentuated by changes in our liturgical practices so that we can actually experience the differences of this joyful season in our worship together. Some of these changes are required and others are optional. So that we can better enter into the joyful spirit of Easter we are observing the following norms. During Mass we will substitute the Sprinkling Rite for the Penitential Rite throughout the entire Easter Season. You will note that the Sunday Readings are taken from the New Testament only and the first of these Readings is always taken from Acts of the Apostles. The use of white vestments and the characteristic white displayed in the sanctuary emphasizes the new life of Resurrection in which all of us were initiated through our Baptism into Christ Jesus. The *Gloria* and the *Alleluia* are once again resurrected to help us express our Easter joy and to praise the Lord of Glory who is risen. Fresh flowers also return and are displayed in our sanctuary as signs of our new risen life through Christ who conquered sin and death once and for all. The Easter Vigil opened up the waters of Baptism to us so that we, Holy Mother Church, now give New Birth to those reborn into the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Baptisms can therefore be celebrated once again during the Sunday liturgies. The Baptismal Font and all of the Holy Water Fonts are also flowing with fresh water to remind us of our own Baptism as we make the Sign of the Cross upon entering the Church. First Holy Eucharist of our children and Confirmation of our adults complete the Easter sacraments of our initiation that bring us into full membership of the Church. They make us the People of God, adopted sons and daughters, coheirs with Christ, disciples of the Risen Lord Jesus. Our theme for the Easter Season is “The Lord is Risen, He is Truly Risen!

DOMINGO DE PASCUA – LA RESURRECCIÓN DEL SEÑOR: JUAN 20:1-9

El primer día de la semana, María Magdalena fue al sepulcro muy de mañana, cuando aún estaba oscuro, y vio que la piedra había sido quitada. Corrió y fue adonde estaban Simón Pedro y el otro discípulo, a quien Jesús amaba, y les dijo: “Se han llevado del sepulcro al Señor, y no sabemos dónde lo han puesto”. Pedro y el otro discípulo salieron y fueron al sepulcro. Ambos corrieron, pero el otro discípulo corrió más rápido que Pedro y llegó primero al sepulcro. Se agachó y vio las vendas allí, pero no entró. Cuando Simón Pedro llegó después, entró en el sepulcro y vio las vendas allí, y el sudario con el que había cubierto su cabeza, no con las vendas, sino enrollado en un lugar aparte. Entonces entró también el otro discípulo, el que había llegado primero al sepulcro, y vio y creyó. Porque aún no entendían la Escritura de que él tenía que resucitar de entre los muertos.

LITURGICAL NORMS IN EASTER SEASON

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NORMAS LITÚRGICAS EN EL TIEMPO PASCUAL

Los 50 días del Tiempo Pascual se ven acentuados por cambios en nuestras prácticas litúrgicas para que podamos experimentar las diferencias de este tiempo gozoso en nuestro culto conjuntos. Algunos de estos cambios son obligatorios y otros son opcionales. Para que podamos vivir mejor el espíritu gozoso de la Pascua, observamos las siguientes normas. Durante la Misa, sustituiremos el Rito de la Aspersión por el Rito Penitencial durante todo el Tiempo Pascual. Notarán que las lecturas dominicales se toman únicamente del Nuevo Testamento y la primera de estas lecturas siempre se toma de los Hechos de los Apóstoles. El uso de vestimentas blancas y el característico blanco que se exhibe en el santuario enfatizan la nueva vida de Resurrección en la que todos fuimos iniciados por nuestro Bautismo en Cristo Jesús. El Gloria y el Aleluya se repiten una vez más para ayudarnos a expresar nuestra alegría pascual y alabar al Señor de la Gloria que ha resucitado. Las flores frescas también regresan y se exhiben en nuestro santuario como signos de nuestra nueva vida resucitada por medio de Cristo, quien venció el pecado y la muerte de una vez por todas. La Vigilia Pascual nos abrió las aguas del Bautismo para que nosotros, Santa Madre Iglesia, ahora demos un Nuevo Nacimiento a quienes renacen en la vida, muerte y resurrección de Jesús. Por lo tanto, los bautismos pueden celebrarse una vez más durante las liturgias dominicales. La Pila Bautismal y todas las Pilas de Agua Bendita también fluyen con agua fresca para recordarnos nuestro propio Bautismo al hacer la Señal de la Cruz al entrar en la Iglesia. La Primera Eucaristía de nuestros niños y la Confirmación de nuestros adultos completan los sacramentos pascuales de nuestra iniciación que nos convierten en miembros plenos de la Iglesia. Nos convierten en el Pueblo de Dios, hijos e hijas adoptivos, coherederos con Cristo, discípulos del Señor Jesús Resucitado. Nuestro lema para el Tiempo de Pascua es "¡El Señor ha resucitado, verdaderamente ha resucitado!".
