THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER: JOHN 21:1-19

At that time, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead. When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." He then said to Simon Peter a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." Jesus said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. Amen, amen, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to dress yourself and go where you wanted; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." He said this signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God. And when he had said this, he said to him, "Follow me."

ADULTS: In what ways are you answering Jesus' command to Peter to "feed my sheep"?

CHILDREN: What do you do to take care of others as Jesus asked Peter to do?

MAY – THE MONTH OF HONORING OUR HOLY MOTHER MARY: The month of May is the "month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady," and it is the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world [pay] to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (Paul VI: Encyclical on the Month of May, no. 1).

This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which were wont to take place at that time. In the 16th century, books appeared and fostered this devotion.

The practice became especially popular among the members of the Jesuit Order — by 1700 it took hold among their students at the Roman College and a bit later it was publicly practiced in the Gesu Church in Rome. From there it spread to the whole Church.

The practice was granted a partial indulgence by Pius VII in 1815 and a plenary indulgence by Pius IX in 1859. With the complete revision of indulgences in 1966 and the decreased emphasis on specific indulgences, it no longer carries an indulgence; however it certainly falls within the category of the First General Grant of Indulgences. (A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful who, in the performance of their duties and in bearing the trials of life, raise their mind with humble confidence to God, adding — even if only mentally — some pious invocation. - Excerpted from Enchiridion of Indulgences. <https://www.catholicculture.org/culture/liturgicalyear/>

Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. Amen, amen, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to dress yourself and go where you wanted; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." He said this signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God. And when he had said this, he said to him, "Follow me."

TERCER DOMINGO DE PASCUA: JUAN 21:1-19

Jesús se acercó, tomó el pan y se lo dio, y de igual manera el pescado. Esta era la tercera vez que Jesús se manifestaba a sus discípulos después de resucitar de entre los muertos. Cuando terminaron de desayunar, Jesús le dijo a Simón Pedro: «Simón, hijo de Juan, ¿me amas más que estos?». Simón Pedro le respondió: «Sí, Señor, tú sabes que te amo». Jesús le dijo: «Apacienta mis corderos». Luego le dijo a Simón Pedro por segunda vez: «Simón, hijo de Juan, ¿me amas?». Simón Pedro le respondió: «Sí, Señor, tú sabes que te amo». Jesús le dijo: «Apacienta mis ovejas». Jesús le dijo por tercera vez: «Simón, hijo de Juan, ¿me amas?». Pedro se angustió porque Jesús le había preguntado por tercera vez: «¿Me amas?», y le respondió: «Señor, tú lo sabes todo; tú sabes que te amo». Jesús le dijo: «Apacienta mis ovejas. En verdad, en verdad te digo: cuando eras joven, te vestías e ibas a donde querías; pero cuando seas viejo, extenderás tus manos, y otro te vestirá y te llevará adonde no quieras». Dijo esto, dando a entender con qué clase de muerte glorificaría a Dios. Y dicho esto, le añadió: «Sígueme».


