#### FROM THE DESK OF FATHER BOSE

TO CHOSE WHAT IS MOST NECESSARY The vast majority of us aim for perfection, which is obligatory for development. But we tend to impose our ideas, certain traditional beliefs and laws on other people very often. We also seem to have a predisposition to overreact when these seemingly insignificant standards are breached, seeing others as impure and in the process we end up isolating ourselves thinking that we alone are right. Ironically, we may find ourselves breaking these same rules when it suits our needs, dismissing them as trivial. This inconsistency makes us partial judges, often skewing decisions to serve our vested interests. Today's reading encourages us to seek and serve God's will at all times, remaining in his love as he remains in us. In the first reading, the disciples, guided by the Holy Spirit, boldly decide not to impose circumcision on converts. God himself is the temple—the holy place in the New Jerusalem. The will of God is the only guiding principle of our lives. In the Gospel, Jesus urges us to stay in God's love by doing his will. He assures us of joy and hope in his ever-abiding presence and promises the Holy Spirit to lead us into God's will. It is important that we attune ourselves to the promptings of the Spirit that we may be preachers of good news rather than our ideas. **Pray and Practice:** Lord, help us to always seek and joyfully fulfil your will, which is the only one thing necessary. MEMORIAL DAY, formally known as Decoration Day, is a federal holiday observed yearly on the last Monday of May. Memorial Day is a day that commemorates all men and women who have died while serving in the military for the United States of America. The history of Memorial Day dates back to the American Civil War. It started as an event to honor soldiers who had died during the war. It is said to be inspired by the way people in the Southern states honored the dead. The original national celebration of Decoration Day took place on 30 May 1868. There was over twenty-four cities and towns across the United States that claim to be the birthplace of Memorial Day. Waterloo (New York) was officially declared the birthplace of Memorial Day by President Lyndon Johnson in May 1966. In the late 19th century, the holiday (previously known as Decoration Day) became known as Memorial Day and was expanded to include the deceased veterans of all the wars fought by American forces. Originally, the holiday used to be celebrated on May 30, regardless of the day of the week that it fell on. In 1968, the Uniform Holidays Bill was passed and as a result the day changed.
