## Day of God's Glory

My dear parishioners, the great adventure of salvation history starts with the first Sunday of Advent and offers an entire year of breathtaking experiences. That our divine Lord was born as man and submitted himself to the experience of all things human but sin is the breaking story of the season.

The first two Sundays of Advent highlight Christ's return in glory. The last two Sundays emphasize Christ's incarnation a human being and the importance of Mary as the Mother of God and the Church. Consequently, the people of God are called to *advertise* the meaning of Advent and earnestly *advise* family members and friends to participate.

What, then, is our mission as Catholics? We are to prepare the world for Christ. We are to tell everyone that Our Lord is to be found in familiar places. That he desires to make his home in our hearts. We are to announce the great works of God's Holy Spirit. That to find Christ, one must surely go among the lost and the poor to seek him out.

Our message? Seek the Lord Jesus Christ with all your heart! He is *Emmanuel* (Heb. God with us). He will lead you to his loving heavenly Father. Therefore make ready to celebrate the great holy season of Christmas. The hour of the Lord's holy nativity, the hour of mankind's hope, is at hand. This is the hour of God's historical intervention in answer to the prayers of generations.

The word *advent* derives from the Latin *advenire* meaning "to come", emphasizing as it does an eschatological event of glory which has not yet taken place. A familiar form of the word is *adventus* which means *coming*. Alerted by Israel's prophets that God graciously willed *in saecula saeculorum* (Lat. in the ages of ages) to embrace human misery, we read, "He found him in a desert land, and in the howling waste of the wilderness; he encircled him, he cared for



## Blessing of the Family Christmas Nativity Scene

In many cultures, it is tradition to prepare the Nativity set, but to place the figures of the Holy Family and the Magi apart from the set. As Christmas approaches the figures of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph are placed closer and closer to the manger.



Following Christmas, the figures of the Magi also move closer and closer to the manger stall, to be placed there on the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord.

Begin by gathering the family around the Nativity set or Christmas manger scene. Sing together “Away in a Manger” and pray together the Sign of the Cross.

Then, offer the following prayer of blessing:  
*“God of all creation, this Nativity set reminds us of Jesus, whose birth was witnessed by the stars in the sky, and the animals in the field.*

*(If you wish, invite the children to place around the crib the animals, angels, straw, etc.)*

*May this manger scene remind us to prepare room for Jesus to come into our home and into our hearts each and every day. We ask this through Christ our Lord. AMEN.”*

## Feast Days of the Week: Sts. Nicholas and Ambrose

### St. Nicholas: Feast Day December 6

#### Bishop of Myra (Fourth Century)

St. Nicholas is one of the most popular of all saints: patron of Russia and Greece. Many hundreds of churches are named after him, and his feast day is an occasion for celebration in many parts of the globe.



It is curious that this fourth-century bishop is featured with the features of a Scandinavian elf. The transfiguration of St. Nicholas into Santa Claus has been traced to Dutch Protestants living in New Amsterdam. As the story made its way back to England the familiar features of Father Christmas gradually took shape until he had achieved iconographic status.

Well does he deserve to be remembered as the patron of children, honored not just as the purveyor of toys but as a protector of the innocent, particularly the victims of human trafficking.

### St. Ambrose: Feast Day December 7


#### Bishop and Doctor of the Church (339–397)

In 374, following the death of the bishop of Milan, the local Church was bitterly divided. Ambrose went to the basilica and exhorted the assembly to find a peaceful solution. Suddenly a voice rose up:

"Ambrose for bishop." The cry was embraced by the entire assembly; Ambrose was horrified. Not only was he a layman; he was not even baptized. Nevertheless, within one week he was baptized, confirmed, ordained, and consecrated bishop of Milan.

Ambrose made up for lost time. He gave away all his property, adopted a strenuous habit of prayer, and immersed himself in the study of Scripture and theology. He became the protector of the poor and oversaw the preparation of catechumens and the training of clergy. He was responsible for innumerable conversions, most famously that of St. Augustine, whom he personally instructed and baptized. After meeting Ambrose, Augustine was forever changed. In 387, Ambrose baptized Augustine, with whom he had a great influence. St. Monica, Augustine's mother, loved Ambrose "as an angel of God who uprooted her son from his former ways and led him to his convictions of Christ."

St. Ambrose is best remembered for his leadership of the Church in a tumultuous era. The Arian heresy, which denied the full divinity of Christ, had divided the Church. When the emperor ordered Ambrose to cede one of his churches for use by the Arians, Ambrose refused. "The emperor is *in* the church," he said, "not *over* it." The emperor backed down.

him, he kept him as the apple of his eye." [Deu 32:10] The people of God long for *adventus Christi*, to experience the marvelous synchrony of desire and experience, the fruit of a great adventure.

Why is Jesus' birth so important? If we understand the spiritual meaning of our own birth, we may better appreciate how Christ's birth is extraordinarily significant. The birth of every child into a family changes that family forever. So it is with the coming of Christ. When Jesus entered into the world, the whole human family through time and space, and the whole of creation known and unknown changed forever for the good.

When Christ our Lord comes again in glory, he will destroy *Satan, father of sin and prince of darkness, all his (evil) works and all his empty promises.* [Rite of Baptism] On that day, our Lord, who destroyed the power of death on the cross, will destroy all suffering and death forever.

Christ, the son of the eternal father, the second person of the Holy Trinity, is light itself and the origin of all light. Significantly, the Son of Man compares himself to light that encircles the earth on the day of his coming, regenerating and glorifying both mankind and the earth on which he dwells.

When Christ appears in glory, every human being on earth will behold him simultaneously. All humanity -- believers and non-believers -- will be revealed by his blazing glory, the purity and holiness of which will shine brighter than ten-thousand blazing suns.

We should remember that the Church's tradition offers an important message to the people and nations of the world. To those persons who are devout in the practice of religion *and* to persons who live only for the sake of consumption and pleasure, you will hear a consistent and insistent message: "Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation." [2Cor 6:2] God is calling this generation to account for the coming of Christ in truth and power! Sincerely in the hearts of Jesus and Mary. Your pastor, Reverend Richard Barker.



The worship area should be **quiet** for those who remain for prayer. Be reverent and refrain from bringing bottled water, soda, food, candy, or gum into Mass.

Please remain in Mass until the closing hymn is finished. When it is finished, Mass has come to a close. In the vestibule, personal conversations may proceed as we share our joy.

### Dress Standards for All Masses

**Please honor the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and wear modest clothing.**

#### Men/Young Men/Boys

Shirts and pants.

#### Women/Young Women/Girls:

Modest Dresses, Coordinate Ensembles, Shirt/Blouses with Pants.

Clothing not proper: flip-flops, shorts, cutoffs, t-shirts, sloppy jeans, tank tops, and revealing clothing.

## THE BLESSING OF THE CHRISTMAS TREE

Begin by inviting family members to gather around the unlit Christmas tree. Sing together a verse of a favorite Christmas carol, pray together the Sign of the Cross, and then offer the following prayer of blessing:

*“May your light surround us, and show us the way to love and serve you throughout this Christmas season.”*  
(A family member should place a special ornament upon the tree.)

*“May all who gather here with us enjoy the beauty of this tree, the warmth of laughter, and the gift of friendship. We ask this through Christ our Lord. AMEN.”*

## Receiving the Blessed Sacrament



Receive the Sacred Host carefully **always in front** of the Eucharistic Minister. **Never reach out to "take"** the Blessed Sacrament from any minister. Receive Holy Communion with both hands free, one hand palm up with the other hand underneath. If you have only one free hand, please receive the Sacred Host on your tongue.

## Sacraments

### SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

If you have been participating actively *at least six months* after registration in the parish, you may ask for an appointment with the pastor to begin marriage preparation. Marriage preparation requires six months.

### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Children age 6 or younger, the following documents **are required** before baptism date may be scheduled: parish registration, birth certificate, and baptism class certifications. Godmother and Godfather must be in good standing as practicing Catholics.

If you have been participating actively at least six months after registration in the parish, you may call the parish office to begin baptismal preparation.

### FUNERAL SERVICES

To ensure that parish ministers can assist you, please call the parish office **before** setting dates and times for funeral services. Regarding personal spoken remembrances at funeral liturgies, St. Philip parish adheres to the policies of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston.

### ANOINTING OF THE SICK

By appointment. Please call our office to make arrangements.
